Opening Remarks by Mr. Anura Dissanayake, Secretary, Ministry of Mahaweli Development and Environment

The gathering was welcomed by Mr. Anura Dissanayake, Chairman of National Project Steering Committee and explained the objectives and the importance of the Climate Change Adaptation Project to the community of selected areas on social and economic aspects.

Mr. Anura Dissanayake, Secretary, Ministry of Mahaweli Development and Environment

The difficulty to spend targeted 290.21Mn. LKR during the year 2019 was pointed out and the project staff was suggested to revise the Annual Work Plan and Budget to amount around 150Mn. LKR to 160Mn. LKR for an effective utilization of funds for implementation during remaining period. Further, PMU was informed to delegate available balance to the UNDP by increasing portion for the UNDP. The Additional Secretary, EP & ET and Director- Planning, MMDE were advised to guide the project staff in revision of AWPB 2019 as well as in adjusting the budget allocation for the year as above mentioned, in terms of rapid and sustainable disbursement of funds. The importance of Climate Change adaptation was explained. The neediness to utilize available funds before the termination date was strictly mentioned. All the project staff in both PMU and UNDP was informed to adapt newly invented technology in both agriculture and non-agriculture activities to combat Climate Change impacts in terms of making Sri Lanka more disaster resilient.

- 1. the project staff was advised to get the support of the Department of Meteorology in Climate Change Adaptation. Further, the importance of linking the agriculture productions to the local market as well as to the central market via proper established value chain was explained. Moreover, informed to establish and stabilize proper monitoring system to find and fill the gaps of the project activities. The Project team was mentioned about the signification of getting GAP certification to the project.
- 2. Informed to pay attention on sustainability of the project activities based with the way of benefitting the people. Further, the survey team was informed to complete the survey and provide the final report within two weeks of time. The project staff was informed to revise and submit the PMU and UNDP collaborative Annual Work Plan and Budget 2019 before 30th January 2019 in accordance to the Interim Report findings and recommendations. Finally, the Project team was informed to be confirm that the project is adapting best practices for the overwhelming Climate Change impacts.

Mr. Sunimal Chandrasiri, Project Director-CCAP

The progress of the Climate Change Adaptation Project for the year 2018 by the side of PMU and UNDP and the summary of the Annual Work Plan and Budget of 2019 which was earlier submitted to the Policy Planning Division – MMDE were presented.

Out of 290.21Mn. LKR which was allocated to the project from the Treasury of Sri Lanka, allocation for each sub-component with the total number of projects for the year 2019, allocation for all three implementing DSDs were included in the presentation as follows.

The initial budget allocation for the two outputs of the Project by UNDP for project implementation was presented. Then, the Project concept and approach settled by UNDP were adduced. Further, the strategy of implementation was expressed along with the value chains as textile, agriculture, dairy, food, and handicraft introduced/strengthen through the Project. Finally, the importance of headhunting and convincing the community as well as the relevant officers regarding importance of using best and technological advanced practices were explained.

Thanked the Secretary- MMDE, Additional Secretary EP & ET- MMDE PMU Project staff as well as the Dr. Damith Chandrasekare and UNDP staff for the dedication extended throughout the period to make the project a successful one.
