1. Executive Summary

The purpose of the National Registration and Identification System (NRIS) Project is to establish a permanent and continuous national registration and identification system in Malawi. The project will contribute to Government's efforts to guarantee the fundamental right to identity, entitlement and enjoyment of full citizenship in Malawi.

The initiative is consistent with Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 16 to: "promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels". Specifically, the NRIS will address SDG Target 16.9 that refers to providing legal identity for all, and will also facilitate the goal of achieving comprehensive birth registration by 2030. The Whole of Government impact of the system will offer improvements in planning, service delivery, and the operation of administrative systems supported by a functional NRIS.

This progress report presents a summary of work completed for the NRIS project delivered by 31 March 2017.

Some of the key milestones achieved during the reporting period include:

- Detailed 2017 Annual Work Plan was developed with NRB and approved by both the Technical and Steering Committees.
- Launch of the Invitation to Bid (ITB) by UNDP Procurement Services Unit (PSU), evaluation, selection and contracting of the recommended bidder for the supply of 2,000 Biometric Registration Kits(BRKs) has been completed.
- Launch of the ITB by UNDP PSU for the supply of the Smart Cards, bids opening, evaluation and submission of recommended bidder for Award.
- Launch of the ITB, evaluation and selection of the Human Resource Management and Payroll Service Provider for the recruitment, administration and management of payroll activities of the 4,000 Registration Officers and 200 Supervisors for the mass registration has been completed.
- Warehouses for the BRKs and other equipment to be used for mass registration are being identified.
- Key project staff positions have been filled.
- 2. Implementation Progress

Brief Background

Malawi endures a structural development challenge in the absence of an authoritative, comprehensive and accurate system of national identification. Fundamentally undermining most citizens' right to identity, the consequences are multi-sectoral, where citizens' access and entitlement to services are uncertain.

Malawi is the only country in the Southern African Development Community (SADC) or Common Market for Southern and Eastern Africa (COMESA) that does not have a functional national registry and identification system. Moreover, Malawi is only now starting to re-establish its system of civil registration and vital statistics (CRVS), to comprehensively register births, deaths, and marriages. The absence of these two systems (NRIS and CRVS, collectively known as a population register), which are mandates of the NRB within the Ministry of Home Affairs and Internal Security, undermines an individual's ability to claim their citizen's rights and services, as well as Government's ability to fulfil its obligations to provide inclusive social services, accountable administrative systems, and to foster evidence-based policy formulation and decision-making.

Efforts in various arenas have led to fragmented initiatives, creating costly or unsustainable silos of information, while also imposing institutional and technical obstacles to interlink information. The Malawi National Registration Act (No. 13 of 2010) which entered force in August 2015 requiring all Malawians 16 years of age and older to be registered in a National Registry and to be issued with an identity card, mandates the National Registration Bureau (NRB) to fulfil this task.

As such, UNDP – with financial and technical support from key Development Partners - and in partnership with the National Registration Bureau is implementing a multi-Donor Basket funded National Registration and Identification System (NRIS) Project (2016 – 2018). The Project seeks to actualize the Right to Identity, ensuring that all Malawians 16 years and older are uniquely registered in a permanent and continuous system that provides proof of their identity, and to be issued with an identity card that is evidence of that identity. Correspondingly, the system will establish the management information systems that will allow Government and stakeholders to access and use that information in aggregate for planning, and as a central reference point for individual identity to be linked across multiple systems. Simultaneously, the management information systems will enable the strengthening of accountability and verification processes within both the public and private sector domains that will enhance services for Malawi's citizens.

The expected results of the Project are to: design, establish and manage the necessary systems, infrastructure and equipment for the National Registration and Identity system, employing biometrically secure Smartcards; supervise the mass registration for all eligible Malawians (an estimated 9 million) within the country in 2017; transition the system to a continuous registration model in 2018 and to develop the capacity and systems of NRB to maintain and operate the system; provide an interface to other public and private sector systems that allow for appropriate data sharing within a legal framework that complies with international principles and standards for the right to privacy and data protection; and to ensure the effective management of the Project.

Cost-Sharing Agreements have been signed between UNDP and the Government of Malawi (USD\$20,347,497), DFID (9,100,000 pounds), Irish Aid (2,500,000 Euros), Norway (NOK 9,000,000) and the EU (8,000,000 Euros). UNDP has allocated USD\$2,000,000 from UNDP core resources to the project. The entire project budget is USD \$49,694,000.


The design of the card (shown in Figure 1, below) has been approved by the Minister of Home Affairs to meet the three tier (visible to the eye security features; enhanced security features that require minimal equipment to verify; and, forensic analysis features that require high end equipment such as a microscope to verify) security requirements of International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and the information requirements elaborated in Section 8 of the law. As well, the card allows for data to be manually read or for various forms of machine reading (QR code, swipe read and chip read) that will avoid traditional challenges with data accuracy. Overall, the design and features of the card draw on key technologies and processes that make forgery of the card improbable, and enables mechanisms to verify its authenticity to ensure confidence that the card, as required by law, is *prima facie* evidence of the individual's recorded information.

Beneficiaries, Stakeholders, Implementing Arrangements

The NRB is the principal institutional beneficiary of the Project with the Malawian citizens as the ultimate beneficiary of support. The main Project stakeholders are the NRB, Government of Malawi and Development Partners. The Project is implemented under UNDP's Direct Implementation Modality (DIM).

Output 1

Up to 9 million Malawians are registered and issued with a National Identity card in 2017

Progress

Under this Output, the following has been accomplished in the reporting period:

- Through a transparent and open international competitive procurement process led by UNDP PSU based in Denmark, tenders for the supply of Biometric Registration Kits (BRKs) were received and evaluated. UNDP Malawi and NRB participated during the evaluation of the bids. All procurement processes, including Site Validation and Laboratory Testing were completed. Bidder recommended for award to supply the BRKs was contracted. User Acceptance Testing was conducted on the hardware and software of the successful Bidder of the BRKs to map the specifications with the finalized BRK as per contract. Before mass production, two prototype BRKs were tested again to check compliance with specifications of User Acceptance testing by technical staff of UNDP and NRB. As part of procurement lifecycle, last step is to conduct a factory inspection and Quality Assurance Process Review to be undertaken by UNDP and NRB in April, 2017 to inspect the operations of the supplier for final Acceptance Test before shipping of 2,000 BRKs. The 2,000 BRKs are expected to arrive in Malawi on 01 May 2017 and the World Food Programme (WFP) Warehouses are being prepared for BRK storage and to serve as data consolidation centers.
- Through a transparent and open international competitive procurement process led by UNDP PSU based in Denmark, ITB for the supply of Smart Cards was launched. Opening of the bids and evaluation of the compliance of Smart Card samples was done. UNDP Malawi and NRB representative were present during the evaluation of the bids. In addition, an

external ID Printing Expert Consultant, subject matter expert (ID Card printing and personalization) has been assisting in the evaluation of the bids. The evaluation report has been submitted to UNDP New York for approval.

- Through a transparent and open competitive procurement process, UNDP initiated the process of identifying Human Resource Management and Payroll Service Provider for the recruitment, administration and management of payroll activities of the temporary 4,000 Registration Officers and 200 Supervisors. The Request for Proposals was published and a pre-bid conference took place. Opening and evaluation of the proposals were done. Final outcome of the evaluation of the proposals has been communicated to the successful firm. All the registration teams are expected to be on board by the first week of May, 2017 as trainings before their deployment are scheduled to take place from mid- May 2017.
- In terms of public awareness for mass registration, a Civic Education Committee chaired by the Ministry of Civic Education, Culture and Community Development has been set up and a Communication strategy was developed.
- A Task Force on transport chaired by the Office of the President and Cabinet has been set up to plan and identify various modes of transport to be used during mass registration, to mobilise the required transport and to assist the NRB in the deployment of such transport.
- The Minister for Home Affairs & Internal Security approved registration of children under 16 as part of NRIS project resulting in modification of NR1 Form, BRK Software and sub sequentially modification in NRIS database.
- Implemented pattern matching algorithm in order to mitigate the risks to register multiple records of same identity without biometrics.
- NRIS servers for the Government Disaster Recovery Center which will back up the NRB service in the data center were procured and delivered. Training on these servers is scheduled for the first week of May, 2017.

Output 2

NRIS is transitioned to a permanent and continuous registration system.

Progress

Under this Output, the following milestones were accomplished in the reporting period:

- The functional review of the NRB was completed and recommendations for new positions or additional staff were made. NRB will submit the functional review report to the office of the President and Cabinet (OPC) for approval in order to consider the new positions in the 2017/2018 National Budget.
- A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the National Registration Bureau (NRB) and National Initiative for Civic Education (NICE) has been drafted.
- The Malawi Electoral Commission (MEC) and NRB had technical level meetings and further agreed on the need for regular meetings to update each other on key developments regarding the NRIS resulting on a draft MoU that will be prepared in quarter two of 2017.
- Capacity Development initiative is being prepared to assist NRB in the development of written and audio-visual material for User Manuals and Training.

Output 3

Government MDAs are assisted to adopt the use of the National Registration and Identification system (NRIS).

Progress

Under this Output, the following milestones were accomplished in the reporting period:

- Discussions were held with the following institutions in regards to adoption and acceptance of the NRIS and the use of the new national ID Card:
 - Malawi Electoral Commission (MEC);
 - Prisons department;
 - Refugees department;
 - Ministry of Health;
 - Banks representatives through the Bankers Association of Malawi and the Reserve Bank of Malawi.

Output 4

Project is efficiently managed, staffed and coordinated, and is implemented with national ownership.

Progress

Under this Output, the following milestones were accomplished in the reporting period:

- Detailed Annual Work Plan 2017 was developed with NRB and approved by the Technical Committee. It will be presented for approval by the Steering Committees on 5th April, 2017.
- A well-equipped NRIS Project Office in Lilongwe was established in Area 12 and project staff are executing their duties from there. In terms of project staffing, the status is as follows:
 - ✓ The Chief Technical Advisor was selected and reported for duties.
 - ✓ The Senior ICT Advisor was selected and reported for duties.
 - ✓ The Project Officer (Basket Fund Manager) was selected and reported for duties.
 - ✓ The ICT Specialist was selected and reported for duties.
 - ✓ The Logistics Advisor was selected and reported for duties.
 - ✓ The Legal Specialist was selected and reported for duties.
 - ✓ The M&E and Reporting Officer was selected and will report for duties soon.
 - \checkmark The Capacity Development Advisor was selected and reported for duties.
 - ✓ The process of recruiting the Field Coordinator (International United Nations Volunteer) was initiated and will conclude soon.
 - ✓ The selected candidate for the Public Relations and Civic Education Advisor position declined the offer. UNDP is considering alternative solutions.
 - ✓ Shortlisting of the Finance and Administration Associate, and Logistics Associate was initiated. The selected candidate for Programme Assistant position declined the offer. UNDP is considering alternative solutions.
 - ✓ The process of recruiting three Regional Supervisors (International United Nations Volunteers) was initiated and will conclude soon.
 - ✓ The process of recruiting a Logistics Support Officer (International UNV) was initiated and will conclude soon.
 - \checkmark Four Project drivers were recruited and have reported for duties.
- The project convened a meeting between NRB and MEC for the former to update the latter on the progress regarding national registration of Malawian citizens for the National ID but also discuss how National ID will be used by MEC in the process towards the 2019 tri-partite elections so that both parties are on the same page on the link between the National ID and

the voter register. The key outcome of that meeting, was a clear understanding on the technical linkage between the National ID and the voter register, and how 'One person One Identity-One Vote' System is a cornerstone to ensure free, fair and transparent elections and any inclusion or exclusion of errors.

- Monthly Technical Committee meetings held to review project performance achieved against the milestones.
- The project had its first Steering Committee meeting on 14th December, 2016. The Second Steering Committee is Planned for 05 April, 2017.

4. Recommendations

Moving forward, the project will continue to prioritize:

a. Accelerated, targeted and effective civic education campaign

The Proof of Concept phase highlighted the importance of customized public awareness campaigns to reach out to citizens to incentive registration and impart the benefits of the national ID card as per Annual Work Plan. A strategy is being implemented by NRB with UNDP technical support.

b. Building NRB capacity

Government of Malawi (GoM) sanctioned NRB to recruit 16 additional IT Officers for mass registration. However, the Functional Review report must be approved promptly so that the recommendations on additional staffing is included in the FY2017-FY2018 National Budget Submission.

c. Promotion of multiple use of national ID

It is critical for NRB with UNDP technical support to continue engaging in individual discussions with various stakeholders regarding multiple use of the national ID. However, to facilitate the focus of NRB on mass registration, it is recommended that the Chief Secretary should take the ownership to drive the agenda of how the GoM will start the detailed planning on the multiple use of national ID.

5. Conclusion

The 2017 first quarter progress report has highlighted activities undertaken and achievements made against the milestones. During this period, the project is on track as demonstrated by the project deliverables completed in time, within budget as per signed Project Document.

6. Future Plans

The second Steering Committee meeting planned for early April, 2017 is expected to approve the 2017 Annual Work Plan which was approved by the Technical Committee on 28th March, 2017. Annex II is a summary of the draft 2017 Annual Work Plan.

7. Financial Section

All financial data (Annex IV) presented in this report is provisional. From UNDP Bureau of Management/Office of Finance and Administration, an annual certified financial statement as of 31 December, will be submitted every year no later than 30 June of the following year.
