#### **Brief Description**

As with its predecessor project, the Low Emission Capacity Building Programme, the NDC Support Programme was designed with the premise that it should serve as a "pathfinder" for programme countries – evolving over time to respond to issues emerging from the UNFCCC Convention, as well the changing development baseline. In this context, a number of new targeted areas of support were incorporated into the Programme over time to strengthen UNDP's support for Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs). Two major unanticipated support needs were: 1) technical support to pilot green recovery efforts as a result of the COVID-19 pandemicand 2) assistance to prepare "second-generation", more ambitious NDCs in advance of COP26 under the umbrella of UNDP's Climate Promise initiative. In adapting to serve these needs, the NDC Support Programme demonstrated its value as a flexible instrument delivering on UNDP corporate and client country priorities.

The section III. Results and Partnerships is complemented by the following Expected Results:

- Green Recovery: With the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic, government priorities around the world shifted to prevention and recovery efforts. However, most countries did not use this opportunity to "build back better" by ensuring that such efforts centred sustainable development. Under this new workstream, targeted support will be provided to five countries already making strong efforts to link NDC enhancement and implementation with green recovery efforts, to further boost and leverage ongoing progress and processes. A global toolbox of approaches, strategies and methodologies for linking NDCs and green recovery will also be developed.
- Climate Promise: The Paris Agreement calls on countries to submit new, more ambitious NDCs every five years, with the first opportunity to do so being in 2020. As initial NDCs put the world on track for a 3-degree increase in average global temperatures, political pressure grew for all countries to submit enhanced NDCs that could put the world on a trajectory in line with climate science. UNDP's Climate Promise was launched in September 2019 as a contribution to the UN Secretary General's Climate Ambition Summit and quickly became a corporate priority and the world's largest offering of support for the NDC revision process. Through the Climate Promise, 120 countries will be supported to submit enhanced NDCs to the UNFCCC Secretariat.
- Progressive Platforms: The LDC Group is among the most progressive voices for raising global ambition on climate change and champions the call for equity and the most ambitious action on mitigation and adaptation by all. However, due to their limited resources and capacities, engaging effectively and on a level playing field in the UNFCCC negotiations is a continual challenge for the LDCs. Through the first 2 phases of this project, resources will be allocated to various negotiating groups and progressive platforms to engage LDC countries in the UNFCCC negotiations as well progressing implementation of the Paris Agreement. In particular, it will improve the ability of the groups to promote enhanced ambition in different processes. It will also contribute to align LDC countries with the goals of the Paris Agreement.

The resources required have been updated accordingly. The additional contributions i.e. approx.. 65 milion USD mobilized through Germany, the European Union, Spain and Sweden are reflected in Appendix 1.

The Results Frameworks (section V) is replaced by the Appendix 2. Indicators (highlighted in yellow) and target values are amended to reflect in a harmonized way the various donor projects objectives and targets.

The Monitoring & Evaluation Plan (section VI) is amended to foresee at least 1 Project Board meeting per year, physical or virtual, going forward, and 1 Programme Evaluation in 2022.

The Mutli-Year Workplan (section VII) is replaced by the Appendix 3.
