Justification of the substantive extension: This project is an extension of the ongoing SFD-UNDP project number 0004915 that started in 2008 until 2012 and is governed by the same rules and regulations of this agreement. The extension is for 2-years (2013-2014) and is based on the recommendations of independent evaluation conducted in 2011. It increases the budget by USD 89,310,186.29 and provides support to further strengthen the capacities of SFD with regards to the following outputs:

- 1. Enhanced SFD's institutional and operational efficiency
- 2. Improved planning, Monitoring and Evaluating for Development results
- 3. Increased access to improved financial and non-financial services for MSEs
- 4. Methodology and Business processes of human and community development interventions improved, and became more sustainable and aligned with the local environment

2013 Target: (targets are to be distributed equally among the four quarters of the year)

- Disburse an aggregate of 1500 M L.E. to small enterprises and create around 136.000 jobs by the Small Enterprises Development Group
- Disburse an aggregate of 630 M L.E microenterprises and create around 138,000 jobs by the Central Sector for Micro Finance
- Approach existing and new donors to maintain, increase and diversify the financial resources of SFD
