Brief Description
<p>Situation analysis: The drought and saltwater intrusion situation deteriorated rapidly from September 2019 in the Mekong delta of Viet Nam. The aggregated rainfall in the upstream areas of China, Myanmar, Laos and Cambodia experienced a sharp decrease in comparison with multi-year average data, resulting in less streamflow into the Mekong delta of Viet Nam. In October 2019, the Viet Nam Disaster Management Agency (VNDMA) within the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development (MARD) issued Directive No. 8008 requesting provincial authorities to formulate drought management plans, including early actions for drought-stricken areas; measures to transform agricultural activities; water retention schemes, and supply of fresh water to households. As of January 2020, saltwater had intruded deeper into the inland areas, up to 60km from the river mouth of Ben Tre province. The Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MONRE) forecast that the salinity boundary in 2020 would cross the historical salinity boundary in the dry season of 2015-2016.</p> <p>Meanwhile, on 23 January 2020, Viet Nam recorded its first cases of the novel coronavirus that had first been reported in Wuhan, China, several weeks earlier. On 28 January 2020, Viet Nam's Prime Minister issued Directive No. 05 / CT-TTg on the prevention and control of this novel coronavirus. The Prime Minister instructed ministries, sectors and localities to take caution and prevent the spread of the epidemic. Specific instructions were given to mobilize the whole government system to ensure prevention and control of epidemic to protect people's health and lives and to minimize deaths caused by the virus. Epidemic declarations, border tightening, applying aviation permits, revocation and visa restrictions were swiftly announced. The authorities instituted proactive contact tracing, targeted testing, self-isolation and quarantine measures to curtail spread and prevent community transmission. From April 1 nationwide physical distancing rules were adopted for 15 days, requiring all persons to stay at home except for essential and emergency outings, and closing non-essential businesses.¹ From 16 to 22 April, these physical distancing rules were maintained in 10 "high risk" cities and provinces.</p>

As of May 16, Viet Nam has recorded 318 cases, with zero deaths, 260 recovered and 39 still under treatment. No new cases of community transmission were detected in Viet Nam for a period of 99 days from 17 April, allowing significant easing of physical distancing measures and partial economic recovery. From 25 July, a further wave of COVID-19 community transmission was detected, including the country's first deaths from the virus, which led to the reintroduction of physical distancing measures throughout areas deemed high-risk. 30 August was the first full day since July 25 that saw no new infections and it appears that Vietnam is once again on the threshold of defeating the virus. As of 31 August 2020, Viet Nam has reported a total of 1,040 cases, with 32 deaths.

The economy has been impacted by reduced consumer spending, production and trade, especially in the tourism, transportation, retail trade and manufacturing sectors. GDP grew 3.82 percent in Q1 2020, compared to 6.79 percent during Q1 2019. Household consumption growth was estimated at 2.92 percent compared to 7.22 percent in Q1, 2019. The General Statistics Office (GSO) estimated five million workers and nearly 85 percent of companies were negatively affected by COVID-19 in Q1. Further impacts are expected to be shown in Q2. The Government has issued fiscal, monetary and credit measures including a \$2.6 billion social protection package with cash support to vulnerable people and workers losing their jobs. However, this support has not reached many impacted groups such as the newly poor and informal workers.

The United Nations in Viet Nam has established a coordinated One UN response to COVID-19 in support of the Government of Viet Nam's national health and socio-economic response. The first iteration of the UN COVID-19 Strategic Preparedness and Response Plan in Viet Nam was compiled on 27 March 2020 under the technical leadership of WHO, focusing on 3 pillars: 1) ensure continuity of essential public health and social protection functions; 2) assess economic impact; and 3) education. These three pillars were selected to enable the UN to focus on the immediate challenges facing Viet Nam at that time, in the context of the country's COVID-19 prevention and control measures which included closure of schools and physical distancing, taking into account the need to maintain continuity of essential health and social services, and as significant initial social and economic impacts of the pandemic became apparent. This plan was uploaded on the WHO Partners' Portal on 31 March. It was designed as a living document and was updated several times. An overall UNCT socio-economic impact assessment (SEIA) and socio-economic response plan (SERP) are being finalized with technical leadership by UNDP.

UNDP's response: On 10 January 2020, Senior Management of UNDP Viet Nam met with VNDMA to clarify expectations of the Government of Viet Nam (GoVN) for the support required. The key support identified at that stage included: technical support to a rapid impacts and needs assessment (with the first assessment planned for 15-17 January), support to coordination and information sharing with provinces, international organisations and INGOs; and organization of debriefing workshops and events to present key findings of the assessment and the overarching response planning. As the leading member of the in-country Disaster Risk Management Team (DRMT), UNDP Viet Nam has been monitoring the drought and salinity situation in the Mekong Delta since October 2019. Following the receipt of the official request from MARD, UNDP Viet Nam encouraged the DRMT to initiate a conversation with UNOCHA focal point in the Region to discuss preparedness, activation of standard operating procedures for slow-onset disasters and follow-up actions.

Additionally, UNDP has identified several programmatic functions to support Viet Nam in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic crisis, in line with UNDP's Initial Corporate Guidance for Response and Recovery as adapted to the COVID-19 pandemic and the UNDP COVID-19 offer issued in April 2020 and the further COVID-19 2.0 offer "Beyond Recovery: Towards 2030" issued in June 2020, focused on (i) Health crisis support and systems strengthening, (ii) Social protection – uprooting inequalities, including impact assessments and response and recovery support to Leave No One Behind, (iii) Green resilient economy, (iv) Governance, and (v) Digital transformation for speed and scale.

The outcomes, outputs and activities under this project are undertaken within the framework of the overall UNCT COVID-19 response and are strongly integrated within the CO's overall COVID-19 portfolio, building on and taking forward the initial response supported through COVID-19 support under the TRAC2, RRF and MPTF mechanisms as well as reprogramming of funds under several ongoing projects.

I. PURPOSE

The proposed project aims to ensure that UNDP Viet Nam will take a leading role in all processes pertaining to responses to life-saving humanitarian assistance and to early recovery actions impacted by the drought and salinity, and by the coronavirus crisis.

UNDP is currently operating in three out of thirteen provinces in the Delta, namely: Ca Mau, Bac Lieu and Ben Tre. Our strong collaboration and partnership with the provincial authorities, as well as with the Ministry of Agricultural and Rural Development in disaster management require that UNDP responds promptly and effectively to the emerging situation with a view to reducing sufferings and human impacts should a full-scale crisis occurs. UNDP will also invest resources to identify root causes of this drought in order to develop recovery and development recommendations to address longer-term resilience needs of the most vulnerable communities.

UNDP has long-established work under the Small Grants Programme in provinces throughout Viet Nam, including Ha Giang in the north which has been highly impacted by the border closure with China and the loss of income from international tourism, and Binh Thuan in the south central coast region with dragon fruit farmers who have been highly impacted by border closures and market disruptions.

II. STRATEGY

The project aims to support the Government of Viet Nam to promote effective recovery to the socio-economic impact of the drought and the drought and saltwater intrusion crisis and the COVID-19 pandemic through strengthening assessments, information management and data analysis and through providing fast-tracked support to water storage for households facing with water shortage, and support to COVID-19 response, recovery and beyond with a focus on leaving no one behind.

The project has seven outputs, as follows:

1. *Drought & saltwater intrusion: Impact and needs assessments smoothly coordinated and timely undertaken in selected provinces that produce required information and data for decision making processes by the Government, UN agencies and INGOs.*
 2. *COVID-19 Health procurement: Procurement services of health products including personal protective equipment (PPE) and laboratory equipment/provision of non-medical requirements of health sector.*
 3. *COVID-19 Crisis response and Recovery support: inclusive and integrated crisis management and responses.*
 4. *COVID-19 Leave No-One Behind support to Poor and Vulnerable people.*
 5. *COVID-19 Leave No-One Behind support to People with Disabilities.*
 6. *COVID-19 Social Economic Impact Assessment.*
 7. *COVID-19 coordination of assessments and communication activities focusing on the most vulnerable groups.*
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III. EXPECTED OUTPUT

Outcome 1: Response to the drought and saltwater intrusion in Viet Nam

Output 1 ([#00119975](#)): Impact and needs assessments smoothly coordinated and timely undertaken in selected provinces that produce required information and data for decision making processes by the Government, UN agencies and INGOs.

- 1.1 Support with regular coordination / meetings to define assessment tools and methodology, assessment preparations, sectors and locations among UN agencies, INGOs and the Government focal agency.
- 1.2 Lead joint assessments on impacts and needs in the selected Mekong delta provinces, focusing on water supply and livelihoods.
- 1.3 Organize meetings and workshops to present and discuss key assessment findings and for planning of humanitarian assistance, recovery and resilience-building efforts.
- 1.4 Provide support to the provinces and Government in overarching response planning and coordination.

Output 2: Enhanced UNDP capacities to catalyze humanitarian resources and provide technical support to recovery planning.

- 2.1 Develop UNDP inputs for the joint technical proposal accessing CERF
- 2.2 Further refine a mobile phone Application on resources tracking
- 2.3 Work with provinces and the Government on potential fund-raising proposals

Outcome 2: Response to the COVID-19 pandemic in Viet Nam

- 2.2 Anticipatory governance support through the Innovation Facility and NextGen Governance regional initiative to strengthen the capacity of the Ministry of Planning and Investment to anticipate future shocks and other risks facing the SME sector, contributing to building resilience of the SME sector and ensuring that SMEs are not left behind.
- 2.3 Support to national production and supply chain management of personal protective equipment (PPE) and other essential commodities by the Ministry of Health and healthcare facilities, including the wider application of digital technologies and service robots developed under the TRAC2 and RRF projects.

- 3.1 Study on identifying new and emerging opportunities for Vietnamese businesses and SMEs and the role of the Ministry of Planning and Investment in attracting high quality FDI that reaches/engages SMEs in agriculture product processing and other sectoral value chains, ensuring that they are not left behind in the emerging ‘new normal’ of COVID-19.
- 3.2 Policy advisor on inclusive and integrated crisis management and responses.
- 3.3 Policy analysis and advocacy on recognition and inclusion of agricultural cooperatives in fiscal and social protection measures of the Government in response to COVID-19 and other emergencies, external shocks and environmental risks, ensuring that cooperatives are not left behind.
- 3.4 Policy recommendations designed to inform Government social support packages, focusing on feedback and lessons from above activities to enhance government policies on recovery and building back better for vulnerable groups and those at risk of being left behind, including ethnic minorities, women, PWD and youth.

Output 4 (00121752): COVID-19 Leave No-One-Behind support to Poor and Vulnerable people.

- 4.1 Provision of training and support to agricultural cooperatives and SMEs on prevention and management of business risks due to COVID-19 and other emergencies, external shocks and environmental risks, in cooperation with VCCI, the Viet Nam Cooperative Alliance and the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development.
- 4.3 Advisory support to Ministry of Health for ongoing emergency needs as well as ‘building back better’ through strengthened systems for procurement, inventory management, national production and supply chain management of health products, including the use of digital technologies and service robots, building on the support provided under the TRAC 2 and RRF proposals.
- 4.4 Development and deployment of a real-time poverty and vulnerability monitoring tool for analysis and preparation of a poverty monitoring report on the second half of 2020, providing real-time data and analysis on the poverty and vulnerability situation to inform the Government and other stakeholders’ efforts to reduce the negative impacts of the pandemic and support the recovery, contributing to ensuring that no one is left behind.
- 4.5 Cash for work activities (e.g. environmental landscape activities, forest planting, environmental clean-up activities) for around 650 people who have lost livelihoods/employment, and improved WASH for around 1,300 households experiencing combined COVID-19 socio-economic impacts and lacking adequate WASH facilities in southern provinces; contributing to ensure that no one is left behind.
- 4.6 Support 10 agricultural cooperatives and their members in southern Viet Nam who are farming households comprising at least 600 people to recover from COVID-19 and drought/saltwater intrusion impacts and build back better through green and environmentally sustainable production and certification, supporting diversification of markets. The support to each cooperative will be adjusted based on the specific COVID-19 impacts and business plan for recovery, the number of cooperative

members and their specific needs. Results from this activity will inform wider recovery and development policies and plans.

- 4.7 Support to digital transformation including e-payments and e-services and diversification of products and markets including virtual markets, employment e-platforms, skills training, and digital certification and traceability for household businesses, MSMEs and cooperatives, particularly those headed by/employing women, PWD and ethnic minorities, and youth, to ensure they are not left behind and can recover and build forward better in the IR4.0 context and the emerging 'new normal' of COVID-19.

Output 5 (00121753): COVID-19 Leave No-One Behind support to People with Disabilities.

- 5.1 Strengthened access to healthcare for PWD, particularly PWD in rural areas, through strategic assessment (building on the results of the rapid assessment) and applying innovative approach.
- 5.2 Support to economic security of PWD through training and capacity building of PWD for online employment opportunities.

Output 6 (00121754): COVID-19 Social Economic Impact Assessment.

- 6.1 Conducting the second round of rapid assessment of COVID-19 socio-economic impacts on poor households and MSMEs, including those headed by women and ethnic minorities, informing the Government and other stakeholders' efforts on response and recovery, contributing to leaving no one behind.
- 6.2 Development and deployment of a real-time poverty and vulnerability monitoring tool for analysis and preparation of a poverty monitoring report on the second half of 2020, providing real-time data and analysis on the poverty and vulnerability situation to inform the Government and other stakeholders' efforts to reduce the negative impacts of the pandemic and support the recovery, contributing to ensuring that no one is left behind.

Output 7 (00120607): COVID-19 coordination of assessments and communication activities focusing on the most vulnerable groups.

- 7.1 Support to the Ministry of Health in providing access to health information and services for PWD and ethnic minorities using ethnic minority languages, contributing to leave no one behind.
- 7.2 Support to health communications on COVID-19 and other infectious diseases prevention and safe livelihoods practices for vulnerable households, micro businesses and agricultural cooperatives.

IV. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

The Project will be implemented by the Climate Change and Environment Unit of UNDP Viet Nam following the Direct Implementation Modality. As such, the management procedures, including for programmatic, financial and administrative aspects, will follow our standard processes. On an external partner aspect, the activities will be implemented in close collaboration with the Viet Nam Disaster Management Authority, the Government appointed agency for disaster management in the country. In addition, the activities will also be coordinated with members of the UN teams.

UNDP's cross-unit COVID-19 response and recovery portfolio is managed by the UNDP Viet Nam Country Office through the Direct Implementation Modality (DIM). UNDP will deliver this response and recovery support in partnership with relevant Government ministries, provincial authorities, institutions, the private sector, CSOs and communities. The COVID-19 Coordinator will take the leading role of overall planning, coordinating, monitoring progress and consolidating results and reports based on inputs from all responsible programme managers and technical leads in charge of respective outputs and activities. Programme Officers in charge of respective outputs will take full responsibility for planning, budgeting, managing, mobilizing qualified technical experts and services, and timely implementation of activities and delivering output results, and monitoring and composing and sharing reports of the outputs to the COVID-19 coordinator. Programme Officers perform these functions to standards that ensure efficiency, cost-effectiveness, transparency, effective institutional coordination, and harmony with the overall development policies and priorities of UNDP and the Government of Viet Nam. A communications and visibility plan for the COVID-19 response will be

developed by UNDP's communications team in cooperation with the COVID-19 Coordinator. Donor contacts will be maintained under the overall leadership of the RR and DRR, supported by the COVID-19 Coordinator.

UNDP Viet Nam Country Office has had initial contact with the Embassy of Japan and will meet with the Embassy and JICA in the coming time to discuss the proposed activities and possible areas for synergy and collaboration. The CO will ensure that all public events and products provide sufficient visibility to Japan as the donor of the project and request the participation of the Embassy of Japan in all public events and public information material.

V. MONITORING

The Project Manager will have overall responsibility for ensuring quality delivery of the expected outputs, including monitoring the progress and adequate performance of project partners. The Project Associate will provide programmatic, administrative and logistical support to the team and responsible party as needed. The DRR/CCA advisor will provide necessary quality assurance of the project and provide daily supervision of the Project Manager. The Deputy Country Director will provide overall guidance over programme delivery and officially communicate with key stakeholders (namely the Crisis Bureau and the Government of Viet Nam) on activities, results and issues.

Senior DRR Technical Advisors from Bangkok Regional Office will be mobilised to provide regular necessary support, particularly with regards to recovery planning and policy dialogue after the recovery plan and action plan are proposed. Regular technical-level meetings will be held more regularly as deemed appropriate to manage expectations and ensure stakeholder satisfaction. A final results report will be provided to key stakeholders following completion of activities.

For effective coordination of cross-portfolio activities, an overall COVID-19 task team has been established under the leadership of the RR and DRR, with the participation of the full SMT and relevant programme and operations personnel, supported by a COVID-19 Coordinator (International Consultant). The Task Team is further grouped into sub-teams as necessary to address key cross-portfolio work areas during critical periods, including on: (i) Health Procurement, (ii) National Production, PPE Inventory Management & Innovation, (iii) Impact Assessment of COVID-19, (iv) SMEs and Cooperatives, (v) LNOB Response and Recovery, (vi) Health & Livelihoods Communications, (vii) Health Information and Services for PWDs, and (viii) Portfolio Coordination. Frequency of team meetings will be increased or decreased based on the evolving COVID-19 situation and response activities.


