I. PURPOSE

Project goal:

The overall goal of the project is to strengthen the functional capacity of Disaster Risk Reduction National Platform in Armenia to ensure its sustainability, relevance and key role in maintenance of culture of resilience in the country.

Project objective is to upgrade the human, technical, and financial capacities of the DRRNP, as well as to promote innovative approaches and best global practices in DRM.

Component 1: High standard electronic tool for Monitoring and evaluation of DRM National Strategy and Sendai Framework for DRR implementation, interlinked with SDGs created.

Component 2: Technical and professional capacities of the DRR National platform are enhanced for effective utilization of innovative technologies, including drones, in risk profiling, monitoring and other emergency response related activities.

Component 3: Project management capacities and functional sustainability of DRRNP is enhanced by the introduction of small-scale project modality for development and implementation of small projects in first aid, emergency physiological support, GIS related education, urban resilience and other activities, supporting the DRM National Strategy.

Output 1: *High standard electronic tool for Monitoring and evaluation of DRM National Strategy and Sendai Framework for DRR implementation, interlinked with SDGs created*

- In 2019 series of trainings conducted for key DRM stakeholders on *utilization of Information Management Electronic System for Monitoring of DRM National Strategy* in all regions of Armenia and Yerevan.
- CASC Regional Platform was organized in Armenia in partnership with UNISDR, UNDP, MES and other partners during which the Yerevan Declaration was adopted as a recommendation strategy for further improvement of DRR efforts in the CASC region countries. The declaration was presented during the European Platform on DRR held in Rome in 2018 and during the Global Platform held in Geneva in 2019.
- The electronic toolkit for DRM Strategy implementation was developed, and 32 different experts were participating in DRRNP Thematic working group (TWG) from 10 different organizations. DRM strategy implementation indicators were formulated within the TWG and integrated in DRM Strategy M&E electronic toolkit, which was tested during the trainings organized for 108 individuals from 54 state and private entities. Further, 2 trainings of trainers ToT were organized for 47 individuals for 17 state and private entities.
- 18 representatives from educational institutions (CMSA, schools and universalities) and private sector (Armenia Wine, Contour Global Hydro Cascade CJSC, World Vision Armenia, "Master Pharm" Health center) and NAS Chemical laboratory SNPO received series of trainings and obtained knowledge on "Basics of First Aid" and "Training of Trainers on First Aid" delivered by DRR National Platform First Aid Specialists.

Output 2: Technical and professional capacities of the DRR National platform are enhanced for effective utilization of innovative technologies, including drones, in risk profiling, monitoring and other emergency response related activities.

 Technical and human capacities of DRR National Platform (DRRNP) were enhanced through establishment of community youth innovative centers in Stepanavan, Lori Region, Kapan, Syunik Region and Vayk community, Vayots Dzor Region (established in partnership with Vayk Administration office) aimed at educational purposes, as well as for risk profiling of community, humanitarian response and monitoring. A Cooperation Memorandum is signed between DRR stakeholder to ensure sustainability of the centers.

Output 3: Project management capacities and functional sustainability of DRRNP is enhanced by the introduction of small-scale project modality for development and implementation of small projects in first aid, emergency physiological support, GIS related education, urban resilience and other activities, supporting the DRM National Strategy.

- Guidelines on "Basics of First Aid" and "First psychological Aid in Emergency Situations" developed by task force designed and printed for wide layers of society. Training on First Aid Educational Package conducted and tested, the standards and training materials are developed.

- A handbook on "Psycho-social support during the emergencies "for the first responders developed and training was delivered to the representatives of regional rescue services, CMSA and Center for psychological service of MES.
- UNDP supported the development of ALTER project implemented jointly by DRRNP, American University of Armenia, National Academies of Greece and Cyprus with the 150.000\$ total budget received by DRRNP.

Innovative and transformative aspects: In order to develop the technical capacities of DRRNP for DRM, the project has supported the integration of innovative technologies into risk identification and management services that DRRNP provides to interested stakeholders, with that making the innovations an integral component for disaster risk profiling. This support was provided through mini-projects suggested and carried out by DRRNP and its partners. In particular, Mini-labs were acquired and provided to the Youth Innovative Centers established in Stepanavan, Vayk and Kapan cities, software for GIS based risk profiling was acquired and applied.

IV. GENDER MAINSTREAMING, CROSSCUTTING RESULTS, TARGETING

- The project corresponds to UNDP Gender Marker GEN-2 score, in line with the respective output(s) of the 2016-2020 Country Programme Document signed with the Government of Armenia.

- During the project implementation period equal access of young men and women to formal disaster management mechanisms or to any kind of information and resources related to disaster preparedness and prevention was ensured through the appropriate approaches adopted for the implementation of all project interventions.

V. PRODOC CHANGES, HORIZON SCANNING

Project received No Cost Extension from the donor for 3 months until 31 May 2019, to ensure that all due trainings for targeted state agencies conducted, the draft legislation on drones finalized and sent to the Ministry of Emergency Situations and other stakeholders.

VI. PARTNERSHIPS, COMMUNICATION, KNOWLEDGE MATERIALS

- In June 2019 the DRR Programme Manager participated the in the workshop on "*Capacity Building on Sendai Monitoring*" organized jointly with Regional HUB and UNDP CO in Uzbekistan for the representatives of the Ministry of Emergency Situations of Uzbekistan and UNCT, aimed at facilitated and share experience on implementation of Sendai Framework, its targets and indicators.

- In May 2019 the DRR Programme Manager participated in the sixth session of the Global Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction (GP2019) in Geneva. As a result, the PDNA and DRF Adaptation to national context concept was developed and approved and funded by IHR for implementation.
- Memorandum of Cooperation was signed between DRR stakeholders and IT companies to ensure sustainability of the Innovation center established within the framework DGECHO project;
- Memorandum of Cooperation was sign between DRR National Platform and Crisis Management State Academy on mainstreaming innovative tools into DRR.

Knowledge materials: Guidelines on "Basics of First Aid" and "First psychological Aid in Emergency Situations" designed and printed for wide layers of society.

XI. VALIDATION OF RESULTS (FIELD VISITS) AND QUALITY ASSURANCE

The following are some major lessons that may be drawn from the experience of this project:

Lesson 1: To ensure the proper functionality and sustainable utilization of DRM National Strategy and Sendai reporting process there is a need to establish a well manageable mechanism in partnership with DRR NP and MES under the direct supervision of Sendai Focal Point.

Lesson 2: There was a big interest from private sector for cooperation with DRRNP regarding capacity building in First aid, Psycho-social support, GIS mapping etc., in this regard, during the project implementation, a series of agreements were signed for further partnership, which will definitely enhance DRRNP functional sustainability.

Lesson 3: The National Assembly was very much interested in cooperation with the DRRNP, especially, in mainstreaming DRR in legislation, taking into account that following the Constitutional reforms in Armenia, many DRM related laws need to be updated. In this regard, the draft on civil protection and DRR was the first step in this direction.

Project Closure Quality Assurance (QA) report was prepared and approved in the system with the overall **"Satisfactory"** result. The QA report was presented to the final Project Board meeting along with the Final Standard Progress Report (SPR).
