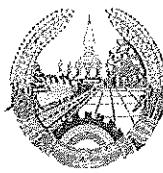

1. Project Implementation Status and Key Results

Implementation Status Summary at Outcome level

- The District Development Fund (DDF) uses government's own systems and staff, to provide untied block grants together with practical learning to District administrations, enabling them to engage with local communities to identify and provide priority MDG related services, in Health, Education, Public Works/Access and Agriculture. For Fiscal Year (FY) Y2015-16, the project is making a positive impact on local service investment and delivery through the provision of US \$302,000 in district block grants to 6 best performance districts in 3 provinces i.e. Xiengkhouang (two districts-Kham and Phoukout), Houaphan (two districts-Viengxay and Xamtai) and Oudomxai (two districts-Xai and Houn). For detail district annual investment FY2015-16 please see Annex-1. The \$302,000 represents the final tranche of DDF grants under this current SCSD project, and it financed by \$240,000 US dollars from GPAR SCSD plus the balance of funds (\$62,000) remaining in the Bank of Lao special DDF account, which is the gain made over the life of the project from the exchange rate LAK vs USD.
- Capacity transfer to local administration was support through 2 field-based support / backstopping missions to local administration (DDSTs/DDSC¹s) in two districts of Luangnamtha i.e. Viengphoukha and Sing to assist DDSCs/DDSTs finalize their financial and progress reports. These were complemented by one mission to follow up the progress of the DDF-BBG investments implementation in two districts of Oudomxai i.e. Xai and Houn districts.
- As the project is now in its final period, a DDF lessons learnt workshop for sharing best practice and lessons learnt on DDF implementation amongst local practitioners was held on 24 Feb. 2016 at NCC chaired by MoHA Vice-Minister Khammoune Viphongxay. DDSC from 25 districts and PST from 7 provinces attended the workshop. Lessons on DDF implementation were mutually shared/discussed and way forwards on DDF modality was raised and discussed. Comments/suggestion for streamlining DDF modality will be considered/used for designing DDF in the new GPAR programme (2017-2020).
- The ODS guideline were disseminated to the local authority to understand the principles and steps of ODSC operation. The International consultant to assess the effectiveness of ODSC is recruited. The aim of the assessment is to review the existing regulations and manual as well as draft the improvement plan.

- GPAR CADEM Fund provides small grants for initiatives that build capacity, strengthen management or improve service delivery in public administration particularly at local level. The CADEM technical working group conducted several field monitoring to oversight the progress and provide technical assistant to the granted projects. During Q1 field monitoring were conducted with 10 projects in 9 province. There are good progress in some projects such as project in LuangPrabang, Vientiane, Borkeo and Khammoune. But project in Saravan is delayed which need to coordinate for closely.
- To supplement the institutional performance assessment of districts, the GPAR SCSD project completed the pilot of two new interventions to encourage more responsive local service delivery. The SUFS is seen as particularly significant innovation and offers a basis for future development (in new phase of support to NGPAR) of a more comprehensive public administration performance index. Field trials on the District Service Delivery Monitoring System (D-SDMS) and Service User Feedback Survey (SUFS) began in 2 districts and the first surveys carried out in Q3, 2015. Results shared Mar 2016 with key stakeholders at central level and local level (Saravan province and Oudomxay province). From the review workshop it is confirmed that the 2 systems are useful for the local authority to use for the better evidence-based planning in their localities.

Formal Collaboration with other projects

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MONRE), with the support of the GEF LDCF2 project, is collaborating with UNDP/UNCDF in a project entitled "Effective Governance for small-scale rural infrastructure and disaster preparedness in a changing climate". The overall objective of the project is to improve local administrative systems affecting the provision and maintenance of small scale rural infrastructure, through participatory decision making that reflects the genuine needs of communities and natural systems vulnerable to climate risk. As part of its implementation arrangements, the project is using the existing District Development Fund (DDF) operating under SCSD project to deliver local climate change adaptation infrastructures in Saravane and Sekong provinces. The DDF system has transferred the first round of CR grants (\$152,052) for 4 district projects for FY 2014/15, which LDCF2 and MONRE have identified together with local District Development Support Teams. In addition, the DAIPs of 12 projects in 11 districts of both Saravane and Sekong provinces for the investment projects for FY 2015-16 have been approved and total amount of total CR grant of \$982,805 has been transferred to the project bank account in the Bank of Lao PDR and in the process of further transfer to the 11 districts for the implementation of the 12 projects.
