Brief Description

At the UN climate change conference in Paris in December 2015, 196 countries adopted the Paris Agreement – the first ever, legally binding universal pact that sets out a global action plan for limiting global warming to "well below 2°C" starting from 2020. The Agreement, which officially entered into force on 4 November 2016, built upon the foundation of climate pledges from 187 countries, known as Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs). Countries are expected to submit updated and more ambitious NDCs every five years – meaning that they will become the main vehicle for illustrating a country's strategic vision on climate change in the context of sustainable development.

Along with the opportunity and momentum created by the Paris Agreement comes the important challenge of transforming these NDCs into tangible actions that lead to long term, zero-carbon and climate-resilient development. As evident in the submitted NDCs, and based upon UNDP's direct experience, most developing countries need sustained financial, capacity building and technical support to regularly prepare, implement, and report on national actions under the Paris Agreement and more specifically against NDC targets for reducing greenhouse gases (GHGs).

The UNDP NDC Support Programme supports Governments to achieve transformational change by using NDC implementation as a mechanism to scale up investments in climate change and deliver sustainable development. Specifically, the Programme builds on UNDP's extensive foundational work supporting on low-emission development to help them deliver on the commitments outlined in their NDCs and, through this, on the Paris Agreement and beyond to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

As with its predecessor project, the Low Emission Capacity Building Programme, the NDC Support Programme was designed with the premise that it should serve as a "pathfinder" for programme countries – evolving over time to respond to issues emerging from the UNFCCC Convention, as well the changing development baseline. In this context, a number of new targeted areas of support were incorporated into the Programme over time to strengthen UNDP's support for Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs). Two major unanticipated support needs were: 1) technical support to pilot green recovery efforts as a result of the COVID-19 pandemicand 2) assistance to prepare "second-generation", more ambitious NDCs in advance of COP26 under the umbrella of UNDP's Climate Promise initiative. Furthermore, the Programme, which kick-started in 18 countries, was eventually rolled out in 47 countries and territories. In adapting to serve the growing and changing needs, the NDC Support Programme demonstrated its value as a flexible instrument delivering on UNDP corporate and client country priorities.

To date, Programme countries have delivered and achieved significant results. However, the growing nature of the Programme and the challenges encountered (such as the COVID-19 crisis) during its long implementation period led to delays in implementation. While it is still planned that countries will achieve the expected results by 31 December 2023, the Programme requires an additional year (until 31 December 2024) to allow the completion of administrative processes related to its closing as well as augmenting the visibility of its achievements, including – but not limited to:

- Definition of country exit strategies and support to country project closing support or bridging to the 'Climate Promise: From Pledge to Impact' programme
- Stock-take of major achievements and lessons learned
- Final Evaluation and Final Report of the global programme
- Organisation of knowledge exchanges and advocacy activities
- Publication of knowledge products and reports related to the Programme work.

This extension will be fully covered by the existing programme resources. The remaining available funds will be used during the year 2024, allowing the programme to operationally and financially close. The Results Framework (appendix 1) and the Multi-year Workplan (appendix 2) have been revised accordingly.
