Overall Objective	Based on the achievements and results of the "Support to the Improvement of Legal Aid Practices for Access to Justice for All in Turkey Phase I", the Project aims to develop more coordinated, qualified and systematic approach into legal aid practices in Turkey and build awareness on the operationalization of performance management tools and mechanisms to enhance the efforts to ease access to justice. This will be achieved through developing mechanisms towards gaps for better coordination and improving networks among legal aid service providers (Union of Turkish Bar Associations, Bar Associations and lawyers), women NGOs and civil society, as well as increased capacity of lawyers through online training. With the aim to develop a systematic and structured approach, the Project will implement pilot practices for specialized legal aid services towards gender-based violence victims. The Project will also address the implementation of the policy recommendations for improved legal aid services generated in Phase I and will further support the institutional needs of Bar Associations through the dissemination of performance criteria and evaluation mechanisms that are introduced to ensure an effective, coordinated and monitored legal aid system in Turkey.

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#### 2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

During the first year of the project, between June 2019 and June 2020, implementation was focused on the first three outcomes. A concise brief on the progress towards the project outputs is summarized below:

The 1<sup>st</sup> Regional Meeting was organized within the scope of the Outcome 1 on 10<sup>th</sup> of March 2020. Feedback was received from pilot Bar Associations and NGOs for enhancing local coordination. The meeting had an important impact on NGOs in terms of raising awareness and facilitating their engagement for networking with Bar Associations. The analysis of the ideas produced by NGOs and Bar Associations were incorporated in reports produced by project experts.

During the implementation of Outcome 2 the following activities were completed:

- The first Coordination Meeting was organized for the presentation of the draft Violence Prevention Centers (VPCs) Guideline and feedbacks were received,
- Visits to 7 pilot Bar Associations were completed for infrastructure analysis and locations were determined for 5 Bar Associations,
- Creation of the Project logo was completed and approved by partners,
- The Project website was created for visibility and information sharing purposes,
- Advisory Committee Meeting was organized and the infrastructure analyses were presented to representatives of Bar Associations,
- Preparations for ToT and tailor-made trainings started.

Most of the above-explained activities had crucial significance for the establishment of VPCs. The guideline was approved by partners and pilot Bar Associations. The Bar Associations are planning to coordinate their staff according to this guideline. Infrastructure analyses were completed and approved by partners. Locations of 5 VPCs were determined and 2 Bar Associations (Nevşehir and Antalya) are waiting for the pending decisions by municipalities and governorates due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Furthermore, communication and visibility activities of the Project was focused on during the COVID-19 pandemic by determining the Project logo and creation of the website. The website will be important for sharing significant information with stakeholders and keeping them up to date. Lastly, preparations for ToT and tailor-made trainings started with desk work. Methodology and content are going to be developed for these trainings.

Parallel to the work described above, preparations for the training needs assessment for the online training programme has started. The project partners also agreed to move forward with this activity during the COVID-19 pandemic because desk work is required. Experts will work for determining priority areas for trainings in close consultation with partners. The drafted document regarding the priority areas for trainings will be shared with partners before the Steering Committee Meeting. The purpose of moving forward with this activity is to be ready to present these priority areas during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Project Steering Committee Meeting.

In terms of implementation, finding locations for VPCs in 2 pilot provinces namely Nevşehir and Antalya remains a challenge. There are no other challenges or problems so far. In terms of the way forward, desk work and visibility are prioritized. In the current work pace, it is expected that the VPCs will be established in pilot provinces once the COVID-19 pandemic is under control nationally.

The Project prioritizes gender mainstreaming and ensures that it is applied throughout the implementation of all activities. Reports and communication materials are all produced with a gender-sensitive approach. Most importantly, the project serves SDG 5 by carefully implementing activities in line with the work plan and hopefully will contribute to the elimination of violence against women and girls. Implementation currently focuses on strengthening relevant institutions, promoting the rule of law as well as accountability and transparency in institutions, which also serves relevant targets of SDG 16.

#### i) Narrative reporting on results:

Outcome I: Enhanced coordination between women NGOs, civil society organizations, public bodies, lawyers and bar associations to improve the legal aid system in Turkey.

#### **Progress towards results**

#### **Analysis Section**

- 1. Within the scope of Outcome I, contracts of the Individual Consultants (Gender Expert and Communication Expert) were finalized. The experts participated in the meetings and produced reports. In line with the approved Gender Action Plan of the Project (Annex-1), the Gender Expert assists the gender-sensitive approach of the project in enhancing coordination between relevant institutions in terms of paving the way for a gender-based focus throughout coordination efforts. Furthermore, the Gender Expert and Communication Expert collaborate on gender-sensitive communication methods.
- 2. A workshop in the 1<sup>st</sup> Regional Meeting has been conducted after expert presentations regarding the importance of coordination between Bar Associations and NGOs (see Annex-2). In the group workshop, NGOs and Bar Associations of each pilot province worked together to provide suggestions and expectations regarding the implementation of the project as well as to enhance coordination between them (see Annex-3 for the expert reports). The content of the meeting was about how to enhance coordination among NGOs and Bar Associations. It was clear that the dynamics of every province was different in terms of coordination and institutional relationships. Participants' suggestions received on VPCs, trainings and coordination. One of the most important points raised was about signing protocols with relevant civil society organizations and public institutions in order to strengthen collaboration and local violence prevention mechanisms. The points raised by the participants and expert reports contributed to the project implementation by

specifically highlighting focus areas. This meeting also showcased the enthusiasm of NGOs and Bar Associations to work together in preventing violence.

#### **Progress towards results**

Lead Law Expert, 2 Senior Law Experts, Gender Expert and Communication Expert were hired. Moreover, the process for the recruitment of Psychologist, Training of Trainers (ToT) and Social Worker IC Experts was finalized, and the experts were selected. In order to coordinate more efficiently, several meetings with the experts were conducted both in UTBA and UNDP. These meetings took place on 16-24 July 2019 where the work plan of the project was discussed and eventually agreed upon; 10 October 2019 where the later-cancelled opening ceremony was discussed; 16 December 2019 where the progress regarding infrastructure analyses was discussed; 4 March 2020 where the upcoming regional workshop and general progress of the project were discussed. For the smooth working mechanism of VPCs, the experts prepared a guideline document (see Annex-5) and presented it to the pilot bar associations and project partners in the 1<sup>st</sup> Coordination Meeting (see Annex-6) and with the feedback from them, the document was finalized.

The specifications document for the tender of VPC for 5 pilot bar associations was prepared (see Annex-7) and the tender notice will be published in mid-July. Antalya and Nevşehir Bar Associations had problems finding appropriate locations for the establishment of VPCs. Representatives of these Bar Associations are waiting for replies from Chief Prosecutors Office and Municipalities. Currently, both Bar Associations were not able to find any solutions because of the COVID-19 pandemic. For these reasons the specifications were prepared for 5 Provinces, however, as soon as Nevşehir and Antalya Bar Associations resolve their issues they can be easily included in the tender after obtaining approvals.

During the COVID-19 isolation period, experts started to conduct desk work for the ToT and Tailor-made Training Program. The communication expert has drafted a guideline document regarding the communication activities of the project (see Annex-8). This document focuses specifically on each project activity for better implementation, preparations and follow-ups. The guideline underlines the need for multidirectional discourse and focuses on end-users while carefully designing communication activities. The guideline was presented to Bar Associations and NGOs during the 1st regional meeting and it was accepted by them. Complementarily, the Gender Expert also prepared a "Communication Elements in the Scope of Gender" document as a guideline for a gender-sensitive communication approach for the project (see Annex-9). The Communication Expert also prepared the "General Framework of the Website" (see Annex-10) and "Technical Specifications for Website Design" (see Annex-11) documents in accordance with the Lead Law Expert and Gender Expert for the efficient design of the project website. Moreover, the Gender Expert and Lead Law Expert also prepared a comprehensive informative document to be uploaded on the website that includes legal and definite information regarding violence, actions to be taken, precautionary measures and channels of reporting violence (see Annex-12). This document will be beneficial and explanatory for people, especially women and girls, who feel in danger and have been subjected to violence. Finally, the first Advisory and Steering Committee meetings have been organized on 10-11 March 2020 (see Annex-13-14). Additionally, a project logo was selected by project partners (which could be found in the test version of the project website).

*Note:* UTBA previously requested additional financing from SIDA for attorneys who are going to work at VPCs. The request was forwarded by UNDP to SIDA on 15<sup>th</sup> of April 2019. This request was discussed during the first Steering Committee Meeting held on the 11<sup>th</sup> of March 2020 as well (Annex 14 – Steering Committee Meeting minutes). SIDA rejected this proposal and UTBA suspended it.

The project team came up with the idea to conduct a GBV analysis for mapping the current situation in pilot provinces and understanding services or solutions provided to GBV victims. Approval of project partners was obtained. The team collects data from Bar Associations, NGOs and Municipalities. With the help of representatives of pilot Bar Associations, the project team also compiles data from chief prosecutors' offices, courthouses, ŞÖNİMs, police and gendarmerie directorates in pilot provinces about the number of gender-based violence applications, number of injunctions granted, number of victims transferred to shelters and gender-based violence case types. The analysis report is still under preparation due to pending statistical information from related institutions. The results of this study will be discussed with partners and stakeholders during an advisory committee meeting.

#### **Progress towards results**

Preparations for Training Needs Assessment to determine the online training modules have been initiated within the scope of Activity 3.1. Once the needs are identified by the project experts, a detailed training programme will be presented to the Project Steering Committee and Committee's decision on 5 priority modules will be sought. Upon the approval of the Project Steering Committee, preparations for the development of priority models for pilot online-training delivery will be initiated.

#### iii) Success Story

The successes of the project within the reporting period are listed below:

President of UTBA contacted the First Lady as they intended to share experiences between VPCs and ŞÖNİMs (Ministry of Family, Labour and Social Services). Furthermore, experienced attorneys working at VPCs will support ŞÖNİMs in providing consultancy and following cases through legal processes. Ministry of Justice representatives also held a meeting with the president of UTBA for future collaborations about violence against women. In line with these developments, a circular devoted to the prevention of gender-based violence was published by the Ministry of Justice. According to the circular, "Domestic and Gender-based Violence Offices" will be operational nationwide and specialized prosecutors will be designated for specific cases. A similar circular has also been issued by the Ministry of Interior, mentioning that vocational trainings will be conducted for law enforcement and related staff. Ministry of Interior also aims to expand its cooperation in the area of violence against women. These initiatives were all in relation and inspired by this project.

The project was successful in terms of raising awareness about legal aid and violence against vulnerable groups among public authorities, civil society and bar associations. The 1<sup>st</sup> regional meeting increased project visibility and the cooperation network between Bar Associations and NGOs.

# **4. PROGRAMMATIC REVISIONS Project Management Arrangements**

The project activity plan was modified due to the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic. It was shared on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April 2020 with UTBA, Ministry of Justice and SIDA. Desk work was prioritized during the pandemic. Experts are developing training content and methodology for ToT and tailor-made trainings for the second project result. Moreover, within the scope of the third result, experts are working on a

training needs assessment and respectively they will identify five modules for the online legal aid training program in close consultation with the project partners. Draft versions of the document regarding the priority modules will be shared with the partners before the steering committee meeting. These modules will be ready to present during the second steering committee meeting. Technical specifications for the procurement of office equipment for VPCs were completed. Upon completion of the final steps in collaboration with UNDP's Procurement Unit, the tender is planned to be published in mid-July. Project activities where travels are required were delayed towards the end of the year because of health concerns and travel restrictions due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### i) Communication and Visibility

The project's visibility-related developments within the reporting period are listed below:

Initially, in the scope of 2 communication campaigns of the UNDP Communications Team, Phase I project has been included as success stories within the reporting period. Also, upon request, 100 more of these packages were sent to Denizli Women's Rights Protection Association to be disseminated in Denizli.

The project website, planned to be published in mid-July, will also have crucial information on the project and its activities as well as the VPCs to be established. Alongside the UNDP Turkey website, news and announcements will be published through it.

The Ministry of Justice (MoJ) hopes that the communication and visibility activities carried out in the future will contribute to the promotion of Judicial Support Directorates (ADM) and Forensic Interview Rooms (AGO) because their two initiatives are also important for vulnerable groups access to justice.

Overall, MoJ believes that VPCs, ADMs and AGOs will altogether contribute greatly to the legal aid system in Turkey therefore, they are going to support victims of violence in accessing legal services in
cooperation with UTBA and Bar Associations.

# ii) Risks, Mitigation Measures and Assumptions

A COVID-19 pandemic response plan was prepared by the UNDP Project Team and shared with partners. The plan was approved. The pandemic forced activities which require large organizations to be delayed due to health risks. For this reason, activities which require desk work were prioritized but, these were still in line with the original activity plan. The effects of the pandemic were minimized by minor adjustments to the original activity plan. The 2<sup>nd</sup> wave of the pandemic is valid, and further adjustments will be proposed to partners if problems continue.
