## **Brief Description**

The overall objective of the project is to reduce barriers and accelerate the biomass market in Serbia.

To achieve the objective, a comprehensive strategy is proposed, by developing and successfully launching a biomass support unit in the Ministry of Mining and Energy and by implementing a sustainable financial mechanism to support biomass projects which will continue beyond the lifetime of this project

Expected results in 2018 are: At least 25 annual municipal biomass balances and biomass programs and plans developed; 1 training module on RES (energy crops and IPARD) for entrepreneurs, local self-government representatives and investors developed; At least 1 field visit for students performed; At least 3 trainings in RES (energy crops and IPARD) delivered; 1CHP facility commissioned; Study visits for national partners on RES, agrowaste and IPARD issues.
