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Turkey-UNDP Partnership in Development Phase II Quarterly Country Updates Q3, 2021

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Introduction:

This report provides the quarterly updates on the projects, with remaining activities for third quarter of 2021. As the project activities in Angola, Benin, Laos PDR and Rwanda have been completed, there is no operational update provided regarding to their activities in this report. The overall results achieved with the project will be shared with the Final Progress report submitted to the Project Board upon completion of the project.

Angola- Vocational Training for Women and Youth Building Resilience to El Nino

Operational activities of this project have been successfully concluded in the second quarter. However, UNDP Angola is currently planning a joint field mission with the Ambassador of Turkey to the province of Huila to officially deliver the certificates of the 100 young apprentices and meet the local authorities and counterparts. The mission is expected to take place between 31 October and 2 November¹.

DRC- Building an Electric Power (Renewable Energy) Distribution Network at Masisi Current Status and Results Achieved

During the third quarter, the construction of the water intake structure continued³. According to the latest monitoring report from the UNDP Office in the DRC, as of 1st of September, the development work of the water intake structure is 95% completed. The DRC office is undertaking frequent missions to the work sites to monitor the progress closely.

To maintain the sustainability of the project, and to promote the local development of capacities, a Local Electrification and Development Committee which was established in 2016 received their training⁴. The main objective of the training that took place was to strengthen the capacities of CLED members in the following areas: operation and maintenance of micro hydropower plants, administrative and financial management of micro hydropower plants, community development, requirements of the Electricity Sector Act, communication techniques and conflict resolution.

³ As part of the construction, more than 60 workers, including more than 30 women and 16 skilled people are employed.

⁴ The functions of this local committee are varied and multisectoral, but its members are mainly responsible for supporting the local development planning, by factoring energy distribution, establishing business plans for the localities covered by the project, ensuring the day-to-day management and technical maintenance of the plant and ensuring the collection of bill payments and investment plans for these funds.

Participants improved their knowledge in the fundamentals of the operation and maintenance of micro hydropower plants and networks, the operational and administrative and financial management of an MCH and the fundamentals of community development. They also learned about the techniques in the field of communication and conflict resolution and the requirements of the Electricity Sector Act and the interaction between CLEDEs and public institutions responsible for promoting electrification.

The overall results of the project will further be shared with the final report.

Future Activities

- Complete the rest of the construction work on the sites,
- Conduct continuous monitoring of ongoing activities on the sites of the construction which will be covered from different project budgets⁵.
