Brief Description

The Legal Sector Master Plan (LSMP), which outlines the broad requirements for the development of the legal sector into a comprehensive legal system, has been formally adopted by the Government of the Lao PDR in September 2009. The implementation of the LSMP requires a preparatory and transitory phase in order to set up the adequate conditions for the start of a comprehensive sectoral programme. Hence, in accordance with the Country Programme Action Plan, this Work Plan will provide support to the ministry of justice and all legal institutions involved in getting the required national coordination mechanism established. Besides, the Work Plan will ensure the follow-up of preparatory activities previously implemented through the Initiation Plan for the support to the implementation of the LSMP.

I. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS


The Programme Board will oversee all aspects of the IP execution.

II. MONITORING FRAMEWORK AND EVALUATION

In accordance with the programming policies and procedures outlined in the UNDP User Guide, the project will be monitored through the following:

Within the annual cycle

- On a quarterly basis, a quality assessment shall record progress towards the completion of key results
- An Issue Log shall be activated in Atlas and updated by the Project Manager to facilitate tracking and resolution of potential problems or requests for change.

- a Monitoring Schedule Plan shall be activated in Atlas and updated to track key management actions/events

III. LEGAL CONTEXT

This document together with the CPAP signed by the Government and UNDP on 28 March 2007, which is incorporated by reference, constitutes a Project Document as referred to in the Standard Basic Assistance Agreement (SBAA) of 10 October 1988 and all CPAP provisions apply to this document.
