Brief Description

Bangladesh has made considerable progress in managing disaster risks over last 10 years. However, large and recurrent nature of hazards poses a very different set of risks to an economy with both impressive economic growth and significant progress in human development. In line with the Sendai Framework of Action and the Government of Bangladesh's 7th Five Year Plan, renewed attention is required to develop the whole society's capacity on preparedness for disaster response & recovery. An efficient capacity would help Bangladesh achieve both Sustainable Development Goals and a developed county status by 2041. UNDP's proposed Disaster Response and Recovery Facility (DRRF) is a vital contribution towards this ambition. The proposed Facility will adopt an "economy-wide" approach in addition to focusing on household and community level recovery. It will primarily support Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief (MoDMR), and gradually expand its support to selected key sectors at all levels for enhancing national capacity and supporting policy making for resilient recovery. The DRRF will achieve the following objectives:

A. Implement timely, appropriate and adequate response and recovery assistance to the households, community, businesses for quick return to sustainable development pathways & business continuity;

B. Work with development partners, the UN/Cluster systems to support GoB to build its capacity at all levels and sectors for carrying out post disaster needs assessment, formulating recovery strategy and plans, and mobilizing resources.

C. Support making appropriate policies, financial instruments, and technological innovation on preparedness for recovery and provide coordination support and foster partnership in (early) recovery and shelter sector as part of national priorities in disaster management.

E. Work as, when appropriate, a fund management facility for humanitarian and development agencies to foster cost effective and time efficient mechanism

Building on successes of Early Recovery Facility project, the facility will continue to focus on rapid- scaling up and effective management of transitions towards development. To achieve, it will continue to be built on pre-approved funding mechanisms, flexible operational procedures and active pool of implementing partners and professional human resources. For ensuring timely support to the government in need, the project will follow Direct Implementation Modality (DIM) of UNDP.

The 3rd meeting of the DRRF Project Advisory Board was held on the 10th of December 2020 at the conference room in Sayeman Beach Resort, Cox's Bazar. The respected Advisory Board members from ERD, MoDMR, and DDM along with participants from the office of UNRC, UNDP staffs from the Country Office, and Cox's Bazar took part in the discussion. The 3rd meeting of the DRRF Project Advisory Board was chaired by Ms. Nguyen Thi Ngoc Van, Deputy Resident Representative, UNDP Bangladesh. It was a daylong meeting including a field visit at Ukhia Camp. The objective of this board meeting was to link project implementation with results, examining the achievement and progress of DRRF activities including response and activities covered in Cox's Bazar (CXB). The discussion and the strategic guidance received

from the Advisory board are summarized below with decisions made thereto and the way forward for 2021.

Welcome Address

Ms. Nguyen Thi Ngoc Van, Deputy Resident Representative, UNDP Bangladesh welcomed the participants and expressed her heartfelt gratitude for their participation in the meeting. She explained the urgency of such a Project Advisory Board meeting to stay informed on the COVID -19 relevancy while implementing the DRRF activities with upcoming challenges. She also highlighted that since disaster is mostly unpredictable and since the COVID pandemic had priorly been unknown, DRRF must stay fit to purpose.

She emphasized that DRRF is building its strength and capacity to look out for opportunities to complement the Government's development path and this facility is contributing to the implementation of the relevant goals of the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG)-2030 while aligning with the 8th Five-Year Plan of Bangladesh and other global priority agenda. With this brief introduction, she opened the session for discussion.

Opening Remarks

After a small self-introductory session amongst the participants, Mr. Arif Abdullah Khan, Program Specialist, R & IG Cluster, UNDP briefed the new members about the objective and area of work under the DRRF. He covered the key basis of DRRF Project Formulation including the Theory of Change on which DRRF was built on. He also pointed towards how this facility is contributing to the implementation of the relevant goals of the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG)-2030 through its objectives and four key results of DRRF from 2018 to 2022. He informed the audience regarding the role and responsibilities of the Project Advisory Board and cordially requested the PAB members to provide strategic and operational guidance to the Disaster Response & Recovery Facility.

Key Activities of DRRF (Core): Mr. Shah Zahidur Rahman, Shelter Specialist and Project Manager a.i Disaster Response and Recovery Facility (DRRF), UNDP presented a PowerPoint Presentation to facilitate the discussion on core DRRF activities, which highlighted the following key achievements of DRRF in 2020. *Further details on the interventions are attached as Annexure -A to this MofM*.

a. Promoting proper and dignified management of the COVID-19 diseased

b. Support to Local Government in Cyclone Amphan preparedness

c. Emergency Shelter Cash and Technical Assistance for house repair to Cyclone Amphan Affected Population

d. Creating Income Generating Opportunities through CfW for Cyclone Amphan affected people in 4 districts (EGPP Model of GoB's Social Safety Net programme).

e. Mitigating the COVID – 19 risk to the waste cleaning workers of the 12 city corporations through providing Personal Protective Equipment

- f. FSCD's reform initiatives
- g. Socio-economic studies concerning COVID pandemic and Guidelines

h. Key Supporting Role of DRRF i.e. NPDM (2020-2015), Post-disaster Recovery Planning, Digitalization in beneficiary Selection, Disaster and Pandemic Data Management for IDPs and Migrants, Shelter and Early Recovery Cluster lead.

Discussions:

In response to a query by Mr. Md Anisur Rohman, Director (Relief), Department of Disaster Management (DDM) on Creating Income Generating Opportunities through CfW for Cyclone Amphan affected people in 4 districts, Shah Zahidur Rahman explained how DRRF has adopted the EGPP (Employment Generation Programme for the Poorest) model for social safety net while applying the same criteria and regulation under EGPP and added value in the existing implementing modalities.

Mr. ABM Shafiqul Haidar, Joint Secretary (Planning and Development), Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief (MoDMR) also informed that similar type of EGPP related works are also implemented by World Bank. Mr. Amal Krishna Mandal (Joint Secretary, Branch: UN-I, ERD) enquired on how the EGPP being a National Implementing Modality (NIM) merged with DRRF's initiatives under Direct Implementing Modality (DIM) in EGPP implementation. The pros and cons of complementing the EGPP model were clarified and further monitoring and evaluation of this model were pursued at field level visit by the PAB members in this regard.

Mr. Md Anisur Rohman asked regarding the formation of COVID-19 Dead Body Management (DBM) teams at the City Corporation (CC) level. It was informed that the DBM teams not only include the members from Al Markajul Islami Bangladesh but also include CC staff and local level volunteers. Mr. Md Anisur Rohman also advised for more city corporation level dead body management-related training for safe burial of COVID deceased by Al Markajul Islami in coming days.

Mr. Amal Krishna Mandal (Joint Secretary, Branch: UN-I, ERD) enquired on FSCD's reform initiatives and desired clarification on the DRRF's role in the process. Mr. Shah Zahidur informed that the reform initiatives were triggered on request from FSCD and the UNDP's inspiration from Police Reform Initiatives (2003-2016) added a comparatives advantage in holding the hand of FSCD reform project. PAB members can advise and contribute to FSCD's reform initiative and may join in the upcoming planning/dissemination workshop as relevant.

Mr. Kazi Sahidur Rahman from the UNRCO office opted to know the basis for more resource mobilization strategy which skewed towards Cox's Bazar. He wanted to know whether it was donor-driven or based on the needs of GoB or any other priorities. In response to this clarification, Arif Abdullah Khan informed the house that, the DRRF has been designed to complement the GoB's disaster response and crisis management efforts in any region of Bangladesh during any event of emergency or crisis. DRRF's contribution is not preplanned rather due to the ongoing Rohingya crisis with the cascading impact of the COVID-19 pandemic; more projects in Cox's Bazar are being acknowledged by GoB's interest and donors' priority.

The PAB agreed on the following top key results proposed for the DRRF Annual Work Plan in 2021. However, exigency for any new results complementing GoB's effort under DRRF's objectives is always welcome from the PAB. *Further details on the AWP 2021 is attached as Appendix-1 to Annexure -A.*

- Contribution on SDG & SFA: Emergency employment generation in response to the socioeconomic impact due to COVID-19.
- Collaboration & Celebration of Multilateralism: Creating diverse scope for DRRF- Multi ministerial engagement and collaboration with local government, Partnership with other UN Agencies Private Sectors.
- Creating innovative tech-based strategies towards future: Digital Beneficiary Targeting Platform piloting
- Knowledge Creation: Develop nexus and synergies among Humanitarian -recovery –development actors in supporting disaster-affected people & community.
- Capacity Building: Support reform and restructuring initiatives of Fire Service and Civil Defense.

Decisions:

- DRRF to arrange a field monitoring visit for the PAB members to observe the Income Generating Opportunities through CfW for Cyclone Amphan affected people in 4 districts (EGPP Model of GoB's Social Safety Net programme).
- DRRF to continue more city corporation level dead body management-related training for safe burial of COVID deceased in coming days.
- PAB members can advise and contribute to FSCD's reform initiative and may join in the upcoming planning/dissemination workshop as relevant.
- The board endorsed the DRRF core activities for the year 2020.
- The PAB agreed on the top key results for the DRRF's Annual Work Plan in 2021.

Agenda 3: Discussion on Cox's Bazar Projects under DRRF's USD 50 million Disaster Window Portfolio

Mr. Mahtabul Hakim; PM CCP project, UNDP presented a PowerPoint Presentation on the key activities under Cox's Bazar office, which highlighted the key achievements of the CXB team in 2020. CXB Team presented their project updates on:

- Sustainable solutions for Solid Waste
- Community Recovery and Resilience Project C2RP
- Disaster Risk Management Project DRM
- Community Cohesion Project-CCP
- Peaceful District Project

Further details on the interventions are attached as Annexure -B to this MofM.

Discussions:

Mr. Amal Krishna Mandal from ERD made a query on the synergy and linkage between Core DRRF activities and the extensiveness of CXB operation and requested further clarification on the PAB member's authority in making any decision for both or not. It was clarified that; the PAB has full rights to make decisions for projects under DRRF. It explained further that **DRRF is built on a pre-approved funding mechanisms wi**ndow of USD 50 million (preapproved disaster window) that has been created to quickly mobilize a considerable volume of resources in support of national-level disasters in response to GoB appeal and/or its extended complementary support needs. The CXB projects are part of this **preapproved disaster window** and their activities had been approved in the 2nd Project Advisory Board. As the Rohingya issue was an unexpected crisis followed by Cyclone Amphan and COVID -19 pandemic; much of the mobilized resource was skewed towards CXB. According to strategic output: 'The immediate relief and Disaster Response needs of severe disaster-affected people are met'; projects under CXB are complementing the output through their projects like SWM, C2RP, etc. Ms. Van also indicated how DRRF's objective goes beyond natural disasters and man-made crises as well, which leads DRRF to operate in different projects simultaneously all over Bangladesh.

Field visit at Camp Ukhia, CXB:

The PAB members less who joined remotely over zoom and DRRF Team went out for a field visit on CXB's SWM project. Mr. Marta Kucharski Duran, Waste Management Livelihoods Specialist, CXB UNDP took the team in the field and briefed the ongoing waste collection and construct felicities, and explained various hazards and environmental impact on the camps. *Further details on the interventions are attached as Annexure -C to this MofM*.

Decisions:

- DRRF to inform the Board about initiating any new resource mobilization under the DRRF portfolio.
- PAB members have control over issuing directives and making decisions on the DRRF initiatives.
- The board endorsed the CXB activities for the year 2020.

Agenda 4: Discussion and review of DRRF's changed M&E plan and Result Framework in the COVID-19 context

Discussions:

Mr. Kkazuyoshi Hirohata, UNDP CO M&E officer, and Mr. Amanullah bin Mahmood, National consultant -M & E, DRRF presented the reviewed M&E framework for the DRRF (core) to the board. The decision of such revision was taken in the 2nd advisory board and with the changed scenario under COVID -19 context it necessitated further changes. Since the DRRF activities are not pre-defined or cannot be predicted- the M&E framework is subjected to continuous change due to its nature of the response. Some outcomebased indicators were needed to be revised as COVID-19 supporting activities are incorporated in the resulting framework. Some new indicators and revised outputs are being evolved to make them more result-oriented (e.g gender-sensitive indicators.). Projects under CXB should maintain their project-wise M&E Framework separately as per their specific activities and outputs. However, a midterm review of DRRF (due in 2021) may include all such M&E plans in considerations. *The further details on the interventions are attached as Annexure -D and Annexture-E to this MofM*.

Decisions:

- The board endorsed the revised M&E framework for the DRRF (2018-2022).
- DRRF's Midterm review (2018-2020) will be based on the revised M&E plan.

Agenda 5: Next PAB meeting

The next PAB meeting is planned around the 1st week of April.

Agenda 6: AOB

Mr. Hendrik Gideon Van Zyl; Head of COXB Crisis Response Office, UNDP briefly explained the UNDP's contribution to the Rohingya crisis in the COVID-19 context; predominantly in the host communities and through technical assistance to ISCG at major camps activities. He mentioned the importance of UNDP's partnership and collaboration with other UN agencies i.e. UNWOMEN, IOM, UNHCR, I/NGOs, Host Communities, etc., and highlighted the division of emergency humanitarian support assistances by various agencies working in CXB. UNDP's contribution at CXB is not in silos, rather it is integrating the gaps of humanitarian needs holistically. He was optimistic to receive new fund /resource mobilization by end of the 1st quarter of 2021. Three new projects are in pipeline.

Decisions:

UNDP CXB office should implement the decisions (as mentioned above) of the meeting and also explore, in consultation with its donors and partner organization, for new approaches to more disaster risk management and mobilize more resources for effective disaster management.

Brief Description

The world is now facing a great crisis- Coronavirus- COVID-19. The virus primarily spreads between people in a similar manner to influenza, via respiratory droplets from coughing or exhaling. The outbreak of this severe acute respiratory disease was first identified in Wuhan, Hubei, China in December 2019 and recognized as a pandemic by the World Health Organization (WHO) on 11 March 2020. The pandemic was confirmed to have spread to Bangladesh in March 2020 with the first three known cases being reported on 7 March 2020. The infections stayed low till the end of March- however, the number of cases reported as nCOVID19 positive in Bangladesh are raising alarmingly with increased number of death tolls. In the meantime, several initiatives have been taken nationwide with an attempt to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. But, the impact of such measures is devastating individuals, families, communities (including the Rohingya and host communities in Cox's Bazar), economy and taking infrastructure driving businesses and factories to a standstill, fragmenting supply chains, and undoubtedly disproportionately affecting the poor- many of whom are losing jobs and incomes. This pandemic is threatening the development gain and challenging the progress of sustainable development and making humanitarian responses more difficult.

Considering the current and probable future nCOVID19 situation in the country, the DRRF project has proactively designed and launched the nCOVID19 emergency response in Atlas output ID 00120903 since Mid-of March 2020 with the aim to increase awareness, support the health and other relevant sectors including the frontliners, minimize the spread, reduce the suffering of the poor and marginalized population, ensuring the social and environmental protection etc.

I. PURPOSE AND EXPECTED OUTPUT

A short description justifying the need for an Initiation Plan for this project and the expected output.

While the number of cases reported as COVID-19 positive in Bangladesh continues to be low in March 2020; the situation may change rapidly. This in turn may start affecting the daily lives of the people of Bangladesh. The Public Authorities have already shut down educational institutions and restricted international travels. The public authority may initiate more intensive measures to contain the transmission e.g. extending travel restriction for domestic travel, discouraging large public gatherings as people start avoiding risks of exposure in public.

As the COVID19 positive cases are rapidly increasing; mass awareness on preventive measures and preventive materials are required to contain the transmission. If the COVID19 situation degrades in Bangladesh, then it would create great crisis in every sphere of life - affecting the economy, environment and society. According to the experts, the health care system which is hardly ready to cope with the increased caseload; would face difficulty in providing the necessary treatment facility to the infected population. Even, it may put the frontline workforce in dicey situation in tackling the pandemic without adequate protective equipment(s). If Bangladesh faces increased caseload like some European countries are already facing; then it will create heavy stress on the existing health facilities and management of dead bodies would be raised as a critical public service issues with increased number of death toll. On the other hand, initiation of more intensive measures to contain the transmission e.g. stay at home measure, restriction on movement etc. may end up in huge unemployment – the worst sufferer will be the low-income population including the poor, marginalized population, small businesses etc. As a result of such anxiety and negative impact on livelihood; gender-based violence are also likely to rise.

The Novel Coronavirus (nCOVID-19) continues to spread in an unpredictable manner, it presents a growing risk to all communities regardless their rural or urban status. While the situation of Cox's Bazar district has been worsening day by day; regular community development work by government and non-government agencies in Cox's Bazar in connection to Rohingva Influx are also getting disrupted. The humanitarian agencies are fearing that if COVID-19 arrives in the camp, it will be devastating as the disease will spread very quickly through the crowded camps. The needs assessment findings show that the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted all the sectors, from food security, nutrition, wash, heath to education. As the lockdown restrictions continues, the socio-economic impact at community level will be more prominent in Cox's Bazar district and it is anticipated that broader socio-economic impacts will continue to be felt for several months. Moreover, socially marginalized people and low income groups, women, indigenous communities, persons with disability started facing huge challenges to maintain their livelihood. The pandemic challenged their subsistence and they are also not getting proper information on preventing themselves from getting any exposure to the virus. During this situation urgent priorities are: raising the awareness of the host communities and identification of sites to build isolation and treatment facilities, intensified hygiene promotion activities through community messaging, community engagement and training of health care workers. Moreover, it is critically important to ensure that the forces, who have been deployed to ensure the security of the host and camp community people and support the communities in this crisis, are better protected with necessary hygiene and protection materials.

Therefore, the DRRF project team, upon discussion with various experts and stakeholders, felt the need of contributing in containing the spread of the virus through mass awareness and increasing the preparedness at different level. It also acknowledges that enhancing the capacity of relevant agencies, LGIs, security forces, private sectors, civil societies etc., to ensure different support/social services, would be utmost essential to mitigate the negative impact of the pandemic.

Purpose:

The objective of the programme is to ensure containing the spread of COVID19 through mass awareness on protective measures, facilitating the frontline workforce with necessary protective equipment, reducing the stress and sufferings of people that have been brought about by COVID19, supporting the health and other relevant sectors in dealing COVID19 caseload, and increasing the preparedness and capacity of different stakeholders for tackling the situation.

Expected Outputs:

- The capacity of different stakeholders in responding to COVID-19 pandemic in Bangladesh is strengthened
- Improved data-driven policy making and response to the COVID-19 outbreak in Bangladesh
- Threats posed by COVID-19 pandemic in Cox's Bazar is mitigated with appropriate and disability inclusive response while preparedness of district disaster management for public health is strengthened and capacity of security forces for better protection of the communities is enhanced
- The COVID19 response plan with the importance of reinforcing the mechanisms to keep the host communities clean of waste, particularly derived from the covid19 outbreak is in place
- Vulnerability of host community people at 5 unions in Teknaf and Ukhiya Upazilas is reduced through ensuring subsistence support.

II. MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

UNDP will adopt a direct implementation modality for the implementation of the activities under this Project. The COVID-19 crisis activities under activity 1-7 of Atlas output ID-00120903 and Project/Award ID-00113842 will manage by the existing staffs of DRRF project. The implementation response activities will also be coordinated by DRRF with guidance from the Project Manager(s), DRRF & CXB projects and the Programme Analyst, R&IG Cluster & Programme Coordinator, CXB. The proposed programme will be managed and implemented by UNDP DRRF staffs with support from LGIs and PNGO/CSOs. The project will also get support from other UNDP projects which are responding the COVID-19 response as well as the Country Office. A detail plan of action plan would be prepared for better management of the activities which will be implemented in the ground level.

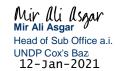
