 - 9 pilot proposals were submitted for approval to IDF across all three verticals i.e. job, enterprise and Bridging the Information Gap (BIG), and only 8 pilots were approved.
 - 11 pilots have been launched during the quarter. No pilot got completed in this quarter.

- Funding pattern analysis shows that out of the of 8 approved proposals, there is one pilot proposal showing both government and private sector participation There are 5 pilots for which funding is being proposed only from Disha. Private along with project funding has been proposed for one of the pilots and government funding with project funding has been proposed only for 1 of the pilots.
- The review of the pilot 'Pratham', Maharashtra was conducted and a detailed review report was submitted.

5. List of project issues/ new risks that the PO wants to ensure are included and addressed in the PSC

<u>Risks:</u>

- a) Socio- political scenario in the project implementation areas may change
- b) State Government department on skill development may take longer than expected to come on board the project.

Issues:

- a) The project has a wide range of stakeholders, including government, CSOs and corporates; and hence requires a more time to design the pilots and streamline the implementation process.
- b) Since the project operates on multi stakeholder partnership (UNDP, Xynteo, IDF), internal approval by the partners takes longer than desired.
- c) Delivery in the field has been delayed across many pilots due to various constrains including the clash with academic sessions in schools and colleges, timely placements of ground staff by the partner/training partners.
