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## **1. Project Implementation Status and Key Results**

### **Implementation Status Summary at Outcome level (Quarter 2, 2016)**

- US \$302,000 represents the final tranche the District Development Fund (DDF) grants being invested, within Fiscal Year (FY) Y2015-16. Total 18 local service investments are being delivered by 6 district administrations, benefitting 4,408 households of 24,730 people including 12,844 women in 55 villages. 17 of these investments are completed and handed over to the communities. One remaining project in Viengxay district (Houaphan province) for the repair of irrigation scheme at Ban Heo must await end of Rain Season – expected to be completed in October 2016. For detail district annual investment FY2015-16 please see Annex-1.
- Capacities on procurement, project implementation and reporting were transferred to local administration through 2 support missions. Field visit support to Saravane and Sekong advised on submission of final financial reports, which were completed and collected from 10 districts. Field visit support to Xiengkhouang and Houaphan advised on procurement process, implementation, monitoring and reporting requirements for the current FY 2015/16 DDF investments.
- The second 50% installment DDF BBG grants of LAK 800,362,500 was transferred to the last four district accounts namely Viengxay, Xamta, Houn and Xai districts. To date a total LAK 2,450,154,000 of DDF-BBG special cycle FY2015-16 had been transferred to 6 district accounts.
- The ODS evaluation was conducted in-country between April and May. The debriefing workshop was conducted in mid of May, which enabled local stakeholders/ODS centers to provide very constructive comments to the result of the assessment. The final report of ODS assessment was shared with DPAD, DoLA and DoPC of MoHA in June.
- A technical seminar on ODS modality was conducted in early June with provincial department of Home Affairs and ODS Centers from some provinces. The meeting provided participants with some knowledge, tools and recommendations from current ODS Assessment to be used in their ODS Centers. A one year action plan for improving and strengthening ODS matters of provinces and centers was drafted and shared.
- Field monitoring of CADEM sub projects were conducted in Xaysomboun Province. The sub project (implemented by Provincial Home Affairs Department) could conduct their activities as planned and now the project is nearly completed. The main activities of the sub project are to assess the progress of implementing Samsang policy and to refresh regulations related to Samsang in line with provincial departments and district offices.
- Overall 3 of 22 CADEM sub projects granted in 2016 already completed and closed. One project (Saravan PoHA) has slow progress and needs ongoing support and follow up. Update progress of each sub project please refer to annex 2.

## **Formal Collaboration with other projects**

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MONRE), with the support of the GEF LDCF2 project, is collaborating with UNDP/UNCDF in a project entitled "Effective Governance for small-scale rural infrastructure and disaster preparedness in a changing climate". The overall objective of the project is to improve local administrative systems affecting the provision and maintenance of small scale rural infrastructure, through participatory decision making that reflects the genuine needs of communities and natural systems vulnerable to climate risk. As part of its implementation arrangements, the project is using the existing District Development Fund (DDF) operating under SCSD project to deliver local climate change adaptation infrastructures in Saravane and Sekong provinces. The DDF system has transferred the first round of CR grants (\$152,052) for 4 district projects for FY 2014/15, which LDCF2 and MONRE have identified together with local District Development Support Teams. In addition, the DAIPs of 12 projects in 11 districts of both Saravane and Sekong provinces for the investment projects for FY 2015-16 have been approved and total amount of total CR grant of \$982,805 has been transferred to the project bank account in the Bank of Lao PDR and in the process of further transfer to the 11 districts for the implementation of the 12 projects.
