#### **Brief Description**

Bangladesh has made considerable progress in managing disaster risks over last 10 years. However, large and recurrent nature of hazards poses a very different set of risks to an economy with both impressive economic growth and significant progress in human development. In line with the Sendai Framework of Action and the Government of Bangladesh's 7th Five Year Plan, renewed attention is required to develop the whole society's capacity on preparedness for disaster response & recovery. An efficient capacity would help Bangladesh achieve both Sustainable Development Goals and a developed county status by 2041. UNDP's proposed Disaster Response and Recovery Facility (DRRF) is a vital contribution towards this ambition.
