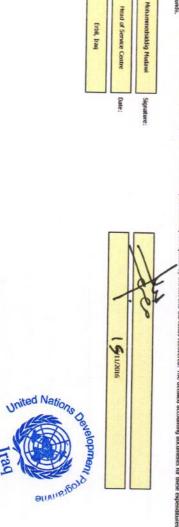

Project Targets (as defined in Annex A of the PPA)	Progress against project targets
3 greenhouses projects implemented in Arwat, Gawilan and Darashakran	Greenhouses projects are being implemented in Arwat, Gawilan and Darashakran camps:
camps	o Installation of 10 greenhouses has started in Gawilan camp , including an irrigation system. A total of 17 farmers have been selected to use 10 greenhouses in Gawilan camp and 30 farmers to use 15 old greenhouses in Arwat camp . The design for a water treatment system in Arwat is ongoing.
	o In Gawilan and Arwat camps cucumber seedlings are being distributed to farmers. A total of 32,760 plants of cucumber, of which 19,224 seedlings of sillon variety, will be distributed and planted in 15 old greenhouses in Arwat camp, and 13,536 seedlings of rolla variety are being distributed and planted in Gawilan Camp. The varieties of cucumber were selected according to the results of field researches that have been done by Ministry of Agriculture and Water Resources in the Kurdistan Region of Iraq. The research identified suitable varieties of plants and cucumber that would grow during fall season in moderate/cold conditions (Gawilan area) as well as dry/very cold (Arwat area).
	 Wall construction has started in Darashakran camp. The wall consists of stone-steel-concrete cement base (30 cm) and 1.5 to 2 meters high block fence. The fence works as flood block for the project, as the project site is located in a downhill area.
60 refugees benefited temporary employment activities	 A total of 41 laborers have been working in all the three camps. Both refugee workers (35 people) and local skilled workers (6 people) are involved in cash for work. Depending on the work available on a daily basis, each worker works for 1 to 5 days.



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45 refugees supported to establish or scale up business	No significant progress to report against this target in this reporting period.
9 value chains involving diverse ethnic/social groups supported	No significant progress to report against this target in this reporting period.
9 signed partnership agreements with private sector to facilitate employment	No significant progress to report against this target in this reporting period.
4 livelihoods and/or market assessment conducted	 One market and agro-value chain assessment in Syrian Refugees' camps is being conducted (Arwat, Gawilan, Darashakran and host communities).
	 Rapid assessment is ongoing in all the three camps. A total of 15-20% of camp population in each camp was selected as a sample to be part of the rapid assessment and cluster random sampling was used for sampling.
120 refugees participated ir professional skills, vocation or business development training course	O Training for a total of 17 new farmers working on the 10 greenhouses in Gawilan camp is ongoing on maintaining the greenhouses. To increase the impact of trainings, video tapes made at the 10 new established greenhouses were presented to farmers.
27 refugees participated in mixed social cohesion community events	Establishment of Local Community Steering Committee (LCSC) is finalized in all the three camps. A total of 16 people are involved in three committees: five members in Gawilan, fice members in Darashakran, and six members in Arwat camp. In total two women, eight young men, and six men are members of the LCSCs. Participatory Rural Analysis (PRA) approach was used to create each committee. For each LCSC, a charter was developed with the participation of the members. The charters clarify the purpose and structure of LCSCs, their objectives, as well as duties and responsibilities of their members. The charters allow local actors (camp communities, camp administration and NGOs) to form partnerships and work together towards better use
