Project Title: Inclusive Governance for Service Delivery and Social Accountability (IG)

UNDAF Outcome (s): Outcome 3: By 2018, national and sub-national institutions are more transparent and accountable for key public-sector reforms and rule of law; are more responsive to the inequalities in the enjoyment of human rights of all people living in Cambodia; and increase civic participation in democratic decision-making.

Expected SP Outcome(s): Outcome2: Accelerate structural transformations for sustainable development

Narrative

Solid waste management has been consistently identified as one of the main service delivery challenges across government levels in Cambodia. In 2015, the solid waste management service delivery function was transferred from the Ministry of Environment to the District and Municipality level. While this is a positive step, the implementation of the policy has been partial and uneven. The roles and responsibilities of District and Municipality administrations versus other stakeholders still need clarification, enforcement of specific rules (such as fines) is still pending, the issue of funding transfer and budget management at the sub-national level is recurring, and it remains unclear how local citizens should be engaged in urban-focused services.

The Inclusive Governance for Service Delivery and Social Accountability project seeks to address these challenges through building the capacity of local administrations and enhancing citizen engagement in local service delivery. Through focusing on solid waste management, this project will implement local service delivery models that reflect local needs and initiatives, key national policies and regulations, and can be scaled up and used as evidence for further policy discussion.

The project focus on the following three results:

1. Enhance the local service delivery capacity of District/Municipality and Commune/Sangkat administrations, with a focus on solid waste management,
2. Increase citizen engagement and accountability to ensure local citizens, including vulnerable groups, are better informed and engaged in the planning and execution of service delivery and better able to advocate for more accountability from responsible agencies and concerned private sector parties, and
3. Support advocacy and communication to ensure relevant national level agencies are engaged, informed and gradually own the initiative and that evidence produced will be used for future upscaling and discussion at policy level.
