It will build gender equality initiatives, strengthen civil society activities for women and girls and build the position of the NHRC as an important partner for gender equality in Bangladesh. The Programme will seek to expand on rights-based advocacy, in particular looking at developing the NHRC's role in engaging with Government on human rights. The Programme will focus

- 1. Strengthened capacity of the National Human Rights Commission to deliver on its mandate 2. Enhanced capacity of civil society and community-based organizations to engage in human rights advocacy and awareness-raising

The budget has been revised due to: A) The embassy of Switzerland has increased CHF 200,000 equivalent \$201,855.25 till 31 December 2022 and fund has been reduced (\$7,924) due to rate fluctuation. Overall fund has been increased \$193,931.

- B) TRAC1 \$100,301 has been provided a loan against the remaining SDC fund CHF100,000 equivalent \$100,301 against receivable installment by July 2023. (Conversion rate \$1 = CHF0.997).
- C) TRAC1 allocation has been reduced \$50,000 from the existing allocation

For these reasons, the total project budget has been increased to 11.77 million after this revision.

- HRP to inform procurement cluster on the POs which are currently not applicable (e.g. POs under HRP COVID PIP, ADJ) so that the procurement can cancel those. **Durlov Chowdhury** from HRP will work and sort out such POs by end of this week.
- The youth leaders from ethnic and excluded minorities trained and nurtured by HRP over the last 5-6 years will be connected with the UNDP's youth network in future.
- The information on HRP's closure should be shared with Human Resource so that necessary measures can be taken regarding staff contract.
- HRP to provide an update on the HRP's final evaluation to cluster. The
 evaluation report will guide the future designing of the project and define
 the further scope of work.
- The recommended staff profiles of the project will be shared with HR at the
 end of the project while doing the final performance evaluation. The profiles
 of recommended staff will be kept in the roster so that they can be recruited
 further by UNDP for similar positions.
- HRP needs to come up with a project closure plan with specific responsibilities of each and every staff during the closing period.

Lessons Learned:

- The coalition-based working approach of the rights-based CSOs has been proven to be effective to act together and jointly address local human rights problems and issues.
- Extended moral, technical and logistic supports to indigenous girls is necessary to restore and preserve the declining culture and traditions of the indigenous communities in plain land areas. It will contribute to outcome-4 (NHRC and national stakeholders better protect and promote women's right) and outcome-5 (NHRC and national stakeholders better protect and promote the rights of ethnic minorities.
- Youth-led interactive discussion and awareness-raising sessions at the community and school/college levels are necessary for better realization of their rights and expanding space for indigenous youth in education and other local opportunities.
- Engaging duty bearers were very crucial while designing the legal aid programme within the extended period of LoA between NLASO and UNDP. The schedule of actions reflects the recommendations from the district legal aid officers.
- Implementation of complex digitalization projects, such as Accelerating Digital Justice System in Bangladesh, requires a seamless multi-sectoral stakeholders' coordination that yields good progress. Strong synergies between the projects of UNDP are crucial and both HRP and A2I are closely working together.
- Consultation and inclusion of multiple stakeholders in planning, implementing, and monitoring activities, particularly in COVID-19 responses, worked well since it produced better cooperation.
- Inter-project collaboration served as an opportunity for innovation and generated synergy in developing a virtual court application system.



Moreover, the RC Office has assumed the responsibility to draft an action plan under 3rd Cycle UPR in 2018 (which was the initial plan of NHRC to re-establish human rights focal points in thematic order per UPR recommendations) which is not seen to be established as yet.
