The EU accession path of Bosnia and Herzegovina calls for alignment with the Acquis and strategic plans and directives of the EU in the area of gender equality. This project is fully aligned with the [EU Strategic Framework on Human Rights and Democracy](#)¹ which clearly sets the rights and empowerment of women as one of the top two priorities of the strategy. Furthermore, the project intervention is fully in line with the Council of Europe Gender Equality Strategy 2014 – 2017² strategic goal 4 in particular, which calls for: “achieving balanced participation of women and men in political and public decision – making”, clarifying that pluralist democracy requires balanced participation of women and men in political and public decision-making.

Briefly describe in the space below how the Project is likely to improve gender equality and women's empowerment

The main objective of the project is to strengthen women's leadership and participation in political life. Guided by the strict observance of the highest standards of political neutrality, the project will apply the UNs Gender Equality in Elected Office approach to help secure an enabling environment for getting more women elected across board, in all spheres of decision-making in Bosnia and Herzegovina. It will look into enhancing the women's engagement in public life and their position in the decision-making and ensure they are given a realistic and equal chance as their men counterparts in the forthcoming general elections (2018), and in the longer term, the next local elections in 2020 by advocacy for women's equal rights and political participation.
