#### **Brief Description**

2021 will be the third year of implementation for the SCRALA project and as such this year has one of the largest annual budgets out of the 7 years of the project. In line with this, during 2021 the focus will shift from project establishment, to full-scale implementation of core activities as follows:

- Completion of 2020 activities that partially or not undertaken due to the COVID 19 challenges that limited travels and group meetings
- Operationalising the recently procured Automatic Weather Stations (AWPs) and associated weather and water data collection infrastructure at the block level.
- Building on achievements in 2020, carry out irrigation and infrastructure projects, continue the distribution of
  resilient seed and planting materials along with ongoing training to farmers in conservation agriculture,
  investing in alternative livelihood interventions and associated training, as well as going into phase 2 of the
  Farmer Field School programme.
- Initiate activities post-harvest processing and value addition increase the scope and reach of improved storage solutions, access to small scale finances and developing market linkages.
- Continue to invest in capacity development for technical staff under all outputs at the central as well as district/camp levels.
