UNDAF/CPD Outcomes:

- **Peace Outcome:** By 2022, government and non-governmental institutions demonstrate improved transparency, accountability, delivery of justice and promotion of peace and security.
- **People Sub-outcome:** By 2022, people in PNG, especially the most marginalized and vulnerable have enhanced and sustained utilization of quality and equitable services, food security and social protection."

Brief Description

The Government of Papua New Guinea enacted a national state of emergency on 23 March 2020 in response to the global COVID-19 pandemic and detection of the first in-country case. Government has begun to implement preparedness measures together with UN agencies to establish triage and isolation facilities, testing regimes, case management protocols and community outreach to limit the spread of the virus. Considering the weak health system with capacity and resource constraints, it is highly unlikely that these measures would provide adequate response in the event of a major outbreak of COVID-19 in Papua New Guinea. With decline in Government revenue as a result of falling commodity prices, the most immediate and hardest hit have been those that address gender-based, family and sexual violence.

The Government partners have requested UNDP to support in strengthening gender-based violence measures. This comes amid increasing recognition of the impacts that any likely COVID-19 outbreak will mean for Papua New Guinea and the crisis it presents for victims and survivors of gender-based violence. UNDP's intervention to support the Government of PNG in this response is to:

- a. Assist the police to continue gender-based violence prevention and response actions.
- b. Provide operational support to maintain safe houses and safe accommodation for victims of violence and their families.
- c. Drive enhanced community outreach on gender-based violence and its prevention within the COVID-19 response amongst members of the National Parliament and their constituencies that promotes leadership, dialogue and accountability.
