## 2. Assessment of implementation of Action activities

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### 2.1. Executive summary of the Action

Disasters affect Serbia's economic and environmental standing, diminish the country's development potential, pose a risk to social stability, and jeopardize EU investments. The effectiveness of the disaster risk management system relies on the adequate human, physical and financial capacities for planning, preparation, responding, and post-disaster recovery, as well as on proper vertical and horizontal coordination between all the relevant institutions. Over the past two decades, droughts, floods, exceptionally harsh winters, and other weather-related extreme events have caused major physical damage, financial losses, and even deaths, and at the same time, had significant impacts on the economy.

2019 Global Crisis Severity Index with an average score of 3.5 places Serbia in the group of medium-risk and rather stable countries. Although the applied INFORM methodology assesses Serbian vulnerability as moderately low, it still recognizes institutional and governance shortcomings (scored with 5.2) and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) (5.7) as having undermining impact on the overall coping capacity. The critical problem of the Serbian Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management System is the fragmentation of the institutional framework, procedures, and insufficient capacities at the central and local level for adequate prevention, preparation, and response to disaster risk needs of the communities and population. **The Action** is designed to overcome the administrative hierarchy of institutions and to improve coordinated response and coherence of national and local policies and approaches. The holistic approach brings together continuous efforts of beneficiary institutions in establishing an all-encompassing and effective disaster risk management system and synergetic effect of well-coordinated and sequenced donor-funded initiatives. The Action shall contribute to effective management in emergencies by aligning civil protection, and disaster risk resilience approaches with the EU standards, thus enabling the realization and implementation of the **Sendai DRR Framework**. Improved disaster risk management system in Serbia will also bolster the national contribution to the EU Civil Protection Mechanism. In designing the Action, both UNDP and beneficiary institutions applied a 360° whole-government and whole-society approach through community engagement and inclusion of the vulnerable groups. Implementation of the Action will have a significant impact on the improvement of capacities at the central and local level for preparedness and response in case of incidents and disasters through upgrading physical, social, and human capacities. It will improve institutional coordination at the horizontal and vertical levels, improve technical and operational capacities for prevention and reaction. Each of the activities, outcomes, and outputs responds directly to the specific needs and contributes to advanced cooperation across sectors and enables a faster, better coordinated, and more effective response to natural and man-made disasters.

Description of the specific activities and interventions proposed (purchase of equipment, construction of infrastructure, provision of services, and trainings) are developed based on the IPA 2019//Serbia/EU for Civil Protection Action Document.

**The overall objective of the Action** is to contribute to the reduction of vulnerability to disasters and increase the country's resilience to climate change. The overall objective is based on the identified gaps in the DRR sector, namely the limited technical capacities and weak cooperation between different stakeholders.

**The specific objective of the Action** is to put in place the capacities for emergency management and disaster risk resilience at the national and local level.

Following the outbreak of the COVID-19 and first signs of infestation and declared the State of Emergency in the Republic of Serbia in March 2020, the Delegation of the European Union to the Republic of Serbia (EUD) as support to governmental efforts in combating COVID-19 outbreak and increase capacities of the health system accelerated contracting of the Project "EU for Civil Protection and Disaster Resilience Strengthening in the Republic of Serbia" and included an Emergency Clause<sup>2</sup> in the Contribution Agreement

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<sup>2</sup> This Action, by invoking this clause, also allows the necessary flexibility to respond to any emergency measures that demand urgent Action in the field of emergency management. In the form of an example, such measures can be aerial transport operations for delivering equipment/supplies or purchase of equipment in the context of national emergencies of any kind (e.g. natural disasters, pandemics, man-made and technological disasters). Upon agreement of the two contracting parties, the measures to be supported shall be prioritised with regard to other activities and any budgetary implications and funding shortfalls for the

(CoA) no. 202/415-529 was signed on 20 March 2020. The Contracting Authority (CA) and UNDP agreed to prioritize immediate response to medical supplies impediments whilst all the programmatic and budgetary implications to the implementation of the other activities have been jointly assessed and mitigated. Following the activation of the Emergency Clause as per governmental request for urgent airlifts of medical supplies, UNDP arranged, contracted, and successfully realized a total of fifteen (15) airlift operations and delivered 721 tons of critical medical equipment and supplies to Serbia in March, April and May 2020, thus contributing to a good initial response by the Government to the pandemic.

*The Amendment to the Financing Decision came into effect in June 2020, and subsequently the Delegation of the European Union in the Republic of Serbia and UNDP signed the Addendum no. 1 to Contribution Agreement on 6 July 2020. With this, additional funds in the amount of EUR 6.6 million partially replenished the airlift costs incurred in the COVID-19 emergency response. Even though the total project budget was increased from EUR 7,499,996 to a total of EUR 14,099,996.*

The COVID-19 induced emergency led to the exposure of the capacity gaps in the national disaster risk management system and its dependence on international assistance, proving once again the necessity of further enhancement of the disaster management system and institutional response, which are the primary objectives of this Action. UNDP managed to continue the implementation of envisaged activities in a defined timeframe and compensate emergency caused budgetary shortfalls due to timely amendment of the EU Financing Decision and allocation of the supplementary funding.

The intervention logic remains valid and there are no modifications to the log-frame matrix neither at the level of outcome, outputs or activities.

## 2.2. Results and Activities

In the reporting period, the Action achieved significant improvements of technical capacities of the Serbian disaster management system at national and local level, successfully developing digital innovative tools, and investing in human capacity building, knowledge sharing, policy advancement and finalising technical documentation preparation phase for infrastructural upgrades.

Referring to the updated Log frame matrix, during the reporting period the Action has had a substantial level of achievement and positive impact of the results on the basis of corresponding current value of indicators. UNDP managed to provide local level training exceeding targeted value, rendered support to policy development in the DRR area in Serbia, developed innovative software solutions for managing risks (National Disaster Risk Register) and completed technical documentation for regional training centre. The Action also supported development of the National Strategy for Disaster Risk Reduction and development of the Post-Disaster Needs Assessment Methodology.

### Key project results in the reporting period are:

#### Infrastructure:

- The MoI/SEM request to reallocate EUR 1,5 million envisaged for the SEM HQ for the procurement of an additional number of specialized fire vehicles approved by the CA/EUD. UNDP shall implement procurement in the most effective and efficient way.
- Pre-parcellation Design, Feasibility Study Design for Building Permit, Environmental impact assessment study, Fire Protection Study, Energy Efficiency Study, Design for Execution of Works, Preventive Measures Plan, and Main Fire Protection Design for the

implementation of other planned activities shall be jointly assessed and mitigated. For this clause to be in effect, the prior agreement of the two contracting parties is absolutely necessary.

upgrade of the Education Centre in Rudno completed and adopted. UNDP completed independent verification of the Design for Execution of Works.

#### Innovation:

- National Disaster Risk Register software completed and operational, and acquired data on floods, landslides, earthquakes, and forest fires. Register fully operational and available to general public.

#### Human capacity:

- E-learning modules on Civil Protection, Disaster Risk Reduction and Post-Disaster Recovery in NAPA LMS available to public employees at national and local level, and UNDP is collaborating with NAPA to make these online trainings available to local actors outside the public administration system, such as the health sector, education, cultural institutions, civil society organisations and the general public.
- A total cumulative number of 1,126 local stakeholders trained exceeding the final target of 900. In the reporting period, UNDP organized local level trainings in Sombor, Zrenjanin, Kraljevo, Valjevo, Loznica, Vranje, Priboj, Uzice, Novi Sad, Nis, Sabac, Cacak and Borsko jezero with 998 local responders trained.
- UNDP organised International DRR Conference 13-14 October 2022 bringing together professionals and academia and putting forward the discussion on possible directions for further strengthening of societal and institutional mechanisms, increase in community resilience and minimizing the consequences of disasters. UNDP is supporting Faculty of Security Studies in Belgrade in developing a Monography which will harvest main conclusions from the Conference and become a part of the regular curriculum of the Faculty.
- 16 highly experienced MRSS staff members trained to the level of instructor - 6 for helicopter rescue, 6 for High Rope Gondola Evacuation and 4 for Water rescue. MRSS trained 14 rescuers for High Rope Gondola Evacuation (11 men, 3 women), and 10 rescuers for Water Rescue, with the participation of MRS of Sarajevo and Brcko, and Tara rangers.

The current value of the indicators corresponds to the planned indicators from the updated log-frame matrix (see 2.3 below). UNDP completed all the procurements of vehicles and equipment already in the previous reporting period and achieved related indicator targets. In this reporting period, UNDP completed the development of the Disaster Risk Register software, data acquisition and local level training reaching and exceeding envisaged indicator targets, while finalising the training of MRSS instructors and rescuers. There is a moderately decreased level of achievements related to infrastructure, especially due to the reallocation of funds envisaged for the construction of the Sector for Emergency Management building towards the procurement of specialised firefighting vehicles, and partly due to the dependency of the slow institutional response in review and approval of technical documentation for the reconstruction of the Education Training Centre in Rudno, as well as extensive coordination with numerous stakeholders involved, but still according to the plan.

As a general remark, the issues related to infrastructural component are resolved (approved reallocation) and all the results are on a good path to meet the target value of indicators, with equipment and human capacity component have already achieved or exceeded them.

The Steering Committee (SC) is operational and convening regularly. Since the activities related to the health sector had been finalised in the previous reporting period, the SC convened in convocation of following beneficiary institutions: Ministry of Interior, Sector for Emergency Management, Ministry of the European Integration and former Public Investment Management Office succeeded by the Ministry for Public Investment being main project partners and key actors in the National Disaster Risk Management Mechanism and coordination of the emergency assistance, with participation of Republic Geodetic Authority due to the prevalence of the Disaster Risk Register activities in the reporting period and beyond. All the SC members extended support to presented arrangements and readiness for active participation in the decision-making process.

UNDP maintains daily communication with the beneficiary institutions securing that all the capacities and implementation arrangements are in place for the prompt reaction in the case of the emerging requests. The established UNDP Project Team remain fully operational and consists of Portfolio Analyst (Manager), Project Coordinator, Finance Associate, Procurement Assistant and Project Assistant and effectively facilitates the decision-making process. The Programme Specialist – Team Leader for Resilient Development and UNDP Serbia Operations perform oversight and quality assurance in line with positively pillar assessed UNDP procedures.

UNDP organised the 4<sup>th</sup> Steering Committee Meeting on 13 May 2022 which provided a follow up on the issues raised and activities implementation dynamics established in the 3<sup>rd</sup> SC, an overview of the current status and progress of each of the activity, and discussed issues of importance to smooth implementation and resolving potential bottlenecks related primarily to infrastructural components of the Action, in particular the Sector of Emergency Management Headquarters Building, as the most critical activity of the Action, and MoI/SEM request for reallocation of funds to the procurement of additional firefighting specialised vehicles. The 4<sup>th</sup> SC concluded the MoI/SEM should send an Explanatory Note to MEI and EUD in this regard, but also provide an alternative option for the continuation of the construction within the Project. The SC also approved the MRSS request for replacing High-angle rescue training with Cable Car Evacuation Instructor Course rescue training for 6 rescuers.

UNDP prepared the Minutes from the 4<sup>th</sup> SC meeting and the SC members adopted them (please find adopted Minutes in **Annex 1**).

Quality, scope and time perspective of the results and activities were continually observed and conveyed to relevant national partners and the EUD through written and verbal reporting mechanism and on-spot monitoring and evaluation requirements. The Action gave specific attention to the estimation of impact on the target groups.

**Deliverables reached in the reporting period:**

EUD approved SEM proposal for reallocation of funds to procurement of specialised firefighting vehicles.

**UNDP supported development of technical documentation for construction of the SEM facility at Djordja Stanojevica bb, New Belgrade. Urban Development Design completed and adopted, and Location conditions issued. The facility of over 4,000 sqm facility must be co-funded, but MoI failed to provide technical documentation and assure co-funding, finally requesting the reallocation of funds from the construction of the SEM HQ to the procurement of specialised firefighting vehicles. On 19 January 2023, the CA endorsed SEM request and UNDP shall implement tender and contracting in the Q1 2023.**

**Status: Steady Progress**

Following a more detailed cost estimate of construction of the SEM facility at Djordja Stanojevica bb, New Belgrade done by SEM in February 2022, unknown MoI/SEM co-financing situation, fluctuation of market prices, budgetary shortcomings and time constraints, and the fact that preliminary estimate for the construction, goes beyond the funds available within the Action, the SEM representatives during the 4<sup>th</sup> SC conveyed their request to amend the activity of constructing HQ building and requested additional funds for continuing with the construction of the facility or proposed reallocation of existing for the procurement of additional firefighting/specialised vehicles for combatting forest and wildfires.

SEM sent an Official Letter /Explanatory Note to Ministry of European Integration (MEI) in this regard in July 2022 proposing two alternatives for utilisation of funds envisaged for the construction of the HQ building:

- 1<sup>st</sup> requesting additional funds for the construction to cover the gap between available project funds and needed funds following a precise estimate of works provided in the course of developing technical documentation (preliminary financial estimations indicated at least EUR 3 million gap), with the SEM responsibility to cover the cost of furnishing and equipping of the premises, and
- 2<sup>nd</sup> requesting the reallocation of funds envisaged for the construction of the building and the Central platform for real-time acquisition, processing, distribution of data from microcontroller stations towards the procurement of 9 (nine) fire and rescue water tender trucks of 7,000 litres and a mobile command and operations centre for combatting forest and wildfires.

Due to protracted forming of the Government of Serbia after spring elections, which was finalised only late October 2022, SEM re-submitted the request to MEI in December 2022 which was reviewed and submitted the proposal to EUD/CA on 2 December 2022. Following internal consultations, the EUD approved the MoI/SEM request for reallocation of funding to procure an additional number of specialized firefighting vehicles on 19 January 2023, and UNDP shall conduct tender process in the first quarter of 2023. The MEI and the EUD are conducting the procedure for **amendment of the Annual Action Programme 2019 and the Action Document ‘EU for Civil Protection and Disaster Resilience Strengthening’** and upon its finalisation UNDP will submit a request for Contract Addendum reflecting the changes in the Scope of the Action, . However, the risks table contains the assessment related to the actual state and the upcoming high-value procurement.

### Policy level support

*CA agreed to include in the scope of Action's support the national partners expressed need for support in developing Serbian PDNA Methodology, conducting ex-post evaluation of the Action Plan (AP) for National Disaster Risk Management Plan (NDRMP) for 2017-2020 and developing new Strategy on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management for the period 2023-2030.*

#### Planned:

**3 Policy and regulatory documents developed**

#### Deliverables reached in the reporting period:

Developed proposal of the PDNA methodology endorsed by the WG of the Government of Serbia, conducted Ex-Post Evaluation of the NDRMP Action Plan, and completed draft of the new Strategy on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management for the period 2023-2030.

**UNDP supported development of the policy framework in the DRR area in Serbia by developing PDNA methodology, conducting Ex-Post Evaluation of the NDRMP Action Plan, and drafting the new Strategy on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management for the period 2023-2030.**

**Status: Completed**

As a complementary process to the improvement of the National DRR System, the Action is supporting the development of policy and planning framework in the Civil Protection, DRR and Post-Disaster Recovery areas in the Republic of Serbia.

UNDP conducted independent **Ex-post evaluation of the Action Plan (AP) for National Disaster Risk Management Plan (NDRMP) for 2017-2020** by 15 February 2022 assessing the relevance, implementation system, effectiveness and efficiency, focusing on the design of AP for the following period, 2022-2026, and providing forecasts on impact and sustainability of planned actions. This evaluation contributed to the ex-post analysis for the new National Disaster Risk Reduction Strategy, which is a pre-requisite for its drafting.

Following prior approval of the CA, as of May 2022, UNDP has engaged two experts to support SEM in the development of the **new Strategy on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management for the period 2023-2030**. Engagement of the one of the experts is funded within the Action while UNDP provided complementary funding for engagement of the second one, UNDP also enabled the guidance and oversight of UNDP global experts in DRR and active participation of staff in the high-level workshops and working groups for the development of the Strategy. The experts supported SEM in developing Questionnaire for the Ex-ante Analysis to be used for data collection, and SEM immediately organised the first meeting of the Working Group on 18 April 2022 and laid out to the members the roadmap on the tasks of data collection and analysis for the needs of the Strategy and shared the Questionnaire. With expert support SEM conducted several iterations of bilateral consultations with the competent authorities members of the Working group (Ministry of Interior SEM, Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Water Management, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Human and Minority Rights, Ministry of Health, Environmental Protection Agency, etc.), first to improve the quality of the Questionnaire responses, the proposed layout of Ex-ante analysis and the content of the Strategy in the course of May and June 2022. Under the SEM guidance the UNDP experts prepared the Ex-ante Analysis Paper for the new Strategy on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management for the period 2022-2027 (with 12 accompanying Annexes) and Report on Conducted Ex-ante Analysis, in line with the Law on Planning System, and the Regulation on the Methodology of Public Policy Management, Policy and Regulatory Impact Assessment, and Content of Individual Public Policy Documents of the Public Policy Secretariat of the Republic of Serbia (the PPS Methodology) with special attention given to gender

mainstreaming in developing public policies, which was reviewed at the Working Group meeting 29-30 June 2022 in Vrdnik. Following bilateral inter-institutional consultation in the course of July and August 2022 the missing number of completed questionnaires arrived and SEM presented Final Ex-ante Analysis in the Work Group Workshop 8-9 September 2022 in Vrdnik, along with the proposal of elements of the Strategy and the Action Plan in agreement with the representatives of the Public Policy Secretariat. SEM developed the Draft of the Strategy and the Action Plan with prepared materials, goals, measures and activities presented in the WG Workshop 10 October 2022 in Belgrade. Following numerous meetings organised by SEM with the participation of UNDP experts and the representatives of the Public Policy Secretariat in the aim of improving the definition of content of the Strategy and Action Plan and precise definition of goals, measures and indicators, UNDP developed the Final Proposal Strategy on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management for the period 2023-2030 and Final Proposal of the Action Plan 14 December 2022, and submitted it to SEM to proceed with the Government adoption procedure in 2023.

In the process of development of the **new Post-Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) Methodology** of the Republic of Serbia, UNDP consultant in the course of reporting period developed specific procedures, manuals, instructions, and interpretations for damage assessment in local self-government units, instruction for usage of new and innovative technologies for damage assessment and field survey, guidelines for identifying and acquiring data of special importance for damage assessment, templates and content guidelines for damage assessment forms for conducting PDNA on local level and guidelines for identifying and engaging experts for damage assessment. The Inter-ministerial Work Group convened on two occasions in the reporting period, on 8 April and 10 June 2022, latter including only the representatives of ministries in charge of Environment, Energy, Telecommunications, and Construction. These meetings provided recommendations to expand the scope of the questions in the forms for collection of damage data and the questions to be broken down into more precise units and parts, and the visual concept of document to be adapted in such a way as to highlight the most important features. UNDP consultant incorporated all expressed Workgroup comments and suggestions for improvement received in due time and prepared the final proposal of the PDNA Methodology. Further bilateral fine tuning of the content is necessary with the Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia and the Ministry in charge of environment prior to initiating the process of the Government adoption in 2023. Once finalised the PDNA Methodology will have a fully-fledged sectorial approach in damage assessment, distribution of damages and losses, is aligned with the existing national regulatory framework, and applies the guidelines related to the VIM (Warsaw Mechanism), emphasizing the closer links between climate processes change and disaster. Upon adoption, UNDP in collaboration with MPI will incorporate PDNA section in local self-governments' training programme.

As an important milestone of the Action, UNDP in partnership with the SEM and the Faculty of Security Studies of the University of Belgrade, and with the support of the EU, organised a **two-day international conference in Belgrade: 'Disaster Risk Reduction – Models and Practices at International and National Level' on 13 and 14 October 2022**. The Conference gathered more than 55 prominent theorists, professors and researchers of universities, experts and competent authorities involved in public policies at the national, regional, and local level related to disaster risk reduction coming from Serbia (Sector of Emergency Management, Ministry of Interior, Ministry for Public Administration and Local Self-Government (MPALSG), Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Development (MoESTD), Republic Geodetic Authority, Public Water Management Company (PWMC) 'Srbijavode', National Institute for Public Health 'Batut', cities and municipalities, faculties, universities and civil society organisation), the region (North Macedonia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, and Albania), the EU (Poland, Greece, Croatia, Belgium, Czech Republic, Sweden, Denmark, and DG ECHO and EUD to Serbia), Switzerland, and international organisations (UNDP, WHO, FAO, World Bank) and Red Cross. The Conference raised considerable media attention and outreach successfully initiating an academic and professional discussion on the complexity of the effects of disasters, utilised relevant findings of the academic community and exchanged experiences with other countries, pointed out possible directions for further development of the disaster risk management societal and institutional mechanisms, and provided ideas and guidelines in making communities less vulnerable to emergencies and minimizing the material damage and the number of lives that may be put at risk due to floods, landslides, earthquakes, forest fires and other natural and man-made disasters. The Conference explored DRR through aspects of functioning of national and local DRR system, innovative

digital solutions, theoretical concepts and action framework, societal, economic and health dimension, interaction with environmental protection and climate change adaptation, and the local community resilience.

*The main conclusions from the Conference will be used to develop a monograph by October 2023 which would become a part of the regular curriculum of the Faculty of Security Studies in Belgrade improving the quality of education and sound understanding for generations of DRR professionals to come.*

### **Education Centre (Rudno) reconstructed (Op. 2.1) and (Op. 2.1.1) supplied with furniture and equipment**

*Related Activity: A2.1: Reconstruction and equipping of the Education Centre with in Rudno, City of Kraljevo*

**Despite numerous lasting administrative procedures and lengthy property rights resolution, UNDP successfully developed necessary technical documentation and completed the independent verification of the Design for Execution of Works. Pending Property Directorate approval for Pre-parcellation Design (expected by February 2023) and consequent issuance of the Building Permit (expected by April 2023). UNDP shall in parallel prepare tender for construction works to be contracted the moment of issuance of Building Permit.**

**Status: Steady progress**

The location of the Education Centre in Rudno is within the Golija nature park and is classified as natural heritage of special importance, therefore the process of issuing permits is rather slow, followed by complex procedures, and is entirely under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Construction, Transport and Infrastructure (MCTI). The City of Kraljevo in July 2022 adopted the General Regulation Plan (GRP) which was a prerequisite for resolving property and legal issues, forming a unified construction plot and continuance of the development of technical documentation. Following adoption of the planning document, the City of Kraljevo converted all the parcels within the construction plot into the building land and initiated the procedure of obtaining consent of the Property Directorate of the Republic of Serbia on creating one (unified) cadastre parcel. In the reporting period, UNDP obtained located conditions, finalised the Concept Design, which was approved by the Review Committee of the Ministry of Construction. In parallel UNDP completed the Design for Building Permit (DBP) and performed an Independent Technical Control. Following the MCTI approval of Conceptual Design (CD) and harmonising the CD and DBP, UNDP completed Design for Execution of Works (ED) with Bill of Quantity (BoQ) and estimate in the amount of EUR 880,000, and the ongoing independent verification of the Design will provide precise price of construction works.

Having the current market situation, UNDP, already in the development of DBP realised the investment value surpasses the funds envisaged in the Action for this activity and it would be necessary to allocate additional funds for the completion of initially envisaged facility or implement reconstruction in phases. UNDP shall present both options to the EU Delegation to agree on the scope of work.

Due to long lasting procedure of review and approval of the Pre-parcellation design by the Property Directorate of the Republic of Serbia, which is a pre-requisite for acquiring Building Permit and contracting works, the plan for the finalisation of technical documentation and tendering and implementation of works had to be revised, and the overview of revised dynamics of reconstruction of the Rudno education centre is provided in the table below.

Due to the status of the location and in the spirit of promoting preservation of natural heritage and resources nature preservation and use of renewables and reduction of energy consumption, the process of reconstruction shall include replacement of existing septic tank system with bio-disc filter sewage treatment system preventing further contamination of the soil, and natural and eco-friendly building materials. Improvement of training facilities and accompanying equipment and tools will enhance training opportunities on civil protection and disaster risk reduction will booster the preparedness of local civil protection units of general purposes across Serbia.

## Op. 2.2 Municipal servants and civil protection commissioners trained

*Related Activity: A2.2: Trainings for LSGs, civil protection units, NGOs and other stakeholders involved in civil protection*

**Planned:**

**900 local stakeholders trained;**

**Deliverables reached in the reporting period:**

National pool of 25 trainers equipped and certified in Civil Protection, DRR and Post-Disaster Recovery provided trainings to local level actors in 17 different LSGs across Serbia. E-learning modules on CP, DRR and PDR uploaded and tested in NAPA LMS available to public employees at national and local level. A total cumulative number of 1,126 local stakeholders trained exceeding the envisaged final target due to considerable interest amongst participants.

**UNDP delivered 30 three-day training in 17 different LSGs across Serbia and trained 1,126 local level actors involved in the areas of civil protection, DRR and post-disaster recovery coming from 91 LSGs achieving impressive territorial coverage of Serbia. A total of 26 trainings in 13 LSGs with 998 trainees are organised in the reporting period. Three e-learning modules on Civil Protection, Disaster Risk Reduction and Post-Disasters Recovery are available at National Academy for Public Administration [online learning platform](#) provide introduction to response and recovery for all civil servants, and be a knowledge refreshment to trainers and trainees in these areas.**

**Status: Completed**

Following the 4 trainings implemented in the previous reporting period, UNDP in cooperation with Ministry for Public Investment (MPI), former Public Investment Management Office (PIMO) and Ministry of Interior, Sector for Emergency Management (SEM) remained committed to continuously improving and updating training content and dynamics of local level training implementation. UNDP continued with the engagement of **Certified local level trainers** and selected experienced and National Academy for Public Administration (NAPA) certified **Trainers of Trainers** for the areas of Civil Protection (CP), Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Post-Disaster Recovery (PDR) in the

aim of supporting the pool of certified trainers in delivering training to local level actors on the specified topics. Please see **Annex 3 –Trainers of trainers and trainers for local level actors**.

Following the improvement of pandemic situation UNDP continued with the implementation of live training end of February 2022. In order to reduce costs of training organisation and maximise the effect and outreach of each training UNDP started organising two three-day training in parallel (with a day delay) in each of the hosting LSGs.

In the period 22 February – 16 December 2022, UNDP organised a total of 26 three-day training the areas of civil protection, DRR and post-disaster recovery in 13 hosting LSGs and trained 998 local level actors. With this the total number of trained responders reached 1,126 coming from 91 LSGs and 21 district of the Republic of Serbia and the Belgrade region, thus achieving impressive territorial coverage of capacity building activities and local level resilience.

In the reporting period UNDP implemented the following trainings at local level:

- **5<sup>th</sup>** from 22-24 February 2022, and **6<sup>th</sup>** from 23-25 February 2022 in Sombor with a total of **49 local level actors trained**;
- **7<sup>th</sup>** from 15-17 March, and **8<sup>th</sup>** from 16-18 March 2022 in Zrenjanin with a total of **50 trainees**;
- **9<sup>th</sup>** from 11-13 April, and **10<sup>th</sup>** from 12-14 April 2022 in Kraljevo with a total of **49 trainees**;
- **11<sup>th</sup>** from 26-28 April, and **12<sup>th</sup>** from 27-29 April 2022 in Valjevo with a total of **79 trainees**;
- **13<sup>th</sup>** from 9-11 May, and **14<sup>th</sup>** from 10-12 May 2022 in Banja Koviljaca (Loznica) with a total of **110 trained**, which was the highest attended couple of trainings so far;
- **15<sup>th</sup>** from 30 May – 1 June, and **16<sup>th</sup>** from 31 May – 2 June 2022 in Vranje with a total of **55 trained**;
- **17<sup>th</sup>** from 27-29 June and **18<sup>th</sup>** from 28-30 June 2022 in Priboj with a total of **66 trained**;
- **19<sup>th</sup>** from 13-15 September, and **20<sup>th</sup>** from 14-16 September 2022 in Uzice with a total of **45 trained**;
- **21<sup>st</sup>** from 26-28 September, and **22<sup>nd</sup>** from 27-29 September 2022 in Novi Sad making it the by far the top attended training/couple of trainings with a total of **152 trained**, bringing together all composition groups of participants at one place – LSG, district and autonomous province, public and private sector, association and CSOs.
- **23<sup>rd</sup>** from 18-20 October, and **24<sup>th</sup>** from 19-21 October 2022 in Nis with a total of **107 trained**;
- **25<sup>th</sup>** from 7-9 November, and **26<sup>th</sup>** from 8-10 November 2022 in Sabac with a total of **92 trained**;

- 27<sup>th</sup> from 15-17 November, and 28<sup>th</sup> from 16-18 November 2022 in Cacak with a total of **71 trained**; and
- 29<sup>th</sup> from 13-15 December and 30<sup>th</sup> from 14-16 December 2022 in Borsko jezero (Bor) with a total of **73 trained**.

Within organisation of the training UNDP encountered a number of 14 repeated trainees (participating in two trainings in different LSGs) (number excluded from the total number of trainees) from the total number of trained local level actors. Repeated trainees occurred due to leading an additional group of participants from their respective municipality to a training in the region or the desire to refresh their knowledge on certain topics due to lapse of time.

**This has signalled the need for further and continuous training at local level and also highlighted the importance of e-learning modules in NAPA, their availability and incremental updates in line with changes to regulatory, policy and best practice framework in the Republic of Serbia, EU, and worldwide.**

In regards of the composition of local level actors trained in the reporting period, the participants were mainly coming from:

- ✓ LSGs administration responsible for emergency management (both decision makers and local staff),
- ✓ Administration of the Autonomous province of Vojvodina and of respective districts in Serbia (both decision makers and administrative staff), as well as national institutions (Hydro-meteorological institute),
- ✓ Entities of the special concern for protection and rescue – Utility Companies, Public and Private Enterprises, Red Cross, Voluntary Fire Brigades, Associations and CSOs.
- ✓ Representatives of LSGs urban planning, communal and inspection services, health care and social welfare institutions, and
- ✓ Regional SEM units.

The trainees in all trainings responded the best to two exercises, simulation of the Emergency HQ the first day on Disaster Risk Reduction, and third day on post-disaster damage assessment exercise, where they could apply all knowledge gained and previous experience, interact with each other, with exercise leaders, and especially with training supervisors from the SEM and MPI allowing the participants to receive immediate answers to their question and doubts, and allow the national level to gain local level experience insight in the path forward in the improvement of the DRR policy and regulatory framework. As an added value to the existing training curricula and achieving greater synergy UNDP supplemented these trainings with **adaptation to climate change topics** by presenting international and national regulations and guidelines for more detailed defining the interlinks and dependencies between climate change and disasters, and the influence of altered climate factors – primarily temperature and precipitation. The Climate Change Adaptation training session specified which local level documentation should clearly recognise climate change impact on disasters for a quality disaster risk management planning at all decision levels, and presented the conclusions from the global climate conferences, especially following the November 2022 COP 27 held in Egypt which came to an agreement on the funding arrangements for responding to loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change.

In the reporting period, UNDP finalised, uploaded and tested all three **E-learning modules on Civil Protection (CP), DRR and Post-Disaster Recovery (PDR) in the NAPA learning management system (LMS)** making it available to all public administration employees at national and local level. 24 November 2022, NAPA sent info to all their registered users, more than 10,000 public servants and local administration employees, and published the info on training in all their social network, and UNDP on its social media platforms and [#EUzatebe platform](#). Each training module can be accessed at any time, their duration is not time-bound, consist of a learning video and accompanying training content (power point presentation with photo footage and a word narrative following video session), and a after a series of lessons covering one of the areas, there is a knowledge test. Each test quiz is very comprehensive and is designed to confirm the knowledge gained and basis for obtaining NAPA certification.

By the end of the reporting period the results of completion and certification in online learning modules are:

The aim of the online courses is to reach the maximum public administration employees, serve as an introduction to disaster risk reduction, response and recovery for civil servants and decision makers helping them implement risk reduction measures at local level, strengthen emergency response, build more resilient local communities, and explain the increasingly dynamic and complex impacts of climate change, but also assist trainers and local level session trainees as a unique knowledge refresher. Finally, UNDP and NAPA are together exploring the solution for making these online trainings available to local actors outside the public administration system, such as the health sector, education, cultural institutions, civil society organisations

and the general public due to the importance of these topics for all citizens of Serbia.

Training sessions at local level also raised considerable interest of the local authorities and the local media providing media coverage and obtaining statements from the representatives of UNDP, MPI and of the hosting LSG. Finally, the participants undoubtedly showed their appreciation for the training provided, the interaction with the leading public authorities, and the exchange of experiences and practices between LSGs and regions with similar set of disaster risks, and examples of good practice that may be replicated in their city and municipality. One of the invaluable aspects of this approach to local level training was certainly connecting people working on similar tasks and the creation of knowledge and experience network across Serbia.

*Training curricula remains a part of the General Programme for Professional Development of Local Self-Government Units, and the Ministry of Public Administration and Local Self-Government approved the Programme for 2023 on 29 December 2022, and through continuous content update by the responsible institutions – SEM and MPI – will achieve proper institutional sustainability under the auspices of NAPA.*

*Related Activity: A2.3: Training of trainers for selected highly experienced MRSS staff*

### Planned:

**11 highly experienced MRSS staff members trained to the level of instructor for the areas:**

- Helicopter Rescue trainings – 5 persons,
- Flood Rescue trainings – 4 persons,
- High Rope Rescue trainings – 2 persons.

**30 persons from MRSS for Rescue 3 Swift water and flood rescue technician trained.**

### Deliverables reached in the reporting period:

16 highly experienced MRSS staff members trained to the level of instructor:

- 6 for Helicopter Rescue,
- 6 for High Rope Gondola Evacuation,
- 4 for Water Rescue. Final Water rescue scheduled for February 2023.

14 MRSS rescuers trained for High Rope Gondola Evacuation (11 men, 3 women), and 10 for Water Rescue, with the participation of MRS of Sarajevo and Brcko, and Tara rangers.

Upon the normalisation conditions for travellers entering EU member states of the travel regime to the EU MS training countries, assuring safe stay and return, UNDP organised Helicopter Rescue training in Germany in April, High Rope Gondola Evacuation in Austria in August, and Water Rescue training in Croatia in November 2022. Due to the availability of Rescue 3 Europe Instructor Trainers the final Water Rescue training is scheduled for February 2023.

**Status: In the final phase of completion**

At the 4<sup>th</sup> SC meeting held 13 May 2022, the SC approved the MRSS proposal for replacing High-angle rescue training with Cable Car Evacuation Instructor Course rescue training for 6 MRSS rescuers to be held in Austria, an EU Member State, and to be performed on the same equipment used by MRSS in Serbia. In the reporting period UNDP has implemented 3 trainings for a total of 16 highly experienced MRSS staff members for helicopter rescue, high rope gondola evacuation and water rescue to the level of instructor:

**Helicopter Rescue Training course for Mountain Rescue Service Serbia staff, stage II**, for 5 MRSS staff realized **14-16 April 2022 in Germany** (Bad Tölz), consisting of theoretical and practical training course with the helicopter simulator (ECR 135 and Puma, most common helicopters used in the rescue activity), and with approach to rescue systems and procedures from inclined rugged terrain, vertical wall, buildings with various types of roof, chairlift and gondola, using equipment that the MRSS is equipped with and will use for the recovery of the injured – various rescue systems by multi-loop trolleys, the system Ciapin, the rescue triangle, the rescue bag, the Kong stretcher and the rescue net. By completion of the preparatory training in Romania in September 2021 and the subject training in Germany the 5 MRSS instruction received Diplomas of technician in rescue with aero support issued by the National Association of Mountain Rescuers from Romania (series No. GSS 101 - GSS 105/2022).

**Cable Car Evacuation Instructor Course** for 6 MRSS staff realized in the period **10-13 August 2022 in Austria** (mountain area Gargellen), consisting of theoretical part on the correct use of personal protective equipment (PPE), ascending and descending equipment, demonstration of Safe Stop 1 (SS1) device and cabin overpass, practical training on SS1 driving, overpass, descent and ascent at cabin, and final exercise in rescuing the figurants from the cable car cabin, followed by service, maintenance and annual inspection instructions, and course debriefing. Following the completion of the course, 6 MRSS staff received Cable Car Evacuation Certificates issued by IMMOOS GmbH.

**Water Rescue Training** for 3 MRSS staff due to its complexity and composition of a number of sub-modules and training chapters is delivered through several training courses (two implemented in the previous reporting period), out of which UNDP implemented in the reporting period the:

- 3<sup>rd</sup> module, Rescue 3 Swiftwater and Flood Rescue Technician Advanced – Water in the period **27-29 May 2022 in Croatia** (on rivers Cetina and Jadro near Omiš and Split), consisting of theoretical part (Rescue 3 philosophy, training standards, risk assessments, incident size-up, management and site control, weir risk assessment) and practical part (swift water swimming techniques, conditional rescues-talk, reach, throw, true rescues-tethered, hydraulic/weir rescues, tethered boats in high energy water, night/poor visibility operations, introduction to paddle boat handling in moving water, boat unwrapping, flips and rights, team/personal recovery into boat, knots and anchor systems, belay systems, tensioning systems and mechanical advantage, casualty care and packing, low angle stretcher attending, boat-based stretcher management, in-water stretcher management, introduction to search management, and search exercises), and
- 4<sup>th</sup> module, International Trauma Life Support (ITLS) Course in the period **1-2 October 2022 in Croatia (Fužine)**, consisting of theoretical part (airways and shock – assessment and management, head, Neck and spine, chest and abdominal, and injuries of extremities), and practical part (workshops on airways, helmets, immobilization of the spine, vacuum mattress, KED, collar, immobilization of limbs, and extraction from the vehicle). MRSS staff successfully completed and passed written and practical part and received ITLS licences.



Contractor are in the requested quality and reflect the needs of the beneficiaries in a user-friendly manner. UNDP successfully finalised the last two phases in developing the Register software:

- Phase 3: Development and testing, and
- Phase 4: System deployment, training and warranty support.

Contractor provided 1<sup>st</sup> version of the DRR System and presented it in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Working group for the development of the Register 28 February 2022 organised by SEM. This meeting also served as an official kick-off for all data acquisition activities for the already initiated work of expert-operation teams of the national institutions data holders on the basis of defined priority risks and corresponding data sets, ensuring data acquisition and incorporation in the Disaster Risk Register in the previous reporting period.

In the period February – July 2022, UNDP rendered data acquisition support for harmonising and transforming existing data records into standardized inputs and developing metadata for the Register for:

- PWMC 'Srbijavode' – a team of 8 flood data acquisition consultants engaged by UNDP collected, updated and harmonised data on flood areas, developed inputs for Operational flood defence plans for second-order waters model of quality preparation of, updated geospatial and alphanumeric data and developed metadata for all facilities/geospatial data managed by PWMC 'Srbijavode'.
- **Geodetic Survey of Serbia (GSS) – a team of 8 landslides data acquisition** consultants engaged by UNDP, assessed and collected landslide data, scanned engineering geological maps, and digitalised and uploaded data on landslide risks in the Cadastre of landslides and unstable slopes of the Republic of Serbia database through the ArcMap GeolISS application.
- State Enterprises for Forest Management (SEFM) 'Srbijasume' – a team of 2 forest fires data acquisition consultants engaged by UNDP collected and updated data on forest fires related risks and geological data from the records of the SEFM 'Srbijasume'.
- Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Water Management (MAFWM) – **Forest Directorate** – a team of 2 wildfire data acquisition consultants engaged by UNDP collected, updated and provided data on wildfires related risks data from the records of the MAFWM – Forest Directorate, including the forests governed by the Public Company 'Vojvodinasume', owned by the Serbian Orthodox Church, and National parks (Tara, Kopaonik, Fruška Gora and Djerdap).

SEM organised the 3<sup>rd</sup> Working group for the development of the Register on 19 April 2022 to present the status of the development of the Register to the CA/EUD and UNDP high representatives, and the Contractor in cooperation with RGA started with training of relevant institutions staff on the use of Register as of 20 April 2022. Contractor successfully finalised the DRR Software and in cooperation with relevant institutions data holders uploaded data acquired on landslides, earthquakes, wildfires, floods, climate change data, and infrastructure damage assessment, with user acceptance test conducted 28 July 2022.

UNDP completed official handover of the DRR Software to RGA on 30 August 2022 which included source code, administrating credential, technical documentation (approved plans, deployed tools, system specifications, progress reports, deployed testing, training material and training report) and Contractor's warranty guarantee of technical support until 11 August 2023.


**The first day of the International DRR Conference 13-14 October 2022 was the kick-off date for the Register** from which it is also available to general public, in which this innovative and unique tool for managing

risks, mitigating hazards, responding to disasters in Serbia, and risk-informed decision making raised considerable interest of the public and the media.

The Register is functioning as a **subsystem of national geospatial data infrastructure system (GeoSerbia)** as an interactive and interoperable information system aligned with the EU INSPIRE Directive and the EU Initiative to Enhance Data Interoperability, is connected with existing DRIS/DRRIP, and holds georeferenced data on associated risks in the territory of the Republic of Serbia down to a micro-location, vulnerability and exposure of population and infrastructure, history of past disasters with risk descriptions, and capacities in place in LSGs to manage risk reduction and emergency response. The Register is able to **provide information, DRR analytics and reports** to the National DRR System institutions and associated services, depending on their role and access level, for urgent field response and the implementation of risk reduction measures, but also to inform the general public on the risk associated with concrete location of their interest when selecting place for their investment or considering preventive measures. The Register shall foster the cross-border, regional and international cooperation in crisis between national systems and regional and international organisations and give incentive to data sharing amongst administrations, agencies and private sector.

### 3. Beneficiaries/affiliated entities and other Cooperation

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#### Cooperation and Partnership

There is an excellent relationship and strong cooperation established with the state authorities, at national and local level, and this is crucial in mitigating implementation risks, and facilitating addressing the needs of the beneficiaries in the changing circumstances throughout the implementation of the Action.

Partnership with the **Ministry of Interior, Sector for Emergency Management (MoI/SEM)** is based on technical guidance related to procurement and delivery of vehicles and equipment and involves direct contact between UNDP designated staff and engaged specialised consultants with the departments of the SEM whose subsidiaries have been end recipient of the procured assets. Related to the reconstruction of SEM facility the coordination has been operationalised through an established cooperation and mechanism of regular meetings between the EUD, SEM, UNDP and contracted designer. Related to the development of the Disaster Risk Register, SEM chairs the Disaster Risk Register Working Group tasked to establish the Disaster Risk Register by defining priority risks and corresponding data sets, ensuring data acquisition and integration in the Register, and assure its continuous enhancement, upgrade and risk data update.

EU and UNDP supported the development of the new Strategy on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management for the period 2023-2030 and an accompanying Action Plan for the implementation of the Strategy through engagement of two experts and participating in high-level workshops and working groups for the development of the Strategy, and cooperating with the **United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR)** and the **Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE)**. Namely, once completed UNDRR will assess the level of Strategy alignment with the priorities of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction. OSCE supported the Strategy development process through engaging methodology expert training the members of the GoS Working Group on the requirements for developing strategic documents in accordance with the provision of the Law on the Planning System and accompanying methodology defined by the Public Policy Secretariat of the Republic of Serbia (the PPS Methodology).

UNDP participating in the Disaster Risk Register Working Group both at operational and high-level also established cooperation and strong partnership with the member institutions and organisations data holders (SEM, MPI, Republic Geodetic Authority (RGA), Geological Survey of Serbia (GSS), Public Water Management Company (PWMC) 'Srbijavode', Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Water Management, Republic Water Directorate (RWD), Ministry of Mining and Energy, Seismological Survey of Serbia). SEM is a crucial partner in designing and implementation of training activities and developing accompanying guidelines and handbooks, and therefore is playing important role in all consultations, preparatory workshops, design, rollout and entire implementation of the training component.

**Ministry for Public Investment (MPI, former Public Investment Management Office of the Government of Serbia – PIMO)** acts as the main facilitator of the Action components targeting local level capacities but also in gaining political support at national level, being the institution responsible for public investment in local and national infrastructure, as well as by its expertise and lead role in support related to DRR and recovery processes. A strong partnership between UNDP and MPI is established through frequent and continuous direct consultations by exploiting synergetic effects and avoiding overlaps with other ongoing assistance, liaising with the national and local level authorities in facilitating their response, as well as being a key partner in the design and implementation of local level training component.

As of 2014 devastating floods, UNDP has supported, based on different modalities, the forming of 4 basin cooperation of local self-governments which share same or similar group of hazards in order to jointly plan their preventive and disaster risk reduction (DRR) measures and emergency response in a holistic and a synergetic manner, thus enabling resource sharing and an integrated reaction to disasters. The largest support has been focused on the **West Morava Basin Cooperation (WMBC)** which serves as an example of best practice in Serbia, and in the region. In these endeavours UNDP has established strong partnership with **Standing Conference of Towns and Municipalities (SCTM)** through their functional networks in the areas

of civil protection and DRR, and the PIMO as the lead governmental counterpart in these areas but also in disaster recovery and harmonisation with the Sendai framework and UN/EU standards. Through this continuous support more legal possibilities have sprung to establish a more coherent and formalised inter-municipal cooperation leading to a WMBC agreement and the establishment of a joint service for the whole West Morava basin in Krusevac. The partnership with the municipalities of the WMBC at national level is coordinated in cooperation between UNDP and MPI, and at local level UNDP has established cooperation twofold. One is in direct contact with the focal point from the municipality being responsible for the tasks of civil protection (political level appointees or civil servants). The other is through the Civil Protection Department of Kraljevo, being the coordinator of the WMBC joint actions. This partnership mechanism is functioning well and has greatly contributed to adequate acceptance, storing and maintenance of procured assets at local level, preparation of infrastructure related activities and participative development of quality training material and handbooks. The SCTM civil protection network coordination mechanism achieved increased engagement of local actors in the initial phase.

The cooperation and partnerships UNDP has established through this Action, as well as through previous and other linked endeavours have created an incentive for future similar cooperation, primarily related to civil protection and disaster risk reduction, such as the **Drina River Basin Cooperation (DRBC)**.

The Action supported the establishment of Disaster Risk Register as an interactive and interoperable system aligned with the EU INSPIRE Directive and the EU Initiative to Enhance Data Interoperability, in whose development the UNDP built upon the results of the World Bank funded project ‘**Scaling Up Resilient Infrastructure**’ which proposed business and technical architecture. The same WB project prepared technical specifications and procured hardware components, thus leaving the space the Action to focus on quality software development and enhanced data acquisition. Also, complementarity of the Action with the project ‘**Designed efficient emergency support system 112 for the Republic of Serbia**’ is being ensured through established communications with the project team implementing the 112 Project from defining the Risk Register outline and all phases of its development. Crucial partnership in the pioneering endeavour of establishing the Disaster Risk Register and its further update, enhancement and upgrade, UNDP achieved with the Republic Geodetic Authority (RGA) through established cooperation and mechanism of regular meetings between UNDP, SEM, RGA, other national stakeholders and the Contractor.

The established Risk Register contains risk data on landslides, earthquakes, wildfires, floods, climate change data and infrastructure damage assessment, as well as through connection with DRIS data on potential risks at the local level, including the existing Municipal Disaster Risk Assessments and SEM endorsed Rescue and Protection Plans. The LSGs updates DRIS on a regular basis with newly adopted protection assessments and plans, building upon the basis of documents entered by MPI and produced within the Government of Japan funded training programme. The Register contains Damage Assessment data interlinked with DESINVENTAR Geoportal and the development of Damage Assessment Reports requires a rather complex methodological approach aligned with PDNA (EU, UNDP and the World Bank Post Disaster Needs Assessment Guidelines) and an effective horizontal and vertical coordination. Therefore, the Government of Serbia has established the inter-ministerial Working Group tasked to develop the Damage Assessment Methodology. The UNDP Crisis Bureau and DRR Unit funded the initial development of the Methodology implemented by UNDP Serbia, and the Action supported the drafting of the general methodological approach, sector specific guidelines, and manuals, procedures, forms and templates for implementation of the Methodology in Serbia, at national and local level.

The new intervention ‘**EU for Enabling a More Responsive Healthcare System**’ financed by IPA funds for the year 2021 shall start in February 2023 and will build upon the results of the Action, particularly the National Disaster Risk Register information system and data on natural hazards, and upgrade it to include public health risks. In the preparation of this new intervention UNDP and the World Health Organization (WHO) established a strong partnership with the Ministry of Health (MoH) and the National Institute of Public Health of Serbia (NIPH) “Dr Milan Jovanović Batut”, including them from the preparatory phase of



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the intervention in the established mechanisms of managing and updating the Register and cooperation with SEM and MPI.

In order to achieve synergy with the ongoing project '**Advancing medium and long-term adaptation planning in the Republic of Serbia – NAP**' project funded by Green Climate Fund (GCF) and implemented by UNDP, in partnership with the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Water Management the Climate Change Adaptation (CCA), the Action coupled the curricula developed within this project with the local level training curricula (Activity 2.2) in order to enhance the training scope with related topics. The two projects are cooperating on their progress in order to interlink and streamline training related outputs. Additionally, while preparing PDNA methodology for Serbia the Action took into account the Ecological Damage and Climate Change Impact Assessment developed within the CCA project, and the results of the **PDNA rollout II project** "Strengthening Capacities for Post Disaster Needs Assessment And Recovery Preparedness" funded by UNDP Istanbul Regional Hub related to specific guidelines/annexes concerning critical infrastructure damage assessment – citizen homes and apartments, public facilities and hard infrastructure (roads, bridges, water objects, etc.) for each hazard – flood, earthquake, hail, and storm, as well as the Guideline for Agricultural Post Disaster Needs Assessment at Municipal level in Serbia developed in cooperation with FAO. Also, in the period 20-22 June 2022 in Belgrade, UNDP organised a 3-day workshop on the application of the use and application of the PDNA and Disaster Recovery Framework (DRF) methodology and approach within the "Disaster Preparedness and Prevention Initiative for South-Eastern Europe" (DPPI SEE), aiming to strengthen recovery capacity in the region of Europe and Central Asia and to support the implementation of DPPI SEE Strategic Development Plan 2021-2025 in context of enhancing its Disaster Management Training Program and its Analytical component by establishing a pool of experts from DPPI SEE member countries and thus ensure long term sustainability through their support to in-country trainings and capacity-building in DPPI SEE member states and strengthen recovery capacity in the region.

As part of the IPA 2019 funded action 'EU for civil protection and disaster resilience strengthening' the **FAO** is implementing a component related to support to institutional and local capacity in agriculture sector for enhancing resilience to climate change and introduction of **Climate Smart Agriculture (CSA)**. As this intervention entitles coordination between sectors, stakeholders, organizations, and institutions, it will build upon the coordination and collaboration mechanisms developed and DRR networks established within the Action, thus improving engagement of LSGs and raising the interest of farmers and their readiness to participate in demonstration of CSA practices and application of DRR in the agriculture sector, consequently creating ownership and commitment from national and local stakeholders for joint CSA action. Also, the lessons learned within the Action in creation of training curricula will lead to a set of well formulated training courses. Finally, the Action will consult the FAO in identifying and designing thematic areas to be promoted in awareness raising campaigns to achieve maximum synergetic effect.

UNDP is as of December 2022 implementing the project '**EU for the Green Agenda in Serbia – Get Started, Take Action, Scale Up**' financed from the funds of IPA 2020, supporting Serbia in implementing Green Agenda for the Western Balkans through encouraging "green" transformation of the economy and society. UNDP is implementing this 4-year EU initiative with total worth EUR 8 million in cooperation with Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA), the European Investment Bank (EIB) and the Government of Switzerland. The Project aims to set high environmental standards to improve environment and quality of life, boost business investments and innovation, bringing EU experiences and expertise, and create an inclusive dialogue and broad participation of different parts of society on concrete solutions to improve water, waste management and air quality. This is especially important also due to the Serbia EU accession process and the opening of Cluster 4 on the Green Agenda and Sustainable Connectivity in December 2021. An integral part Chapter 27 on the Environment and Climate Change of Cluster 4 is risk management, the core subject of intervention of the Action.

As of November 2022, until March 2023, UNDP is implementing the '**Mapping of confluences of second-order water streams on selected micro-location in Drina River Basin, Republic of Serbia**', project



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financed by the UNDP Crisis Bureau, in cooperation with the Public Water Management Company “Srbijavode”, Faculty of Geography of the University of Belgrade, and Drina River Basin Cooperation of municipalities. The project will identify suitable micro-locations in the Drina River Basin for setting up the Early Warning System (EWS) the second order water sources, develop guidelines for its establishment, technical specification for data acquisition and measuring devices, and system specifications for the data acquisition, distribution and early warning software, all in the aim of ensuring wide dissemination of this knowledge product and its replication across and among river basins.

On 24 November 2022, NAPA sent info on the availability of abovementioned E-learning modules to all their registered users, more than 10,000 public servants and local administration employees, and published the info on training in all their social network, and UNDP on its social media platforms and [#EUzatebe platform](#). On 13-14 October 2022, UNDP in partnership with the SEM and the Faculty of Security Studies of the University of Belgrade, and with the support of the EU, organised a **two-day international conference in Belgrade: ‘Disaster Risk Reduction – Models and Practices at International and National Level’**. The Conference gathered more than 55 panellists from Serbia, region and Europe. and had over 100 participants each day. The Conference gathered prominent theorists and experts dealing with research, study, and practical work, and institutions and organisation involved in public policies at the national, regional, and local level related to disaster risk reduction disasters in its various aspects and had impressive media attention and outreach through Adria Media Group print, online text, media outlet broadcasts and reports, as well as through their social media network, and EUD and UNDP website and social media platforms. The Head of Operations in the EU Delegation to Serbia, Sakelaris Hourdas, the Assistant to the Minister of the Interior and Chief of the Emergency Management Sector, Luka Čaušić, UNDP Deputy Resident Representative in Serbia, Mr.

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### III Minutes

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#### Agenda Item 1: Opening Remarks

**Ms. Jelena Maric Lukovic, UNDP Project Manager**, opened the meeting and presented the Agenda to the participants of the 4<sup>th</sup> Steering Committee Meeting. After introduction, she gave the floor to UNDP Deputy Resident Representative and Head of Section, Operation III, of the Delegation of the EU in Serbia.

**Mr. Anas Fayyad Qarman, UNDP Deputy Resident Representative** greeted the Steering Committee (SC) members and meeting participants on behalf of the UNDP Country Team. He mentioned different project's activities and their importance for all citizens and Government of the Republic of Serbia with special emphasis on UNDP efforts to support the SEM regarding the identification of the location of their building, and the Disaster Risk Register, a tool designed for strategic and operational level for risk informed decision making. Mr. Qarman pointed out the two tracks this project has been developing, through creating synergies with other projects and the work at the policy level. This is reflected in integrating climate related issues targeted by the Green Agenda and Green Financing project in the Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) training, the engagement of Civic Society Organisations (CSOs) and schools besides Local Self-Governments (LSGs) and national partners, and finally the activities critical to policy work being the development of new Post-Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) methodology, and conducting ex-post analysis of the National Disaster Risk Management Programme (NDRMP) Action Plan (AP). Finally, Mr. Qarman thanked the EU and all national partners for their trust and support during the implementation.

On behalf of the EU Delegation, **Mr. Sakellaris Hourdas, Head of Section, Operation III**, mentioned that the last couple of years have been difficult with the pandemic and natural disasters. The EU Delegation welcomes Serbia as a member of the European Union Civil Protection Mechanism (EU CPM) and thanks Serbia for its response during the pandemic. As well notes that Serbia provided solidarity support through the EU CPM in Greece during the huge fires of 2021 by sending firefighters, and using the vehicles that were procured within this project. Reflecting on the process of adopting the EU acquis and the negotiation Chapter 27, he added the project is providing the necessary elements needed in this regard – in particular the Disaster Risk Register and the National DRR Strategy. On this point, he thanked the national partners and UNDP for undertaking this massive endeavour. He concluded by mentioning the EU plans to continue funding future DRR actions in Serbia. For this to happen, Mr Hourdas said the actions should be implemented in the manner they are programmed, to respect the agreement made by various government stakeholders, Ministry of European Integration (MEI) and the European Commission, and he is looking forward to hearing updates on infrastructure activities within the project.

#### Agenda Item 2: Overview of the project results and the way forward

**Mr. Vladimir Lazovic, UNDP Project Coordinator**, provided a brief overview of the project and its components, the recap of previously completed activities and their achieved results:

- Realised 15 air freights and delivered 721 tons of medical equipment and supplies – by May 2020,



- Delivered 12 ambulances, 2 decontamination vehicles, and 75 encapsulated suits with self-breathing apparatus to front line responders in Novi Sad, Belgrade, Kragujevac, and Niš – by October 2020,
- Delivered 27 forest fires' vehicles with UHPS pumps to SEM – May 2021,
- Delivered 600 metres of mobile flood defence system to the West Morava Basin, located in Kraljevo and Čačak, and delivered 900 sets of uniforms to civil protection commissioners – December 2020 – January 2021, and
- Delivered MRSS vehicles (2 off-road vehicles, a Minivan 8+1, and a snowmobile), stretchers, technical and safety equipment, and durable uniforms – by May 2021.

He continued with a detailed presentation of results and ongoing activities and their progress achieved in the period after the 3<sup>rd</sup> Steering Committee:

- Activity 2.2: Training of local level actors on civil protection and DRR,
- Activity 2.7: Establishment of the Disaster Risk Register,
- Activity 2.1: Reconstruction and equipping of the Education Centre with a training ground in Rudno, and
- Activity 1.1: Reconstruction and equipping of the SEM Headquarters Building.

#### Activity 2.2: Training of local level actors on civil protection and DRR

The activity of local level actors training achieved the following results: 25 trainers in DRR, Civil Protection (CP) and Post-Disaster Recovery (PDR) equipped and certified for delivering training, 470 local level actors trained, e-learning content developed, new PDNA methodology drafted, conducted Ex-Post Evaluation of the NDRMP Action Plan, and rendered support to SEM for development of the National DRR Strategy.

**Ms. Sandra Nedeljkovic, PIMO Deputy Director**, stated that the Report of the Ex-post NDRMP Action Plan (2017-2020) shall be in Government adoption procedure by end May 2022. She pointed out this evaluation report will have info on the situation in the country and what has been done in the DRR area in the period 2014-2020 and will provide inputs for Ex-ante analysis for the new National DRR Strategy. The NDRMP shall be put out of force along with the Government adoption of the evaluation report to give floor to the new DRR Strategy, since all the policy related to disaster risk management falls under jurisdiction of SEM, while PIMO has the mandate in the post-disaster recovery.

**Mr. Zivko Babovic, Head of the Risk Management and Civil Protection Directorate**, greeted the participants as the Deputy Chairman of the DRR Strategy Development Working Group. He explained this Working Group is convened by the Minister of Interior and consists of national stakeholders involved in the DRR system in the Republic of Serbia, and thanked UNDP for providing support to SEM in engaging two esteemed experts for the development of the Strategy. Survey of the system is out already, and SEM received feedback from the national partners on their level of participation in the DRR system, shortcomings, skills, to have all necessary information to devise the text of the document. He announced that on Monday, 16 May, in a smaller working group they will assess whether they have all the elements for conducting Ex-ante analysis, and SEM could schedule the main workshop for harmonising the preliminary text of the document and defining strategic goals. He added SEM is applying the new methodology of the Republic of Serbia Public Policy Secretariat which is slowing down the work a bit due to complex procedure which they fully abide.

#### Activity 2.3: Advance rescue trainings of the Mountain Rescue Service Staff



To date, a total of five (5) highly experienced MRSS staff received Helicopter Rescue Technician Certificates in April 2022. In parallel, three (3) rescuers completed Rescue 3 Basic Swift Water Rescue Technician Training in November 2021, in Croatia, with the remaining water rescue training to be completed in the period May-December 2022.

As the MRSS proposed replacing High-angle rescue training with Cable Car Evacuation Instructor Course rescue training for 6 rescuers, **Ms. Jelena Maric Lukovic** obtained the approval of the Steering Committees for this change. The training is planned in an EU MS (Austria) and will be performed on the same equipment used by MRSS in Serbia. She added these trainings for MRSS not only raise the response capacities of MRSS but put them in place of the key voluntary organisation in Serbia.

### Activity 2.7: Establishment of the Disaster Risk Register

**Ms. Jelena Maric Lukovic** stressed the importance of this activity and the role of UNDP in facilitating and supporting the Government in this process. The Register is defined mandatory by the law and by-laws defining its content and relations between national authorities – hosted by the RGA, the SEM responsible for data acquisition, managing content and work of the Work Group for Developing the Register (WG), and of course the PIMO which kick-started the entire process of developing the Register. Last year UNDP signed the contract with the most successful bidder which will by end July 2022 finish deployment of the system, testing, transferring to final beneficiaries, and training of end users for its use. UNDP with EU support provided technical support for harmonising records on landslides, floods, fires, wildfires and records on rehabilitated facilities with RGA meta-catalogue. UNDP also performed upgrade of the Disaster Risk Information System (DRIS) previously developed within the SDC and World Bank projects, by adding new functionalities and linking it with the Register.

**Mr. Zivko Babovic** pointed out SEM efforts in organising WGs, with Mr. Avignon present at the last meeting, as well as the data acquisition process which is already providing data on floods, landslides and wildfires, and this final database of the Register will be completed by end June 2022. He is very proud Serbia will get a unique tool for DRR and response activities which will enable overview of risks and hazards in each and every particular location in its territory.

**Mr. Darko Vucetic, Assistant Director of the Republic Geodetic Authority**, explained the results of the project related to the implementation of INSPIRE directive in the Republic of Serbia and the format and role of the GeoSrbija portal (National Spatial Data Infrastructure) and provided an overview of the architecture of the Register. He continued with the test version of the Register, presenting the layers and the content of the basic data (cadastre data, public infrastructure networks, investments, protected areas and cultural heritage, etc.) accompanied with specific risk and hazard related data (chronological and georeferenced). He noted this platform can also make measurement and integrate regional and data of EU platforms, specifically INSPIRE geoportal, but the most important aspect is the analytics function providing analytical tools for SEM and other actors to assess risk prone areas and facilities in danger of a specific hazard. The RGA plans to integrate the results of the upcoming georeferenced census to an already existing very detailed data on the citizens. He concluded that with a sound software basis like this any future integration of additional external datasets or crowdsourcing data is made very easy. In response to a question from EUD (Mr. Hourdas) on integration of Kopernikus





data Mr. Vucetic added that due to standardisation in distribution of data any integration in the Register is feasible and layers are easy to import and finally presented an example of this.

**Mr. Zivko Babovic** in response to a question from EUD (Mr. Hourdas) on Ministry of Construction, Transport and Infrastructure (MCTI) access to the Register data during spatial planning, the SEM and the RGA shall communicate with MCTI for them to apply these services. Mr. Babovic added that following the completion of the first phase, the SEM will involve MCTI data, with reflections of Mr. Vucetic that the existing E-plan information system is able to use risk related data from the Register.

**Ms. Sandra Nedeljkovic** pointed out the benefits of use of the Register for the citizens by allowing them to observe risks by typing desired cadastre lot number which will enable sustainable development, protection of their investment, and safety. She reminded the Register also contains data on the recovery, along with the flood flows of 2014.

On the issue of the regular data update, **Mr. Darko Vucetic**, explained the update is linked with the production of data and is in the mandate of data owners. He also pointed out the Register is an integrative platform joining all data related to DRR and resilience, as well as the possibility of presenting risk forecasts.

**Mr. Zarko Petrovic** expressed gratitude to the EU for recognizing this activity as crucial, and to all actors involved in the endeavour of establishing Disaster Risk Register from the scratch – the previous EUD colleagues M. Vogel and Mr. Afentoulidis, Mr. Vucetic and the RGA for integration and upgrade of previous endeavours into this project, Mr. Babovic and the SEM for their efforts in leading the interinstitutional cooperation and coordination process, and Ms. Nedeljkovic and PIMO for spear heading the idea into a reality. He also noted the potential of presenting the Register to the Cabinet of the Prime Minister and including risk informed investment in the capital investment project planning.

**Ms. Jelena Maric Lukovic** concluded with the intention of devising the communication plan for promotion of the Register both to decision makers and the citizens.

#### Activity 2.1: Reconstruction and equipping of the Education Centre with a training ground in Rudno

**Ms. Jelena Maric Lukovic** reiterated on the complexity of the reconstruction located in the Nature Park Golija and the lasting administrative procedure of approving spatial and planning documentation. The Preliminary Design is with the MCTI Review Committee and should be approved shortly. UNDP will finalise the Design for Building Permit by May 20<sup>th</sup> and shall submit it to the Technical Control Process.

Adoption of the General Regulation Plan is the main precondition for obtaining the building permit, which is an even more complex process initiated by the City of Kraljevo back in 2013. Hopefully by end June 2022, MCTI will approve General Regulation Plan to be adopted by the City of Kraljevo Assembly, thus creating all pre-conditions for issuing building permit – expected August/September 2022 – followed by tendering for works for reconstruction and upgrade.

As the market prices of construction and material have gone up, UNDP would appreciate the Contracting Authority (CA) advise whether to consider partial reconstruction of just the training facilities, oppose to the completing accommodation capacities, which UNDP deems important for





sustainability. The Preliminary Design BoQ, imply necessity of reallocation of an additional 200-300,000 EUR for completion of the entire facility.

**Ms. Sandra Nedeljkovic** added there is an informal info from the MCTI we may expect their positive reply on the General Regulation Plan the coming Monday, 16 May 2022.

**Mr. Sakellaris Hourdas** underlined the EUD understands that the estimated value of construction is needed for budgeting, but additional fluctuations of market prices, and the new practice imposing short deadlines for purchase of material, might also influence the budget decision.

**Ms. Jelena Maric Lukovic stated UNDP will address the SC and CA to advise on the scope of reconstruction** including possible reallocation of funds, following completion of the Design for Execution and the verification of the detailed BoQ by the independent verification company with +/- 5% error margin, and stated the time lapse between the verified BoQ and initiation of tendering process would be somewhere between 2-3 weeks. By this, fluctuations will not influence prices in momentum of tender. Still, different scenarios are possible, and we will all observe the market till then and adapt.

#### Activity 1.1: Reconstruction and equipping of the SEM Headquarters Building

**Mr. Ivan Baras, Assistant to the Head of Sector for Emergency Management,** greeted the assembly on behalf of Luka Causic, the Head of Sector for Emergency Management, and thanked the EUD, UNDP and its engineering team, as well as SEM colleagues for their efforts in resolving inadequate seat of the SEM which is still one of the main priorities. He said the SEM undertook measures from the last SC in including the development of technical documentation (TD) in public procurements, procuring the Building Permit and Executive Design within the period of 150 days, and identifying and securing the funds for the construction. In Q4 of 2021 the Urban Development Design and Concept Design for Fire station New Belgrade and SEM HQ complex in Djordja Stanojevic Street. Even though we have met the pre-conditions for the construction of the building, we have to take into account the situation concerning available budgetary funds which may be dedicated for Ministry of Interior (Mol) co-financing. Due to complex procedure in obtaining necessary consent and approvals, as well as deadline set by UNDP and EUD for completion of technical documentation and signing of financing agreement for June 2022, the Mol/SEM is of stand it is most suitable to reallocate dedicated Project funds in the total amount of EUR 1.5 million towards other priority needs of SEM for resilience and response. This way we would avoid the unwanted risk of endangering the implementation of the Project and successful completion of its activities within the defined deadlines. With this we propose to reallocate the funds for procurement of specialised firefighting and rescue vehicles in line with SEM priorities. The overall analysis of needs and market research lead to the conclusion the current priority is procurement of 9 firefighting tank trucks which would greatly contribute to efficient response in preservation of human lives, assets and environment. After 2017 the SEM realised, through various capital projects, procurement of different types of specialised firefighting vehicles, of which 44 tank trucks. This remains insufficient for adequate response in emergencies, especially considering the average lifespan of existing tank trucks is very high and over 80 of them are put out of use due to malfunction and non-cost-effectiveness of their repair. Firefighting tank trucks with accompanying equipment volume of 7,000 litres are a necessary vehicle for assisting in combatting wildfires and fires in urban settlements, which since 2017 occurred 159,334 times. Subject vehicles with their technical characteristics significantly reduce risks of fire spread on the surrounding buildings and areas and





contribute to containing and extinguishing fires. The very equipment placed in these type of vehicles enables adequate application of tactical-technical performance in fire extinguishing actions. This was particularly visible in engagement of firefighters in combatting wildfires in Serbia and in the region. Experiences of 2021 in assisting extinguishing wildfires in Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia, and Greece, SEM plans to further improve capacities to provide future assistance via EU CPM. SEM plans to intensify cooperation with EU as in the implementation of future project as well as in practice. The need for a larger number of tank trucks is also emphasized during the wildfires field firefighting vehicles response in inaccessible terrains. 27 firefighting vehicles procured within this IPA Project with proper fire extinguishing equipment proven very effective in response and bringing material support. In 2021 an increase of 14,674 wildfire occurrence is recorded, especially in terrains unreachable for upgraded firefighting trucks, the subject vehicles enabled provision of men, equipment and supplies to desired locations. In practice, there is a need for a larger amount of water in shorter period, which will be mitigated by availability of appropriate number of tank trucks for refilling the field response vehicles. Mr. Baras finally reiterated the request for reallocation of funds from the building towards the procurement of fire trucks, and the need for conducting procurement ASAP. SEM prepared spec, and this would achieve great EU visibility in Serbia and in the region. He concluded that SEM plans to continue with the construction of HQ but within the available budget of the MoI and within the future capital projects.

**Mr. Sakellaris Hourdas** reminded the Committee that the building was a need of the MoI expressed via MEI, with approval from the European Commission (EC), formally noted in the IPA 2019 Action Document and part of the financial agreement between Republic of Serbia and the EC. The first result of the project is the construction of the SEM building, and EU considers it is a central intervention, since this was an explicit request of the Republic of Serbia to include this activity in the programme. With this in mind, Mr Hourdas expressed his disappointment to hear MoI/SEM update to cancel this investment. As per request for reallocation of funds, he has no mandate to reply immediately since this request requires the amendment of the Action Document and Financing Agreement already signed between the Republic of Serbia and the EC. EUD would need an official and detailed Explanatory note from MoI/SEM side on this issue. Mr. Hourdas asked if the reason for this is the timeline, when does MoI expects the building to be funded solely with national funds, and added that as of October 2021, when the SC agreed to switch the location of SEM premises, the EUD still hasn't received status update on the progress. He also added that if SEM requires more time to continue using EU funds for this activity as initially planned, this has to be discussed between UNDP and EUD, and we would like to receive new time schedule of specific activities regarding the building. Finally, if the reason is increase of market prices, Mr. Hourdas proposed if it may be beneficial to postpone this activity for 6 more months to ease the effects of the crisis.

**Ms. Natasa Neskovic, SEM, Head of Department for Economic and Material and Technical Support,** provided a brief recap of the location situation from the initially planned location in Jovana Avakumovic, through property issues of the location in Omladinskih Brigada, to the opting for a complex with the Firefighting Station New Belgrade. She noted the Concept Design and Urban Design is completed for the complex November 2021, and that the Firefighting Station is already completed and opened in March 2022. She thanked the UNDP in investing a lot of energy in exploring and supporting the preparation of TD concerning all these abovementioned locations. She stated SEM is responsible for preparation of TD till Design for Execution, but had no possibility to budget this in 2021, missing the window of opportunity before the fluctuation of prices. SEM agreed budget and procurement plan in January 2022 and launched tendering for TD preparation. All proposals from





designers with signed framework agreement with SEM offered 150-210 days for completion, i.e. 6 months as of March – till September 2022. She underlined this created uncertainty the deadline of UNDP/EUD set for June 2022 for submitting the Design for Execution and signing the Financing Agreement with UNDP, which implies secured funds in the MoI budget, could not be met. The current situation with recession and Ukrainian crisis influenced the existing MoI budget and available funds, hence SEM concluded they can't confirm the commitment of co-financing funds with no definite information on the cost of works and material.

**Mr. Sakellaris Hourdas** thanked Ms. Neskovic for the explanation and requested SEM to send an Explanatory Note with all details to MEI and EUD, but also asked SEM to provide an alternative option of reconsidering the continuation of the construction within the Project after a period of 6 months, noting that the actual end of project date could be extended.

**Mr. Antoine Avignon, EUD Programme Manager**, noted the market prices of the construction material will remain high, and by their nature are not very flexible downwards. He added EUD is open to consider all options since they not only need resolution of the SEM building issues, but also regarding other infrastructural projects the EU is planning to fund in Serbia. Finally, he asked SEM to propose further steps and two types of analysis on this issue: construction of the SEM HQ building and an alternative proposal.

**Ms. Natasa Neskovic** said the MoI budget can be known only the beginning of 2023, and that UNDP informed SEM that after tendering, the construction will take up at least one year, meaning the construction should start latest in the fall of 2022. However, the MoI/SEM is not in a position to confirm co-financing before January 2023. She then explained the timeline for the annual SEM budget for 2023. First the needs are identified in August and September, compiled by the Ministry of Finance, followed by Government adoption of the budget for all ministries in December 2022, concluding with the process of dedicating budget to administrations and units within the MoI in January 2023. She concluded the part of funds dedicated to SEM depends on other priority and crisis related needs of the MoI.

**Mr. Sakellaris Hourdas** noted that emergency situations can bring extraordinary solutions, and we should keep discussing our future partnership and reach a mutual agreement. MoI should be strategically oriented and be an accountable partner of the EUD. Other issues are being discussed with other ministries, and this one is only a part of the puzzle. He suggested the EUD will wait for the Explanatory Note the SEM should send to MEI and EUD.

### Visibility of the project

Since previous Steering Committee, UNDP organized Official award of certificates for 25 trainers in NAPA, 8 November 2021, with big media attention and great outreach.

Besides the engagement of local communities, our trainers are very proud on their involvement in the Project and raised considerable attention of local media thus bringing greater visibility of EU at local level. In all municipalities hosting trainings (Novi Pazar, Krusevac, Kragujevac, Belgrade, Sombor, Zrenjanin, Kraljevo, Valjevo and Loznica) UNDP promoted EU support to DRR system in Serbia and continuous efforts in increasing awareness on resilience.





The upcoming events planned in 2022 are:

- the Conference on DRR and Emergency Management in Belgrade, October 2022
- Ground-breaking ceremony in Rudno, end of 2022

#### Way forward:

- UNDP shall organize the 5<sup>th</sup> Steering Committee to be held in September/October 2022.
- SEM will submit the Explanatory Note on SEM HQ building as elaborated above to EUD and MEI.
- SEM will liaise with Security Faculty for organizing the Conference on DRR and Emergency Management in Belgrade, October 2022 and inform UNDP about the agenda and list of potential participants in May 2022.
- UNDP expects the completion of technical documentation for Rudno Training Centre by August/September 2022. UNDP will facilitate development and signing of the MoU between the cities of Krusevac and Kraljevo, UNDP, PIMO and SEM and on their mutual engagement, usage, and operational and maintenance costs. The MoU should be in place prior launching the procurement procedure in October 2022.
- UNDP expects to finalise Local level training on Protection, DRR and Post-Disaster Recovery by November 2022 and train at least 900 local stakeholders.
- UNDP will complete the development of the Disaster Risk Register by end of June 2022. By the end date software will be operational, users trained, and data stored. Training for data users envisaged in June 2022, with extending these trainings to local level.
- With the expert support of UNDP, SEM shall finalise the Proposal of the National DRR Strategy with an accompanying Action Plan and submit it for Government adoption by October 2022. PIMO shall finalise the Serbian PDNA Methodology and submit it for Government adoption by end 2022.
- UNDP shall submit the Interim report February 2022 – January 2023 by end February 2023.

The meeting was closed at 15.30 hrs.

#### Key points of the meeting:

- **Overall Project implementation** progress assessed as very good, especially related to completed emergency clause activation, procurement of equipment and uniforms, and ongoing implementation of local level training activities and development of the Disaster Risk Register, with pending issues related to infrastructure components. Next SC meeting tentatively September/October 2022.
- **Local level training** activity progressing rather well. 25 trainers in DRR, equipped and certified for delivering training to local level actors. UNDP, with support of SEM and PIMO, provided training to 470 stakeholders. E-learning modules on Civil Protection and DRR placed in NAPA LMS, with finalisation of Post-Disaster Recovery module postproduction. Drafted new Serbian PDNA methodology, conducted Ex-Post Evaluation of the NDRMP Action Plan, and rendered support to SEM for development of the National DRR Strategy.



- 5 highly experienced **MRSS staff** received Helicopter Rescue Technician Certificates (April 2022), and 3 completed Rescue 3 Basic Swift Water Rescue Technician Training (November 2021), with the remaining advanced water rescue, trauma life support and instructor course training to complete in the period May-December 2022.
- Support in technical supervision of development of the **Disaster Risk Register** rendered. By July 2022 the Register system shall be deployed, tested and transferred to final beneficiaries, and end users trained for its use. Data acquisition support rendered to PWMC 'Srbijavode', Geodetic Survey of Serbia, and SEM/MAFWM Forest Directorate.
- Preliminary Design and Feasibility Study for the **Rudno Training Centre**, Kraljevo in the review committee of the Ministry of Construction (MCTI), and should submit for a building permit end of June 2022, pending on the MCTI approval and adoption of the General Regulation Plan by the Kraljevo Assembly. Expected completion of the Design for Execution of Works is August/September 2022 and the start of construction works in the Q4 of 2022. The Conceptual Design is in the final review by the MCTI committee which will enable submitting. The General Regulation Plan is needed for obtaining the building permit, which is an even more complex process initiated by the City of Kraljevo
- For the **SEM HQ building** in Djordja Stanojevic, the Urban Development Design adopted, and Location conditions issued in November 2021. SEM requested to abandon the activity of constructing HQ building and reallocated the funds for procurement of 9 firefighting tank trucks on the account of unknown MoI/SEM co-financing situation, fluctuation of market prices, budgetary shortcomings and time constraints. SEM should send an Explanatory Note to MEI and EUD in this regard, but also provide an alternative option of reconsidering the continuation of the construction within the Project after a period of 6 months. The EUD shall consult internally to raise this issue to the highest political level and come to a mutual solution.
- **Visibility of the EU** clearly represented through visual identity of the project, branding, media coverage, due mention, and verbal acknowledgment, with on high-level visibility event in 2021 which raised big media attention and had a great outreach, as well as significant attention of local media in the course of implementation of local level training component.
- **Next steps** include the 5<sup>th</sup> Steering Committee to be held September/October 2022, Conference on DRR and Emergency Management to be held in Belgrade in October 2022, the completion of technical documentation for Rudno Training Centre, finalisation of local level training on Civil Protection, DRR and Post-Disaster Recovery, and operational Disaster Risk Register with stored data and end users trained, finalisation and adoption of the DRR Strategy and Serbian PDNA Methodology, and finally the submission of the Interim report February 2022 – January 2023.

Dear Minister,

I would like to follow up to your letter, which points out the legal and financial obstacles to the achievement of result one of the above-mentioned IPA 2019 Action, namely the rehabilitation of the central building for the Sector for Emergency Management (SEM).

I acknowledge that circumstances emerged during implementation of the project implemented by UNDP have objectively affected the feasibility of this specific activity, expanding its initial scope and increasing costs beyond the support made available by the EU.

The solutions proposed in your letter, corresponding to those presented at the 4<sup>th</sup> project Steering Committee, were discussed in a recent meeting with the Minister of Internal Affairs, and followed up at technical level by representatives of the SEM, UNDP and the Head of Cooperation of the EU Delegation.

I would like to clarify that the proposal of increasing the budget under the project with UNDP is not viable for the following reasons: a) information concerning the costs and financing of the new building are not sufficiently detailed, therefore the project is not adequately mature, and b) no additional resources are available under the ongoing IPA programmes.

Therefore, in order to ensure sound financial management, I would agree with you to cancel this activity and redirect the resulting funds toward the needs identified by SEM, namely the purchasing of vehicles to increase capacities of the fire and rescue units.


## EU FOR SERBIA RESILIENT TO DISASTERS

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### Evaluation of Local Level Training

After the completion of training of employees and subjects of special importance in Local self-government units, an online survey of participants was conducted on the quality of training. A total of 328 participants took part in the survey which makes a representative sample of nearly 30% of the total number of trainees in the local level training. The survey consists of 27 questions – 4 questions related to demographic data on participants and 23 questions referring to training quality assessment, remarks, and suggestions.

The participants come from 91 different local self-government units, i.e. 21 district of the Republic of Serbia and the Belgrade region. More than two thirds of the participants are employed in municipal and city administrations, state institutions and legal entities that are subjects of special importance.



As many as **37 percent** of the participants perform the **tasks of managing an organizational unit**, which makes training in disaster risk reduction, emergency situations management and reconstruction after natural and other disasters of high importance for their job description.


On the question **has the training met their expectations** to grade on a scale from 1 to 5, the participants responses give an **average score of 4.69**, hence we may conclude the training met expectations of the majority of participants.

On the question to **rank their knowledge on the subject before** attending the training on a scale from 1 to 10 the **average score is 6.56**, so we may conclude that although most of the participants are working in the areas covered in the training, there was room for improvement of their knowledge prior to the trainings.

On the question to evaluate the **quality of lecturers' presentation and ability to convey the content on a scale 1-5** all trainers received positive feedback and a grade 5 in over 50% cases, which is an impressive result and evidence of improvement and perfecting of trainers throughout the local level training campaign.

During the training, trainers provided the participants with materials necessary for specific topic – lecture or exercise. At the end of the training, participants received certificates of completion and all training material in a flash disk. The participants evaluate the **quality and usefulness of received materials on a scale from 1 to 5 and the average score is 4.66**, therefore we may conclude that the participants are highly satisfied with the materials provided.

Throughout the training, the trainers and trainers of trainers are facilitating the engagement and the discussion by the participants to obtain feedback on their learning progress and foster exchange of insights and experience about the thematic units covered. The participants evaluated the **quality of achieved discussion** on a scale from 1 to 10 and the **average score is 8.75**, so we may conclude that the participants are mostly satisfied with the quality and level of discussion they were engaged.




On the question whether they consider they have been **actively participating in the discussion** during the training on a scale 1-5 as many as **85 percent** of the participants observe themselves as an active part in the discussions. The **remaining 15 percent** of participants as one of the **most common reasons for their inactivity** in discussion state either their insufficient knowledge of the subject or exceptional clarity and completeness of the lecture, leaving no open questions.


On the question of ranking the **knowledge received** in training that will help them do their jobs better on a scale 1 to 5 the **average score is 4.35**, and we may conclude the design and the content of the training suits the needs of job tasks posed to most of the participants, and they consider knowledge gained during training as valuable for doing their jobs.

The participant deemed the training has **innovated and completed their knowledge and skills** highly satisfactory – on a scale from 1 to 5 the **average score is 4.34**.

On the question to **rank their knowledge gained in the training** on a scale from 1 to 10 the **average score is 8.54**, which suggest the effects of training as **30% increase** in the knowledge and eventually self-confidence of trainees performing in the areas covered by the training (knowledge on the subject prior to training average score was 6.56).




The participants consider the topics **during trainings are clearly and thoroughly covered** – as many as **90 percent** of the participants stated that after the training, there was not a single topic that they did not fully understand. Within the remaining 10 percent of the participants which felt lack of understanding for certain topics identified financing and legislation, which was somewhat expected due to complex nature of these topics.



More than a third participants (**38 percent**) expressed their **readiness to learn more** and perfect themselves in the training areas – DRR, Civil Protection and Recovery process, which is a positive signal to consider redesigning and continuance of local level training activities. Besides elaboration of specific topics in the abovementioned areas, such as risk assessment, reconstruction after a natural disaster and evacuation, the **topic of interest that stands out**


**is climate change**, more precisely measures of adaptation to climate change, as a hot topic in having the increased dynamics of climate conditions alteration and frequency of natural disasters.

As the **novelty of importance for their work**, the participants mainly highlighted regulatory framework – legal texts, procedures and structures of the national and local system for DRR, emergency management and reconstruction following natural and other disasters. Other answers concerned the way the crisis council works, the formation of civil protection units and crisis communication.




On the question whether the **knowledge gained in training can be applied in performing the duties of their workplace** (1. fully believe, 2. Partially yes, 3. Partially no, and 4. Not possible in my job tasks) more than a half of the participants (**54%**) stated they the knowledge they gained can be applied in their workplace, while 34 percent believe it is partly possible with 4 percent don't believe they can apply gained knowledge, and 9 percent of participants do not perform tasks in which knowledge would be applicable.

However, when asked on the **intentions to apply said knowledge in their jobs, almost three quarters of participants (73%)** expressed their clear intention to do so completely, 10 percent was not certain, and 17 percent do not perform work tasks in which it would be possible.



On the willingness to attend the training in these thematic area with a more detailed content, **the absolute majority of 88 percent of the participant gave the affirmative answer**, with only 12 percent with no desire to pursue further their knowledge and skill in these areas, which almost exactly correlates with the figures of relation between jobs and tasks and application of gained knowledge.

When asked to **evaluate the overall quality of the training** on a scale from 1 to 10, the participants graded the training with a **very high average score of 9.12**. Therefore, we can conclude that the participants were highly satisfied with the overall quality of the curricula, trainer's performance, and organization of training.



The aspects of training the participants **enjoyed the most** are the **simulation exercise, practical teaching and interactive training tools**.

Even though most participants stated that there weren't any aspects of the training they **disliked**, they still emphasized **theoretical lectures on legal framework** which they found to be monotonous.

Finally, as **comments and suggestions for improving** the content of the programme or training implementation the participants praised both the programme itself and the lecturers, but the following stand out as the most common:

- improve lectures by introducing **more details, practical experience, and more simulations and interactive exercises**, which participants found most interesting, and
- urged for training in these areas to **be held more often, even on an annual basis**, to preserve local communities' preparedness and response.
