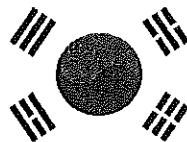

Project Performance and Results

Overview

Strengthening Capacity and Service Delivery of Local Administrations (GPAR SCSD) project was officially launched on 03 February 2012 and became operational from 1st July 2012. This project is being implemented in alignment with other projects of the National GPAR Programme. The overall objective of this project is increased capacity in the local administration, leading to better delivery of services which improve the lives of the poor, especially in rural areas of Lao PDR. The strategy is to build around a series of interrelated outputs that take forward proven results and innovations to realise the overall outcome. These include the introduction of district level performance assessments and performance based Block Grants (capital and recurrent) that will provide incentives for improved overall performance linked to the local administration mandate, the project seeks to improve local MDG-targeted service delivery through increased capacity and long term reform.

The seven outputs of the project are:

1. Policies and regulatory frameworks for effective local administration at province and district level.
2. Improved capacities of local administrations to fulfill its service delivery mandates.
3. Improved MDG focused service delivery provided through formula based and equity focused block grants to the districts.
4. Improve Access to Citizens Service through One Door Service
5. GPAR Capacity Development and Modernisation Fund (CADEM) to support strategic innovations in Public Administration reforms
6. Citizens' Feedback and district mechanisms for responsive and accountable service delivery
7. Project administration and support.

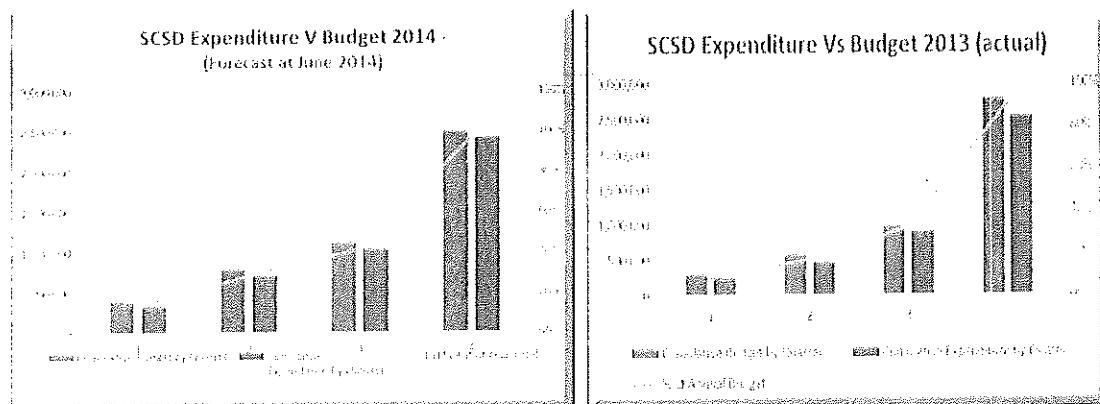
Overview of activities and results during period

Summary of Results emerging in Quarter

- DDF-Sam Sang Review - Terms of Reference for a national consultancy developed and it expected that the review will be undertaken in July.
- NGPAR assessment / DDF review / NGPAR Concept paper: Agreement in principle to design TOR for a combined NGPAR/DDF review and develop GPAR Concept paper;; assignment targeted for Q4 2014.

- 263 government officials (67 women) trained in local planning & procurement, financial management and reporting (DDF guidelines)
- 33 provincial officials benefited from an M&E training for DDF in Xiengkhouang and Houaphan provinces
- 22 small scale district infrastructures and 208 other service interventions are currently being delivered directly by district officials using DDF grants. Total value of these service improvements is \$998,000, which estimated to directly benefit 758,067 local citizens.
- Final installment for projects granted 2014 were transferred to 5 projects (out of 15 projects).
- CADEM Fund guidelines and plans for 2015 revised and finalized. (Announcement for Expression of Interest for grant 2015 opens from Jun – 30 Sept 2014)
- Action plan covering both District-Service Delivery Monitoring System (D-SDMS) and the district Service Users Feedback System (SUFS) developed with national consultant during Quarter 2, for implementation in Q3 & 4.

Overall the project is on track to achieving its annual plan. While expenditure at the mid-year is less than 50% of the annual budget, this is not unexpected and is in line with the implementation cycle of planned activities for the year 2014. This is also in line with similar expenditure pattern in 2013. The Charts below illustrate this situation.



The main activities undertaken by the project during the Quarter are listed below:

1 Policies and regulatory frameworks for effective local administration at province and district level:

- **DDF – Sam Sang review.**
Sam Sang and DDF are two government managed and implemented systems aimed at developing an efficient and effective local administration leading to better delivery of services that improve the lives of the rural poor. The Terms of Reference for a national consultancy has developed and it expected that the review will be undertaken in July. The review will provide technical and facilitation support to assist

GPAR/Ministry of Home Affairs (MoHA) to undertake a comparative review of the DDF and Sam Sang systems and identify opportunities and potential options for DDF to offer closer support to the Sam Sang pilot and improved alignment of these two government systems.

- **DDF Review**

A Terms of Reference was developed during the Quarter for an international consultancy to undertake a forward-looking strategic review of the DDF mechanism. However, in further reflection and discussions it is now proposed to make this DDF review one component part of a wider combined GPAR consultancy. This combined GPAR assignment has three interrelated components / main Deliverables, which will be addressed simultaneously by the Team;

- 1 Assessment of National GPAR to date - assess progress towards achieving expected outcomes, key benefits, achievements and possible gaps in the current Programme.
- 2 Review of District Development Fund (DDF) –the objective of the consultancy is to undertake a forward-looking strategic review of the DDF mechanism, its implementation, and its broad-based impacts (including impacts on poverty, government policies, capacity development, local development, and governance and public administration reform); to identify areas for improvements and articulate a strategy or an approach to enhance the effectiveness of the DDF in supporting the implementation of local development and/or governance reform initiatives in the country. The approach of this review exercise is to build on strengths and successes to date and identify options and opportunities for increased alignment and effectiveness in the short and medium term, within the overall development framework in Lao PDR.
- 3 Develop Concept GPAR 2016-2020 - following on the results and lessons of the above component, and taking into account stakeholder consultations to develop a Concept paper that identifies the required approach/strategy, (with concrete key recommendations related to outcomes / outputs / activities / timeline / budgetary implications) for the formulation of a new phase of the current programme beyond 2015.

- Capacity development on drafting legal/laws through the training was organized in Vientiane Capital from 27-30 April 2014

2 Improved capacities of local administrations to fulfill its service delivery mandates:

The two main streams of support under DDF continued during the Quarter; (i) training and plan making for FY 2014/15 for 53 Districts and (ii) financial support in respect of FY 2013/14 – DDF grants for local services and DDF support to 7 Provincial Support Teams (PST).

DDF Training and Planning:

- During Quarter 2, refreshment DDF guidelines for District Development Support Team (DDST) and Committee (DDSC) of Saravane province and Luang Prabang province was implemented. This was continuation of earlier trainings done in Quarter1. Since January to March 2014, four batches of training/refreshment on DDF Guidelines have been organized for DDST/DDSC/PST of Xiengkhouang, Houaphan, Oudomxai and Luangnamtha. A total 263 government officials including 67 women participated in those trainings. Additionally the Performance Assessment¹ exercise (PAM) was completed for 8 districts in Saravane province in February 2014.
- Complementary to capacity strengthening support for local officials under DDF, MoHA with SCSD project support has also conducted training on monitoring and evaluation (M & E) for local officials at province level to better enable them to oversee and report on DDF activities. In Quarter 2, 33 provincial officials benefited from an M&E workshop in Xiengkhouang and Houaphan provinces. The training was chaired by the Chief of Cabinet with participants from the Provincial Planning and Investment Department, Provincial Finance Department, Provincial Department of Home Affairs, Provincial Inspection Committee, and Provincial Lao Women's Union, respectively. Feedback from the workshops showed that all participants valued the DDF-OEBG as very useful support to Districts in terms of both on –the-job training and for the rapid and visible impact on local service delivery. However, they reported varying levels of ownership across districts leading to delays with submission of investment plans and subsequent reporting. They proposed that the OEBG grant be released in only 1 tranche instead of 2 as is the current regulations. The Report from the M&E exercises, in Lao language, is under consideration with MoHA and GPAR.

This brings the overall number of local government officials given strengthened skills under DDF during the first half of 2014 to 540 of whom 118 were women.

- During the Quarter, the support contribution of \$3,500 to the Provincial Support Team, which offers guidance and oversight to District Administrations under DDF, was transferred to one Province (Xiengkhouang) that had successfully submitted their DDF reports.

- GPAR SCSD supported the survey on the Civil Service Performance Appraisal in 5 provinces in the first Quarter Plan and it the survey result is being analyzed during Q2.

3 Improved MDG focused service delivery provided through formula based and equity focused block grants to the districts.

DDF grants

- In the Quarter, 1,925,633,600 Kip (\$239,265.31USD approx.) was been transferred to 26 district accounts.
- The participating Districts are implementing their approved DDF plan for the current fiscal year (FY 2013-2014) for local service infrastructures (22 small scale infrastructures (DDF-Capital grants) and 208 other service interventions (DDF-OEBG) with a total value of \$998,000, estimated to directly benefit 758,067 local citizens.

Other DDF Activities

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MONRE), with the support of the GEF LDCF2 project, is collaborating with UNDP and UNCDF in a project entitled "Effective Governance for small-scale rural infrastructure and disaster preparedness in a changing climate". The overall objective of the project is to improve local administrative systems affecting the provision and maintenance of small scale rural infrastructure, through participatory decision making that reflects the genuine needs of communities and natural systems vulnerable to climate risk. As part of its implementation arrangements, the project will use the existing District Development Fund (DDF) operating under SCSD project to deliver local climate change adaptation infrastructures in Saravanne and Sekong provinces.

Within this framework of the Memorandum of Understanding and related Description of Services (DoS), SCSD developed a Terms of Reference for a consultancy to review current design documentation, develop appropriate climate change performance based grant system, including indicators & monitoring system and to align supporting documents to ensure effective common implementation of the LDCF and DDF sourced District grant funds. The in-country part of the mission is currently underway from 23rd June – 4th July 2014.

4 Improve Access to Citizens Service through One Door Service

- A Dissemination Seminar and Workshop on ODS for key provincial departments and districts was organized in Champasak Province on March 31-April 2, 2014. The workshop was attended by 87 participants of which 12 were women.
- Vacancy Announcement for Local Consultant to assess the ODS implementation and Action Plan was noticed on newspaper. There was only one local applicant, however, and the selection is under discussion with UNDP.

5 GPAR Capacity Development and Modernisation Fund (CADEM) to support strategic innovations in Public Administration reforms

- All 26 projects (granted year 2012 and 2013) already closed the projects and bank accounts
- Questionnaires and interview targeted projects 2012- and 2013 for assessment are completed.
- Final installment for projects granted 2014 were transferred to 5 projects out of 15 projects. (IT System improvement (CLFNC); Capacity development of Village authorities (PoHA Bokeo); Violence against Women Awareness (CAW-XK; Village authority improvement & staff management (DoHA-Xaythany); Local Administration improvement for 3 Sang administrators (PoHA Champasak).
- CADEM Fund guidelines and plans for 2015 were revised and finalized. (Announcement for Expression of Interest for grant 2015 opens from Jun – 30 Sept 2014)

6 Citizens' Feedback and district mechanisms for responsive and accountable service delivery

- An international mission developed a framework on District Service User Feedback Survey (D-SUFS) in March 2014. As part of the plan of action for field trials of both the D-SDMS and the D-SUFS during 2014 a national consultant was engaged. Action plan covering both District-Service Delivery Monitoring System (D-SDMS) and the district Service Users Feedback System (SUFS) developed with national consultant during Quarter 2, for implementation in Q3 & 4. Since the selecting process for Local Consultant was delayed, therefore, the Consulting Workshop with pilot D-SDM, revalidation indicators and sample sizes, and preparing the tool (implement manual, training module) will be conducted in Quarter 3.

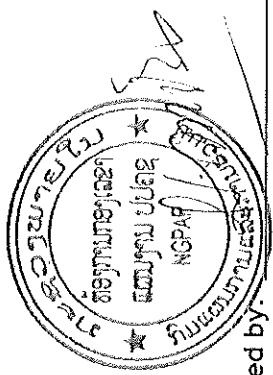
