Deliverable Description

Overview:

The First Quarter witnessed a significant development for the Cairo Center for Conflict Resolution and Peacekeeping in Africa. In accordance with a longstanding recommendation by the project board, CCCPA was re-chartered as "The Cairo International Centre for Conflict Resolution, Peacekeeping and Peacebuilding" under the suzerainty of the Egyptian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Prime Ministerial Decree (no. 1396/2017) issued on 13 June 2017, re-establishes the center as a public agency. With the new legal status the centre will have a board of directors headed by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, as the Center's main executive organ, comprising high-level officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Interior

and Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, as well as scholars and subject-matter experts. The high level international advisory board will continue to give strategic guidance on the work of the centre.

With its new mandate, CCCPA's geographical coverage will be extended globally. However, the Center will continue to focus on Africa and the Arab World. It also expands the Center's thematic focus to cover all peace and security-related issues, not only issues of conflict prevention, conflict resolution, peacekeeping and peacebuilding, already covered. The decree also expands CCCPA's ability to partner with national, regional and

international actors in peace and security.

During this quarter, CCCPA hosted the 13th Annual General Meeting of the Integrated Disarmament, Demobilization and Reintegration Training Group (IDDRTG), from 22 to 24 May 2017. The meeting marked the beginning of CCCPA's chairmanship of the IDDRTG for the year 2017/2018. During this meeting, CCCPA's program on Preventing Radicalization and Extremism Leading to Terrorism (PRELT) was discussed as a potential area of collaboration, especially with the rise of armed groups with an extremist ideological background. CCCPA proposed an initiative with the support of UNDPKO/OROLSI that aims at exploring potential for cross fertilization of DDR, Community Violence Reduction (CVR) and PRELT as tools of peacebuilding by means of developing national and regional capacities to focus on the complementarities between them.

A delegation from CCCPA attended the First Women, Peace and Security Focal Point Network meeting (WPS), held in Alicante, Spain, from 26-27 April 2017. The conference brought together the WPS focal points to share insights, best practices, and lessons learned in the implementation of the WPS agenda, especially enhancing women's contribution to conflict prevention and resolution.

CCCPA also attended the "Regional Forum on Preventing Violent Extremism in MENA: Effective Narratives and Messaging", from 4-5 May 2017 in Tunisia. The meeting brought together representatives from multilateral regional organizations and governments to discuss best practices and strengthen networks and practices related to this issue. CCCPA's PRELT program was discussed at length.

In line with its mandate to building African Capacities, CCCPA attended the Consultative workshop between the AU Continental Early Warning System (CEWS) and Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), in Addis Ababa from 18-19 May 2017. The attendees discussed the recent updates on the security situation in Africa, and Mainstreaming Gender and Youth in early warning systems.

Moreover, CCCPA attended the NATO-PTEC Working Group Meeting, held from 19-23 June 2017, in Almaty, Kazakhstan. The members discussed the opportunities of increasing cooperation between the PTECs, enhancing PTEC regional cooperation in order to better serve NATO, as well as improving cooperation with the UN.

Training Courses

CCCPA has provided two trainings for Egyptian Peacekeepers prior to their deployment to various peacekeeping missions. Topics on human rights, the mandate of the peacekeeping mission, gender issues and how to prevent sexual exploitation and abuse, among other topics, were covered during the trainings. A total number of 529 Egyptian peacekeepers have been trained during this quarter.

A training dedicated to Mainstreaming Gender in Peacebuilding was held during this quarter. A total number of 22 participants attended from various African countries.

Background

The Egyptian Ministry of Foreign Affairs established the Cairo Center for Conflict Resolution and Peacekeeping in Africa in 1994, in line with Egypt's sense of responsibility towards achieving peace and security in Africa, including building African capacities. In recognition of its contribution to African peace and security, the Center is now among a few centers on the continent recognized by the AU as 'Centers of Excellence in Training in Peacekeeping'.

Despite African countries' best efforts, and that of the international community at large, not only has conflict unabatedly continued, but it has grown in scope and complexity. Moreover, the nature of conflict in Africa continues to drastically evolve, with interstate conflicts giving way to intrastate ones, which in turn had been spilling over international borders to challenge peace and security in other regions. The rise of extremism and fanaticism, precipitated by the absence of a counter-narrative from the Islamic world, presents Africa and the world with a clear and present danger.

In 2017, according to the Prime Ministerial Decree (no. 1396/2017) issued on 13 June 2017, CCCPA was rechartered as a Public authority "The Cairo International Centre for Conflict Resolution, Peacekeeping and Peacebuilding" under the suzerainty of the Egyptian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

CCCPA has been supported by UNDP projects funded by the Government of Japan, with the aim of strengthening its institutional capacity and providing various partners in the region with trainings to build capacities in peacebuilding and peacekeeping, border management and crisis management. Based on the achievements made and lessons learnt so far, the program aims to enhance the capacities of national and regional actors in the areas of border management, peacekeeping and peacebuilding, preventing recruitment for terrorism, economic governance and management of natural resources, to ensure they have the necessary skills and knowledge for appropriate and timely responses to incidents that threaten peace and stability.

As outlined in the Project's document, the expected outputs are:

- (i) Support to TICAD Activities.
- (ii) Enhancing African Local capacities for preventing radicalization and extremism leading to terrorism.
- (iii) Enhancing African capacities in Peacekeeping.
- (iv) Enhancing African capacities in Conflict Prevention and resolution, crisis management and peacebuilding.
- (v) Enhancing African capacities in dealing with cross-border challenges: Organized Crimes, combating illicit flow of small arms and light weapons, and combating human trafficking and smuggling of migrants.
- (vi) Project Management Unit.

This report presents the main activities of the Project during the period from 1 April to 30 June 2017.

The discussion in the conference focused on three issues: structural barriers to the implementation of the women, peace and security (WPS) agenda, the role of civil society in advancing the WPS agenda, and the link between the Preventing Violent Extremism (PVE) agenda and the WPS agenda. The aim of the conference was to bring together the WPS focal points to share insights, best practices, and lessons learned in the implementation of the WPS agenda.

CCCPA attended the" Regional Forum on Preventing Violent Extremism in MENA: Effective Narratives and Messaging", from 4-5 May 2017, in Tunisia. The meeting brought together participants from multilateral regional organizations, governments and civil society to share experiences and best practices and strengthen networks and practices in this front. They also discussed how to reframe the narrative debate through the development of evidence-based recommendations on effective communication strategies, messaging and counter narratives in PVE. In this context, CCCPA presented its work on PRELT that was well received by the audience who expressed their interest to know more about it and cooperate with CCCPA.






