

**Specific Arrangement for a cost-sharing contribution between  
the Netherlands Minister for Foreign Trade  
and Development Cooperation  
(hereinafter referred to as the Minister)  
and  
the United Nations Development Programme  
(hereinafter referred to as UNDP)**

With reference to the General Arrangement concluded 17 August 2005, and the amendment to the General Arrangement dated 4 December 2008, between the Minister for Development Cooperation of the Netherlands and the United Nations Development Programme;

Whereas the Minister has decided to provide a contribution, under cost sharing modality, to the programme "UNDP SDG 16 and Sustaining peace in Tunisia" as described in the project document dated 28 August 2018 with the Netherlands internal identification number 4000002037 and the UNDP Project ID 00112467 for the amount of USD 18,808,479.00;

Whereas UNDP is prepared to accept the support under conditions of the General Arrangement and the amendment to the General Arrangement.

The Minister and UNDP have decided as follows:

The contribution will be provided for the period from 15 November 2018 to 31 December 2022.

The terms of the General Arrangement and the amendment to the General Arrangement will apply to this Arrangement. In addition the following will apply:

In case the implementation period agreed upon is likely to be overrun, UNDP shall submit to the Minister a written request for a no-additional funding extension of the implementation period as soon as possible.

Upon receipt of the original signed Specific Arrangement, the Minister will deposit the first instalment of the contribution of USD 7,000,000.00 into the UNDP Contributions Account No. 015-002284 and SWIFT: CHASUS33 at the JP Morgan Bank, 1166 Avenue of the Americas, New York, NY 10022.

Any subsequent payments will take place according to the following schedule and will be based on liquidity needs:

The contribution will be charged 8 percent for the provision of General Management support (GMS).

The UNDP will submit annual plans for the years 2020, 2021 and 2022 no later than November of the preceding calendar year.

The UNDP will submit annual narrative progress reports, including provisional financial data, not later than July of the following calendar year.

The UNDP will submit a final narrative report on the project not later than 6 months after the agreed date of its operational completion.

The UNDP will submit a mid-term and final evaluation report so as to further capitalize on the lessons learned during the implementation process.

A certified financial statement on income and expenditures will be submitted by UNDP HQ, no later than 30 June of each calendar year.

A final certified financial statement on income and expenditures, prepared by the comptroller of UNDP, will be submitted by UNDP HQ no later than 30 June of the year following the year of financial completion of the project.

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

Please find attached the specific arrangement regarding the above mentioned project. I kindly request you to sign and date this arrangement and to return a signed copy to my office.

Given the implementing partner agreement between UNDP and IDLO, the Netherlands expects both partners to engage in regular policy dialogue and ensure activities are complementary and implemented in coordination. We expect UNDP to report accordingly.

The Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation is aware that UNDP is working in countries where various types of justice systems may be applicable. The Minister is confident that UNDP will respect the relevant international agreements on human rights, while delivering programmes. In particular, programmes that in any way contravene women's rights should not be implemented. Monitoring and evaluation systems should focus on this, and if any shortcomings emerge this should immediately be raised with the Minister.

Finally I would like to draw your attention to recent correspondence between the Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation and UNDP HQ of which copies are attached to this message.
