II. Purpose

1. Main Objectives of the Project: (as per the approved UNDP Country Programme Document and Country Programme Action Plan and/or Project Document)

UNDP has committed to contribute to the disaster risk management and climate change adaptation in Lao PDR. The Country Programme Document (CPD) 2012- 2015 includes strengthening capacities of government and vulnerable communities to effectively respond to emergencies adapt to climate change and prepare for disasters as one of the priority areas. This project, targeting the CPD goal, is built upon the past achievements and lessons learnt specially the "Institutional Strengthening and capacity Development on Disaster Risk Management in Lao PDR 2010 – 2011" project and the recommendations from the Joint Damage, Losses and Needs Assessment of Typhoon Haima August 2011. The duration of this project is four years (2012 -2015) in line with UNDAF and UNDP programming cycle.

The project will focus on the effective disaster management and recovery system in the Typhoon Haima affected provinces as well as strengthening DRM at the national level.

The main objective of the project is to strengthen disaster risk management system, linking with effective recovery and Climate Change Adaptation through a multi-sectoral and multi-hazard approach at all levels (national, provincial, district and village)

In order to achieve this objective, the project committed to deliver the following result as the CPD output: "Government and vulnerable communities can more effectively respond to emergencies, adapt to changing climate and prepare for disasters". This will be achieved by developing provincial, district and community disaster management planning, strengthen information management system, selected community based early warning system, strengthening coordination and information exchange among selected communities, districts and provinces with central authorities.

III. PROJECT PERFORMANCE AND RESULTS

Project Management Team within MoNRE was set up in May 2013. The project has started in June 2013. There were completed AWP 2013, Q3 Work Plan and Procurement Plan, Input AWP in UNDP ATLAS system, Establish Project Board in August 2013, Recruited Project Support Team (APM and Accountant), revision of results and Resources Framework, interviewed and selected Technical Advisor (UNV). However, some activites could not be conducted this year, and have been shifted to be implemented in year 2014, it is due to a delayed with having the Project Teachnical Advisor and the consultants that could not be recruited this year which it has led to some delayes with implementation of planned activities.

Output 1: Institutional and Legal capacities at national and sub national levels strengthened for effective disaster risk management.

A detailed capacity needs assessment to determine appropriate delivery structures and identify existing services to build on has not yet been implemented during this year due to the National Institutional Capacity Needs consultant could not be found this year. Therefore, a detailed capacity assessment is shifted to be implemented during Q1-2014.

Draft Disaster Risk Management and Climate Change Law of Lao PDR that also ensures integration of gender issues in the DRM system will be started in 2014.

Output 2: Disaster preparedness and response system strengthened to; coordinate, manage information, identify and assess risks and warn at risk communities.

Planed establish Disaster Management Information System (DMIS) at national and Provincial Levels has been postponed to start in Q1-2014. This activity will be leaded by Information Management (IM) Consultant and Database expert. It is expected that IM and Database experts will start work in March 2014. The project and develop communication and information the communication equipments had been ordered. The communication equipments are expected to be delivered to the project office in January 2014.

Planed activities on Develop Standard Operations Procedures for effective communication and

information management have not been implemented this year. However, to implement the project and develop communication and information the communication equipments had been ordered. The communication equipments are expected to be delivered to the project office in January 2014. For the server will be installed by Database Expert and Info Mntg expert.

The introductory meeting and site visit was organized in Xayabouly province in Q4-2013. It was to introduce the project to the target institutes, and inspect the pre-selected districts and collect some useful information and site visit in Sayabouly province.

Early Warning System in 2 target Provinces (Sayabouly and Xiengkhouang) and at least 2 districts of each target province will be established in 2014.

Output 3: Communities are better prepared for Disasters Preparedness and Climate Change Adaptation with special focus on Gender and Social inclusion (2 communities in each selected district of 2 target provinces).

There were no planned activities under output 3 this year. The activities under this out put will be implemented in the year 2014 and leaded by Project Technical Advisor (TA). TA is expected to be on board in February 2014.

Output 4: Monitoring and Evaluation of Project.

Inception Workshop and Seminar on "Integrated Disaster and Climate Risk Management Project in Lao PDR" was organized on the 7th and 8th of October 2013 at National Convention Center, Vientiane, Lao PDR. It was being chaired by Dr. Akhom Tounalom, Vice Minister of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MoNRE) and Ms. Kyoko Yokosuka, Deputy Resident Representative of UNDP. Government officials and development partners working in the field of disaster management and climate change were attended. The Inception workshop and seminar was very successful. The participants had learn and discussed the key component of the project as well as improved the understanding more on the disaster and risk management in Lao PDR and regional.

Moreover, the annual work plan for 2014 was developed to ensure the overall direction of the project implementation towards achieving the project targets.

However, some activites could not be conducted this year, and have been shifted to be implemented in year 2014, it is due to a delayed with having the key resource persons like a Project Teachnical Advisor and the consultants that could not be recruited this year which it has led to some delayes with implementation of planned activities.

A detailed capacity needs assessment to determine appropriate delivery structures and identify existing services to build on has not yet been implemented, due to the National Institutional Capacity Needs consultant could not be found this year. Therefore, a detailed capacity assessment is shifted to be implemented during Q1-2014.

Draft Disaster Risk Management and Climate Change Law of Lao PDR that also ensures integration of gender issues in the DRM system will be also started to develop in 2014.

Planed establish Disaster Management Information System (DMIS) at national and Provincial Levels has been postponed to start in Q1-2014. This activity will be leaded by Information Management (IM) Consultant and Database expert. It is expected that IM and Database experts will start work in March 2014. And to implement the project and develop communication and information the communication equipments had been ordered. The communication equipments are expected to be delivered to the project office in January 2014.

Gender sensitive Community Based Hazard, Vulnerability and Risk Assessment and mapping of the selected communities of target provinces has not yet implemented in this year. It will be implemented in the year 2014 and leaded by a Project Technical Advisor (TA) which is expected to be getting on board during Q1 2014.

The inception workshop and seminar was organized in Q4 this year. It was successful and received the good outcomes. Moreover, the annual work plan for 2014 was developed to ensure the overall direction of the project implementation towards achieving the project targets. And it was already approved to be implemented for year 2014 by Project Implementation Team and UNDP
