Project Performance and Results

Overview

Strengthening Capacity and Service Delivery of Local Administrations (GPAR SCSD) project was officially launched on 03 February 2012. This project is being implemented in alignment with other projects of the National GPAR Programme. The overall objective of this project is increased capacity in the local administration, leading to better delivery of services which improve the lives of the poor, especially in rural areas of Lao PDR. The strategy is to build around a series of interrelated outputs that take forward proven results and innovations to realise the overall outcome. These include the introduction of district level performance assessments and performance based Block Grants (capital and recurrent) that will provide incentives for improved overall performance linked to the local administration mandate, the project seeks to improve local MDG-targeted service delivery through increased capacity and long term reform.

The seven outputs of the project are:

1. Policies and regulatory frameworks for effective local administration at province and district level.
2. Improved capacities of local administrations to fulfill its service delivery mandates.
3. Improved MDG focused service delivery provided through formula based and equity focused block grants to the districts.
4. Improve Access to Citizens Service through One Door Service
5. GPAR Capacity Development and Modernisation Fund (CADEM) to support strategic innovations in Public Administration reforms
6. Citizens' Feedback and district mechanisms for responsive and accountable service delivery
7. Project administration and support.

Overview of activities during period

The main activities carried out by the project during the Quarter are listed below:

1. Policies and regulatory frameworks for effective administrations:

- Support was given to Ministry of Home Affairs to help clarify the emerging new policy and regulatory frameworks (notably Politburo Resolution No.3/2012 and & Prime Minister Order 16/2012) on increased delegated authority for all 17 Provincial Administrations and 51 participating District Administrations, including 105 selected Villages.
- Implementation of the dissemination strategy for the “3 Builds” Pilot, relevant materials and documentation, and related capacity development programme was also assisted by the project. This was mainly in the form of financial support to in-field operations, which comprised 6 specialist support teams under the guidance of MoHA. Participants numbered 2,140 people, drawn from the leadership of Provinces and

Districts and senior sector management, divisions and offices. (This Activity was also supported in part by with Output 2 and Output 7)

2 Improved capacities of local administrations:

- Launch of MAF-OEBG¹ initiative in Xiengkhouang province and related training/planning workshops conducted for all 8 Districts of the Province. Purpose was to inform about the Millennium Acceleration Framework (MAF) sub-project, which will be implemented during 2012 under SCSD, and to prepare eligible MDG focused targets for each District. (MAF-OEBG block grants were released later in the Quarter under Output 3)
- Building on earlier design mission in Quarter 2, the new DDF Performance based Grant System (PBGs) was launched in Saravan province during August. The PBGS for Saravan includes both capital grant (the basic Block Grant or BBG) and the Operational Expenditure Block Grants and thus, extensive capacity development support and planning workshops were supported by the project for all 8 districts in Saravan.

3 Improved MDG focused service delivery by districts

- Release of MAF-OEBG small block grants of \$6,000 per District applicable for Health, Education, Agriculture and Public Works - but with a strong emphasis on activities that link to helping to address the MDG bottlenecks in each District. In line with OEBG terms, only non-capital and non-salary services may be supported by MAF-OEBG grants.
- Procurement in process for equipment to support DDF at national and sub-national levels.

4 Improve Access to Citizens Service

- Procurement in process for initial equipment & office furniture.

5 GPAR Capacity Development and Modernisation Fund (CADEM)

- Following internal preparatory meetings and finalization of design within Ministry of Home Affairs, - with the representative from Ministry of Planning and Investment, Ministry of Finance, UNCDF, UNDP, - capacity development was given by external facilitators to the newly appointed CADEM Technical Working Group, which comprises representatives from MOF, MPI, UNDP, UNCDF and SDC. The formal request for Expressions Of Interest (EOI) was issued in July. A total of 284 EOIs were received and subsequent to the first round of shorting listing, 14 EOIs were identified and underwent capacity development training on CADEM and proposal development and presentation; 10 of these EOIs are from local administration). A final selection process will be completed early in Quarter 4.

6 Citizens' Feedback and district mechanisms for responsive and accountable service delivery

- No budget-impacting activity was planned for Q3Q3.

7 Project Output Support

- The Inception Workshop for the new national Governance and Public Administration Reform Programme (NGPAR) was held on 7th August, under the Chair of the Minister for Home Affairs and senior representatives of concerned Ministries and Development Partners. The Inception Workshop was followed by two Signing Ceremonies; (i0 the new DDF MOU was signed by Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Planning and investment, the current 6 participating Provinces and UNCDF; and (ii) MoHA and UNICEF signed a Work plan and Budget, which will offer local administration services delivery support to Sing District in Luang Namtha, in parallel to the OEBG introduced there under SCSD project.

Workshops and meetings

- “3 Builds” Pilot Workshops

Six specialist support teams under the guidance of MoHA conducted nation-wide workshops on dissemination for the “3 Builds” Pilot, relevant materials and documentation, and related capacity development. Participants numbered 2,140 people, drawn from the leadership of Provinces and Districts and senior sector management, divisions and offices. (This Activity was also supported in part by with Output 2 and Output 7)

- MAF-OEBG Workshops (Xiengkhouang)

Workshop was held at Xiengkhouang province, under Chair of the Deputy Governor and with 23 participants (5 women) from province, district, MOHA and SCSD, to sign the MAF-OEBG/Province MOU for the MAF-OEBG initiative. District level workshops for training/planning workshops conducted for all 8 Districts of the Province, involving some 72 participants (10 women).

- DDF Workshops (Saravan)

DDF Performance based Grant System (PBGs) was launched in Saravan province during August, under the Chair of the Deputy Governor, with 31 participants (4 women). This was followed by capacity development and planning workshops for all 8 districts in Saravan, with 113 participants (8 women).

- CADEM Workshop

A CADEM capacity development workshop was held in Vientiane Province, for new establish Technical Working Group, with 30 participants. Moreover, 14 EOIs that were selected for short-list. Ten of these EOIs are from local administration was trained on

proposal writing and budgeting, a total of 3530 participants benefited from the workshop.

- NGPAR Inception Workshop

Inception Workshop for the new national Governance and Public Administration Reform Programme (NGPAR) was held on 7th August, under the Chair of the Minister for Home Affairs. Among the 50 participants were representatives from government agencies, including Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Planning and investment, UNDP, UNCDF, UNICEF and development partners participated.

Project Management

- Recruitment of staff:

Recruitment to most key positions has been completed. Recruitment of GPAR UNDP Chief Technical Advisor has progressed, with interviews held in the first week of July. The selected person is scheduled to join the SCSD project in early November 2012, once UNDP recruitment and induction processes and procedures are completed.
