The National Regulatory Authority for the UXO/Mine Action Sector in Lao PDR (NRA) has an improved capacity to:

(i) provide policy guidance, coordinate and regulate all activities in the UXO sector (ii) plan and establish appropriate priorities for clearance and other activities that are consistent with Government directives, humanitarian and development considerations (iii) assess and accredit operators (iv) monitor and evaluate activities and ensure that activities undertaken by operators meet national standards (v) provide timely and substantive reports to Government and donors (vi) maintain open and transparent financial and other records and to remain fully accountable for all funds received (vii) to engage and cooperate with other relevant actors in other sectors, and (viii) to maintain open and effective communication with all stakeholders.

OUTPUT 2: UXO Lao is better able to manage clearance and risk education programmes for the needs of communities at risk.

The Lao National Unexploded Ordnance Programme (UXO Lao) has an improved capacity to:

(i) effectively and efficiently deliver clearance and risk education programmes wherever it is active in the country (ii) carry out activities that are consistent with national priorities established for the sector (iii) ensure all programme activities meet national standards (iv) coordinate with other operators active in Lao PDR (v) report on progress and remain transparent and fully accountable for financial and technical resources, and (vi) maintain open and effective communication with all statkeholders.

Substantive Revision Justification

According to the signed project document, the project will be ending 31 December 2015. During project Board on 18th of March 2015 board members found that it would be advisable to extend the current project for another year, not least due to the years 2015-2016 being critical for the UXO sector. This extension provides an opportunity to adequately take into account the findings for the two evaluations planned for mid-year 2015, namely the Independent Evaluation Office (IEO) impact evaluation of decicated to "UNDP support to countries on Mine Action", of which Lao PDR is one of the case studies, and the evaluation of the current UXO project in Lao PDR, an evaluation initiated by UNDP Lao PDR and its Development Partners. This extension also gives the UNDP and its implementing partners, NRA and UXO Lao, sufficient time to develop a new project from 2017 with clear linkages to the new 8th National Socio-Economic Development Plan (NSEDP). It also ensures that the new UXO project is informed by the design of a new Lao PDR-UN Partnership Framework 2017-2021, which will replace the current UN Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF), as well as by UNDP's new Country Programme Document (CPD).

Situational Update

Lao PDR has 9 highly UXO affected provinces, and communities living in and around UXO contamination are the beneficiaries for all UXO activities. As the size and number of confirmed hazardous areas in these provinces is being determined through the new concept of operations for Non-Technical Survey and Technical Survey, a much better indication of both the size of the UXO problem and number of beneficiaries will to be clarified as the new concept of operations continues to be implemented in 2015, 2016 and 2017.

There remains a large number of stakeholders in the UXO sector in Lao PDR, these include the Government of Lao PDR and the various Ministries that are reliant on the release of land (through either survey or clearance) as the precursor for development activities, the Development Partners (those who provide resources through the UNDP Managed Trust Fund, bilaterally funded to the Government of Lao, or the direct funding of UXO operations), UXO operators (in all pillars), and the beneficiaries.

The UXO system is managed and coordinated by the NRA. UXO Lao in addition to INGOs and commercial companies are the main implementing agencies. Commercial companies conduct UXO operations in support of requests and payment. UXO Lao and the INGOs conduct UXO operations in support of the national development plans. The NRA ensures that all operations are accredited (licensed for work) and all operations are conducted according to National Standards.

For all activities, no matter where or how the resources are channeled, the NRA is the Government institution that is responsible for the management, coordination and quality of all UXO operations (survey, clearance, RE, VA, treaty obligation). UXO Lao remains the largest UXO clearance organisation and works in all 9 heavily contaminated Provinces, and is the medium term national UXO clearance capacity for in Lao PDR. "The Support for the institutional Strengthening of the National Regulatory of the UXO/Mine Action Sector (NRA) and the Lao National UXO Programme (UXO Lao)" provides the majority of support for these two institutions.
